2 2022, is amended to read as follows:

3 b. Procedures provided for approval of programs shall
4 include procedures for enforcement of the prescribed standards
5 and, except as provided in section 256.16, subsection 3, shall
6 not include a procedure for the waiving of any of the standards
7 prescribed.

8 Sec. 2. Section 256.16, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 9 2022, is amended by striking the paragraph.

10 Sec. 3. Section 256.16, subsection 2, Code 2022, is amended 11 to read as follows:

12 2. A person initially applying for a license shall 13 successfully complete a practitioner preparation program 14 approved under section 256.7, subsection 3, and containing the 15 subject matter specified in this section, before the initial 16 action by the board of educational examiners under chapter 17 272 takes place. However, this subsection shall not apply to 18 a person who meets the requirements for an initial one-year 19 license in accordance with subsection 3.

20 Sec. 4. Section 256.16, subsection 3, Code 2022, is amended 21 by striking the subsection.

Sec. 5. Section 272.2, subsection 14, paragraph b, subparagraph (5), Code 2022, is amended to read as follows: (5) The applicant fails to meet board standards for application for an initial or renewed license. However, this subparagraph shall not apply to a person who applies for an initial one-year license and submits to the board a waiver issued by the director of the department of education in accordance with section 256.16, subsection 3.

30 Sec. 6. Section 272.2, subsection 22, Code 2022, is amended 31 by striking the subsection.

32 Sec. 7. HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS — NOTICE TO FORMER 33 STUDENTS. All higher education institutions providing 34 practitioner preparation shall notify students who failed 35 to achieve the minimum passing scores set by the department

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1 of education on the assessments administered under section 2 256.16, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), Code 3 2022, before the effective date of this Act, of the changes 4 related to the completion of a practitioner preparation program 5 provided by this Act, including the student's ability to 6 apply for an initial license from the board of educational 7 examiners if the student completed all other requirements of a 8 practitioner preparation program approved under section 256.7, 9 subsection 3.

10 Sec. 8. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to students who 11 attended or are attending practitioner preparation programs 12 before, on, or after the effective date of this Act. 13 EXPLANATION

14The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with15the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

16 This bill relates to the assessments administered to 17 practitioner preparation program admission candidates and to 18 practitioner preparation program students prior to students' 19 completion of a practitioner preparation program.

Current law provides that the state board of education 20 21 shall adopt rules requiring all higher education institutions 22 providing practitioner preparation to, prior to a student's 23 completion of the practitioner preparation program, administer 24 either subject assessments designed by a nationally recognized 25 testing service or a valid and reliable subject-area-specific, 26 performance-based assessment centered on student learning. 27 Current law also provides that an institution may administer a 28 preprofessional skills test offered by a nationally recognized 29 testing service to candidates for admission to the practitioner 30 preparation program. An institution that does so must report 31 to the department of education the percentage of students 32 whose scores on the assessments were above, at, and below the 33 minimum passing score set by the institution, and shall report 34 any services or opportunities to retake the assessment that 35 the institution may make available to a student who fails

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LSB 5121HV (2) 89 jda/jh 1 an assessment. Additionally, current law provides that the 2 department shall compile the reports and publish the compiled 3 information on its internet site.

The bill strikes the ability of an institution to administer 4 5 a preprofessional skills test to admission candidates and the 6 corresponding reporting requirements related to that test. 7 The bill also strikes the requirement that an institution 8 administer subject assessments designed by a nationally 9 recognized testing service that measure pedagogy and knowledge 10 prior to a student's completion of the practitioner preparation 11 program or a valid and reliable subject-area-specific, 12 performance-based assessment for preservice teacher candidates. 13 The bill requires all institutions providing practitioner 14 preparation to notify students who, before the effective date 15 of the bill, failed to achieve the minimum passing scores set 16 by the department on the assessments administered prior to a 17 student's completion of the practitioner preparation program of 18 the changes the bill makes to the requirements related to the 19 completion of a practitioner preparation program. 20

The bill applies to students who attended or are attending practitioner preparation programs before, on, or after the effective date of the bill.
