A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing a voting machine task force.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. VOTING MACHINE TASK FORCE AND REPORT.
- 2 l. The secretary of state shall establish a voting machine
- 3 task force. The task force shall consist of the secretary of
- 4 state and an expert in internet technology from the office
- 5 of the secretary of state, as well as the following members
- 6 appointed by the majority and minority leaders of each house
- 7 of the general assembly:
- 8 a. An expert in internet technology from the office of the
- 9 chief information officer.
- 10 b. A county auditor from an urban county.
- 11 c. A county auditor from a moderately sized county.
- 12 d. A county auditor from a rural county.
- e. Three interested voters, one of whom shall be a
- 14 registered republican, one of whom shall be a registered
- 15 democrat, and one of whom shall not be a registered member of
- 16 either party.
- 2. The secretary of state shall provide staffing services
- 18 for the task force.
- 19 3. The task force shall do all of the following:
- 20 a. Determine what capabilities voting machines should have
- 21 in order to produce an accurate, reliable, efficient, and
- 22 accountable result, provided that such voting machines shall
- 23 not be capable of connecting to the internet and shall use
- 24 analog rather than digital processes.
- 25 b. Identify a manufacturer or vendor for voting machines
- 26 meeting the requirements of paragraph "a".
- 27 c. Estimate the costs of converting all voting systems in
- 28 Iowa to use the voting machines identified in paragraph "a".
- 29 d. Identify such steps as are necessary to convert all
- 30 voting systems in Iowa to those identified in paragraph "a".
- 31 e. Make other relevant recommendations to the general
- 32 assembly.
- 33 4. The task force shall not recommend the usage of
- 34 electronic voting systems.
- 35 5. The task force shall issue a report regarding its

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- 1 progress and findings to date to the governor and the general
- 2 assembly no later than December 1, 2022, and as directed by the
- 3 general assembly thereafter.
- 4 EXPLANATION
- 5 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 6 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 7 This bill requires the secretary of state to establish a task
- 8 force to determine what capabilities voting machines should
- 9 have in order to produce an accurate, reliable, efficient, and
- 10 accountable result, provided that such voting machines shall
- 11 not be capable of connecting to the internet and shall use
- 12 analog rather than digital processes. The task force shall
- 13 also identify a manufacturer for such machines, estimate the
- 14 costs of converting to the use of such machines, identify
- 15 such steps as are necessary to convert to the use of such
- 16 machines, and make other relevant recommendations to the
- 17 general assembly. The task force shall not recommend the use
- 18 of electronic voting systems. The bill sets requirements for
- 19 the membership of the task force. The task force shall issue
- 20 a report regarding its progress and findings to date to the
- 21 governor and the general assembly by December 1, 2022, and as
- 22 directed by the general assembly thereafter.
