A BILL FOR

1	An	Act relating to special certificates issued to aircraft
2		manufacturers, transporters, and dealers, providing fees,
3		making penalties applicable, and including effective date
4		and applicability provisions.
5	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 328.28, subsection 1, Code 2019, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. A manufacturer or dealer owning an aircraft otherwise 4 required to be registered under this chapter may operate the 5 aircraft for up to three years for purposes of transporting, 6 testing, demonstrating, or selling the aircraft without 7 registering the aircraft, upon condition that a special 8 certificate be obtained by the owner for each year the owner 9 operates the aircraft as provided in this section and sections 10 328.29 through 328.33.

11 Sec. 2. Section 328.29, Code 2019, is amended to read as
12 follows:

13 328.29 Application for special certificate — fee.

A manufacturer, transporter, or dealer may, upon payment of a one four hundred dollar fee, make application to the department upon such forms as the department may prescribe for a special certificate. The applicant shall also submit such reasonable proof of the applicant's status as a bona fide manufacturer, transporter, or dealer as the department may require. Dealers in new aircraft shall furnish satisfactory evidence of a valid franchise with the manufacturer or distributor of such aircraft authorizing such dealership. Sec. 3. Section 328.32, Code 2019, is amended to read as

24 follows:

25 328.32 Expiration of special certificate.

A special certificate expires at midnight on June 30 October 27 <u>31</u>, and a new special certificate for the ensuing year may be 28 obtained by the person to whom the expired special certificate 29 was issued, upon application to the department and payment of 30 the fee provided in section 328.29.

31 Sec. 4. Section 328.34, Code 2019, is amended by adding the 32 following new subsection:

33 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 7. That the person making application for, 34 or holding, a special certificate operated an aircraft for 35 purposes of transporting, testing, demonstrating, or selling

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1 the aircraft, without registering the aircraft, after three 2 years of holding a special certificate for the aircraft in 3 violation of section 328.28.

4 Sec. 5. Section 328.36, subsection 1, Code 2019, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 1. All moneys received by the department pursuant to section
7 sections 328.21 and 328.29 shall be deposited into the state
8 aviation fund created in section 328.56.

9 Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect June 30, 10 2019.

11 Sec. 7. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to special 12 certificates issued by the department of transportation 13 that are valid for a period beginning after midnight on June 14 30, 2019. Special certificates issued by the department of 15 transportation that are valid for a period beginning after 16 midnight on June 30, 2019, but beginning before midnight on 17 October 31, 2019, shall expire at midnight on October 31, 18 2020, and the validity period for such special certificates 19 shall count as only one year for purposes of section 328.28, 20 subsection 1, as amended in this Act, and section 328.34, 21 subsection 7, as enacted in this Act.

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EXPLANATION

23The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with24the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

Under current law, an aircraft manufacturer or dealer may operate an aircraft for purposes of transporting, testing, demonstrating, or selling the aircraft without registering the aircraft by obtaining a special certificate from the department of transportation (DOT). This bill limits the period a manufacturer or dealer may operate the aircraft under a special certificate to three years. The bill increases the annual fee for a special certificate from \$100 to \$400, and provides that a special certificate expires at midnight on October 31 trather than midnight on June 30. The bill provides that the DOT may refuse to issue, or may revoke or suspend, a special

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1 certificate if the person making application for, or holding, 2 the special certificate operated such an aircraft after three 3 years of holding a special certificate for the aircraft in 4 violation of the bill.

5 Under current law, aircraft registration fees collected 6 under Code section 328.21 are required to be deposited in the 7 state aviation fund. The bill specifies that fees received by 8 the DOT for the issuance of special certificates must also be 9 deposited in the state aviation fund, in accordance with the 10 current practice.

11 The bill takes effect June 30, 2019, and applies to special 12 certificates issued by the DOT that are valid for a period 13 beginning after midnight on June 30, 2019. The bill provides 14 that special certificates issued by the DOT that are valid 15 for a period beginning after midnight on June 30, 2019, but 16 beginning before midnight on October 31, 2019, shall expire at 17 midnight on October 31, 2020, and the validity period for such 18 special certificates shall count as only one year for purposes 19 of the bill.

20 Under current law, Code section 328.40 provides that any 21 person who violates any of the provisions of Code chapter 22 328 shall be guilty of a fraudulent practice. A fraudulent 23 practice is punishable by criminal penalties under Code 24 sections 714.9 through 714.13.

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
