A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act requesting the establishment of a special education
- 2 interim study committee.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. INTERIM STUDY COMMITTEE SPECIAL EDUCATION.
- 2 l. The legislative council is requested to establish an
- 3 interim study committee to study and make recommendations
- 4 relating to special education program requirements and outcomes
- 5 for students with individualized education programs.
- 6 2. The study committee shall review state and federal
- 7 laws relating to students with individualized education
- 8 programs (IEPs); shall determine the ways in which inclusion
- 9 requirements and least restrictive environment placements
- 10 affect the classroom, including but not limited to the teaching
- 11 staff, teacher retention, teacher professional development,
- 12 and student and peer outcomes when children requiring special
- 13 education are placed in a general education classroom; shall
- 14 review evidence-based practices and strategies by which schools
- 15 and teachers can best accommodate students with IEPs who have
- 16 severe emotional, social, and behavioral problems; shall
- 17 develop or identify strategies designed to improve outcomes
- 18 for children requiring special education; and shall develop
- 19 or identify a graduated process for the transfer of a child
- 20 requiring special education from a self-contained classroom to
- 21 a general education classroom.
- 22 3. The study committee shall receive input from, at a
- 23 minimum, the department of education, the area education
- 24 agencies, school administrators, special education teachers,
- 25 general education teachers, mental health professionals with
- 26 experience in children's mental health, parents of children
- 27 requiring special education and parents of children who do not
- 28 require special education, and boards of directors of school
- 29 districts.
- 30 4. The study committee shall submit a report with its
- 31 findings and recommendations to the general assembly and to
- 32 each member of Iowa's congressional delegation on or before
- 33 December 18, 2020.
- 34 EXPLANATION
- 35 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with

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- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 1 2 This bill requests the legislative council to establish 3 an interim study committee to study and make recommendations 4 relating to special education program requirements and outcomes 5 for students with individualized education programs (IEPs). 6 The study committee shall review state and federal laws; 7 shall determine the ways in which inclusion requirements and 8 placements affect classrooms, teachers, and student and peer 9 outcomes when children requiring special education are placed 10 in a general education classroom; shall review evidence-based 11 practices and strategies by which schools and teachers can 12 best accommodate students with IEPs who have severe emotional, 13 social, and behavioral problems; shall develop or identify 14 strategies designed to improve outcomes for children requiring 15 special education; and shall develop or identify a graduated 16 process for the transfer of a child requiring special education 17 from a self-contained classroom to a general education 18 classroom. 19 The study committee shall receive input from, at a minimum, 20 the department of education, the area education agencies, 21 and the boards of directors of school districts; school 22 administrators; special education teachers; general education 23 teachers; parents of children requiring special education and 24 parents whose children do not require special education; and
- The study committee shall submit a report with its findings and recommendations to the general assembly and to each member of Iowa's congressional delegation on or before December 18, 30 2020.
