1 2. CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated 2 from the appropriate state fund or account to the entities 3 identified pursuant to subsection 1, for the period beginning 4 July 1, 2020, and ending August 31, 2020, amounts, or so 5 much thereof as is necessary, equal to two-twelfths of the 6 amounts of all line item appropriations, standing limited 7 appropriations, and standing unlimited appropriations otherwise 8 limited by law, including federal and nonstate funds, made for 9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 10 2020, as determined pursuant to subsection 1.

Upon the governor's approval of any enrolled bill, as passed by both the senate and the house of representatives during the 2020 regular session of the eighty-eighth general assembly, containing the same line item or limited standing appropriation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021, as made in the two-twelfths appropriation under subsection 2, the two-twelfths appropriation amount shall be considered an allotment of the line item appropriation or limited standing appropriation for the full fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.

Sec. 13. INSTRUCTIONAL TIME WAIVERS FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS
AND ACCREDITED NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS — COVID-19.

29 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 30 contrary, if a school district or accredited nonpublic school 31 is closed or closes on or before April 12, 2020, in order to 32 prevent or contain the spread of COVID-19, the instructional 33 time requirements of section 279.10, subsection 1, and the 34 minimum school day requirements of section 256.7, subsection 35 19, are waived for the affected school district or accredited

1 nonpublic school for such a closure.

2. The governor, by appropriate executive order, may
 3 waive the instructional time requirements of section 279.10,
 4 subsection 1, and the minimum school day requirements of
 5 section 256.7, subsection 19, for a school district or
 6 accredited nonpublic school that is closed or closes after
 7 April 12, 2020, in order to prevent or contain the spread of
 8 COVID-19.

9 3. This section is repealed July 1, 2020.

10 Sec. 14. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act, being 11 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. 12 EXPLANATION

13The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with14the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

15 This bill relates to state and local finances by making 16 and supplementing appropriations, providing for legal and 17 regulatory responsibilities, and providing for other properly 18 related matters.

19 DIVISION I — SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS. The bill 20 appropriates moneys from the general fund for FY 2019-2020 21 to the department of human services for medical assistance 22 program reimbursement and associated costs, the children's 23 health insurance program, and the state resource center at 24 Glenwood, and to the state board of regents for the state 25 hygienic laboratory. This division of the bill takes effect 26 upon enactment.

27 DIVISION II — STANDING APPROPRIATIONS AND RELATED MATTERS. 28 The bill limits standing appropriations for FY 2020-2021 for 29 payment of claims for nonpublic school pupil transportation, 30 instructional support state aid, and state aid for area 31 education agencies.

32 DIVISION III — CONTINUING APPROPRIATIONS. The bill 33 requires the department of management, in consultation with 34 the legislative services agency, to determine the amount of 35 line item appropriations, standing limited appropriations,

1 and standing unlimited appropriations otherwise limited by 2 law, including appropriations from federal and nonstate funds, 3 made for FY 2019-2020, and identify the entities to which such The bill appropriates two-twelfths 4 appropriations were made. 5 of the determined amounts to the identified entities for the 6 period beginning July 1, 2020, and ending August 31, 2020. 7 This division of the bill does not apply to certain capital 8 appropriations and one-time appropriations as set forth in the 9 bill. This division of the bill takes effect upon enactment. DIVISION IV - INTERDEPARTMENTAL AND INTRADEPARTMENTAL 10 11 TRANSFERS. The bill provides that certain limitations on 12 amounts, and certain notice and comment requirements, for 13 intradepartmental and interdepartmental transfers made by the 14 director of the department of management pursuant to Code 15 section 8.39 do not apply to transfers made for FY 2019-2020 16 and from July 1, 2020, to August 31, 2020. This division of the 17 bill takes effect upon enactment.

18 DIVISION V — IOWA ECONOMIC EMERGENCY FUND. The bill 19 appropriates from the Iowa economic emergency fund to the 20 department of management for the period beginning on the 21 effective date of this division of the bill, and ending August 22 31, 2020, an amount not to exceed 10 percent of the balance of 23 the Iowa economic emergency fund at the close of the fiscal 24 year beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2020, or so 25 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for purposes approved 26 by the governor.

In the event the amount appropriated is insufficient, In the event the amount appropriated is insufficient, the bill appropriates from the Iowa economic emergency fund to the department of management for the period beginning on the effective date of this division of the bill, and ending August 31, 2020, an amount not to exceed the maximum balance of the Iowa economic emergency fund, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for purposes approved by the governor and the legislative council.

5 DIVISION VI — INSTRUCTIONAL TIME WAIVERS FOR SCHOOLS. The 6 bill waives the instructional time requirements for school 7 districts and accredited nonpublic schools that are closed 8 or close on or before April 12, 2020, in order to prevent 9 or contain the spread of COVID-19. The bill authorizes the 10 governor to waive such requirements for school districts or 11 accredited nonpublic schools that are closed or close after 12 April 12, 2020, for such purposes. This provision is repealed 13 July 1, 2020. This division of the bill takes effect upon 14 enactment.
