- 1 Section 1. Section 249A.3, subsection 9, Code 2019, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 9. Beginning October 1, 1990, in <u>In</u> determining the
- 4 eligibility of an institutionalized individual for assistance
- 5 under this chapter, the department shall establish a minimum
- 6 community spouse resource allowance in an amount which is the
- 7 greater of twenty-four thousand dollars to be retained for the
- 8 benefit of the institutionalized individual's community spouse
- 9 in accordance with or the minimum required as a condition of
- 10 receipt of federal funding pursuant to section 1924(f)(2)(A)(i)
- 11 of the federal Social Security Act, as codified in 42 U.S.C.
- 12 §1396r-5(f)(2)(A)(i), and as adjusted pursuant to section
- 13 1924(f) 1924(g) of the federal Social Security Act as codified
- 14 in 42 U.S.C. \$1396r-5(f) \$1396r-5(g).
- 15 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 18 This bill amends the amount allowed to be retained for
- 19 the benefit of the community spouse of an institutionalized
- 20 individual to comply with federal law. The bill provides
- 21 that the amount is the greater of the current \$24,000 amount
- 22 stated in state law or the minimum required under federal
- 23 law as a condition of receipt of federal funding under the
- 24 Medicaid program. The minimum allowances under the minimum
- 25 spousal impoverishment standards released by the centers for
- 26 Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States department
- 27 of health and human services (CMS) effective on January 1 of
- 28 the respective year are \$24,180 for 2017, \$24,720 for 2018, and
- 29 \$25,284 for 2019.
