## House Study Bill 612 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the state public defender pilot project and
- 2 legal representation in child welfare cases.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 13B.13 State public defender pilot 2 project — child welfare legal representation.
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- 3 Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the
- 4 contrary, for each fiscal year for the period beginning July
- 5 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2024, the state public defender
- 6 may establish a pilot project to implement innovative models
- 7 of legal representation in order to assist families involved
- 8 in the child welfare system. The state public defender shall
- 9 have sole discretion to establish and implement the pilot
- 10 project. The state public defender may implement the new
- 11 pilot project in up to six counties throughout the state.
- 12 The purpose of the pilot project is to implement and study
- 13 innovative ways, through a team approach or through other
- 14 methods, to achieve positive outcomes for families, reduce
- 15 trauma to young children, and deliver financial benefits to
- 16 families and their communities. The state public defender
- 17 may coordinate with other agencies and organizations to
- 18 implement the pilot project, seek grant funding, and measure
- 19 the results. The state public defender may appoint an attorney
- 20 to represent an indigent person prior to initiation of formal
- 21 proceedings, without court order, if such representation is
- 22 deemed appropriate by the state public defender and relates to
- 23 the purposes of the pilot project.
- Sec. 2. Section 815.11, Code 2020, is amended to read as 25 follows:
- 26 815.11 Appropriations for indigent defense fund created.
- 27 Costs incurred for legal representation by a court-appointed
- 28 attorney under chapter 229A, 665, 822, or 908, or section
- 29 232.141, subsection 3, paragraph "d", or section 598.23A,
- 30 600A.6B, 814.9, 814.10, 814.11, 815.4, 815.7, or 815.10 on
- 31 behalf of an indigent shall be paid from moneys appropriated by
- 32 the general assembly to the office of the state public defender
- 33 in the department of inspections and appeals and deposited in
- 34 an account to be known as the indigent defense fund. Costs
- 35 incurred representing an indigent defendant in a contempt

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1 action, or representing an indigent juvenile in a juvenile
2 court proceeding, or representing a person pursuant to section
3 13B.13 are also payable from the fund. However, costs incurred
4 in any administrative proceeding or in any other proceeding
5 under this chapter or chapter 598, 600, 600A, 633, 633A, 814,
6 or 915 or other provisions of the Code or administrative rules
7 are not payable from the fund.

8 EXPLANATION

9 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

This bill permits the state public defender to establish a 11 12 pilot project beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2024, 13 to implement innovative models of parental and child legal 14 representation in order to assist families involved in the 15 child welfare system. The bill specifies that the state public 16 defender shall have sole discretion to establish the pilot 17 project in no more than six counties throughout the state. 18 bill allows the state public defender to coordinate with other 19 agencies and organizations in order to implement the pilot 20 project, seek grant funding, and measure the results. The bill 21 also allows the state public defender to appoint an attorney 22 to represent an indigent person prior to initiation of formal 23 proceedings, without court order, if such representation is 24 deemed appropriate by the state public defender and relates to 25 the purposes of the pilot project. The bill allows attorneys 26 appointed through the pilot project to be paid from the 27 indigent defense fund.
