A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to capitol access for lobbyists and making
- penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **68B.37 Lobbyists** restrictions 2 on capitol access.
- 3 A lobbyist, while registered or required to be registered
- 4 under section 68B.36 to engage in lobbying activities before
- 5 the general assembly, shall not be present on the floor of the
- 6 capitol on which the house of representatives and senate is
- 7 located unless the lobbyist is attending a committee meeting, a
- 8 subcommittee meeting, or is present in a lounge specifically
- 9 designated for lobbyists.
- 10 EXPLANATION
- 11 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 12 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 13 This bill prohibits a lobbyist, while registered or required
- 14 to be registered to engage in lobbying activities before the
- 15 general assembly, to be present on the floor of the capitol on
- 16 which the house of representatives and senate is located unless
- 17 the lobbyist is attending a committee meeting, a subcommittee
- 18 meeting, or is present in a lounge specifically designated for
- 19 lobbyists.
- 20 Because violations of Code chapter 68B may be the basis
- 21 of a complaint under the code of ethics of both the house of
- 22 representatives and the senate, a lobbyist who violates the
- 23 bill would also violate both codes of ethics. A lobbyist who
- 24 violates either code of ethics is subject to discipline by the
- 25 committee on ethics of the house of representatives or the
- 26 senate. The codes of ethics permit the committees on ethics to
- 27 reprimand a lobbyist or to impose another appropriate sanction,
- 28 including suspension of lobbying privileges.
- 29 Additionally, by operation of law pursuant to Code section
- 30 68B.34, a person who knowingly and intentionally violates the
- 31 bill is quilty of a serious misdemeanor and may be reprimanded,
- 32 suspended, or dismissed from the person's position or otherwise
- 33 sanctioned. A serious misdemeanor is punishable by confinement
- 34 for no more than one year and a fine of at least \$430 but not
- 35 more than \$2,560.
