HOUSE FILE 2312 BY ISENHART

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for the filling of a vacancy in the office of
- 2 commissioner of soil and water conservation districts.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 161A.5, subsection 2, Code 2022, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. a. The governing body of each district shall consist of
- 4 five commissioners elected on a nonpartisan basis for staggered
- 5 four-year terms commencing on the first day of January that is
- 6 not a Sunday or holiday following their election.
- 7 b. Any eligible elector residing in the district is
- 8 eligible to the office of commissioner, except that not more
- 9 than two commissioners shall at any one time be a resident of
- 10 any one township. A vacancy is created in the office of any
- 11 commissioner who changes residence into a township where two
- 12 commissioners then reside.
- c. If a commissioner is absent for sixty or more percent
- 14 of monthly meetings during any twelve-month period, the other
- 15 commissioners by their unanimous vote may declare the member's
- 16 office vacant. A vacancy in the office of commissioner shall
- 17 be filled by appointment of the committee until the next
- 18 succeeding general election, at which time the balance of the
- 19 unexpired term shall be filled as provided by section 69.12.
- 20 Sec. 2. Section 161A.5, Code 2022, is amended by adding the
- 21 following new subsection:
- 22 NEW SUBSECTION. 4. a. A vacancy in the office of
- 23 commissioner of a district shall be filled by a person
- 24 appointed by the committee.
- 25 b. The commission shall declare a vacancy in the office
- 26 of commissioner not later than thirty days after the vacancy
- 27 occurs. The vacancy may be based on a commissioner's
- 28 death or the commission's acceptance of the commissioner's
- 29 resignation. A vacancy is created when a commissioner changes
- 30 residence into a township where two commissioners then reside.
- 31 If a commissioner is absent for sixty percent or more of
- 32 monthly meetings during any twelve-month period, the other
- 33 commissioners by unanimous vote may declare the member's office
- 34 vacant.
- 35 c. The commissioners shall publish notice of the vacancy in

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- 1 the district pursuant to section 331.305. The commissioners
- 2 shall nominate one or more qualified electors residing in the
- 3 district to the committee. The commissioners shall make the
- 4 nominations in open session as provided in chapter 21. The
- 5 commissioners shall consider representation on the commission
- 6 that reflects the diversity of the district's population.
- 7 The commissioners shall accept applications from eligible
- 8 electors residing in the district. Not earlier than thirty
- 9 days after the notice of the vacancy was first published,
- 10 the commissioners shall submit to the committee a list and
- ll qualifications of eligible electors residing in the district
- 12 who are nominated by the commissioners and applicants who
- 13 submitted timely applications to the commissioners.
- 14 d. The committee shall review the lists of all nominees
- 15 and applicants in open session as provided in chapter 21. The
- 16 committee shall place consideration of the appointment on the
- 17 published agenda of the next regularly scheduled meeting of the
- 18 committee following receipt of nominations and applications.
- 19 The committee shall make all decisions regarding an appointment
- 20 in open session as provided in chapter 21. The committee shall
- 21 consider representation on the commission that reflects the
- 22 diversity of the district's population.
- 23 e. The vacancy shall be filled until the next succeeding
- 24 general election, at which time the balance of the unexpired
- 25 term shall be filled as provided by section 69.12.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 29 BACKGROUND. This bill amends provisions in Code chapter
- 30 161A, known as the "soil conservation districts law" (Code
- 31 section 161A.1), established within the jurisdiction of the
- 32 department of agriculture and land stewardship (DALS). There
- 33 are 100 soil and water conservation districts (districts)
- 34 (Code section 161A.5(1)). The governing body of a district
- 35 consists of five commissioners elected on a nonpartisan

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- 1 basis for staggered four-year terms (Code section 161A.5(2)).
- 2 The state soil conservation and water quality committee
- 3 (committee) consisting of nine governor-appointed members
- 4 together with DALS' division of soil conservation and water
- 5 quality oversees the districts and the commissioners for each
- 6 district (Code section 161A.4). A vacancy may occur on a
- 7 commission for various reasons, including when a commissioner
- 8 changes residence into a township where two commissioners then
- 9 reside. A vacancy may also occur based on a commissioner's
- 10 nonattendance. A vacancy is filled by a person appointed by
- 11 the committee until the next succeeding general election (Code
- 12 section 161A.5(2)).
- 13 BILL'S PROVISIONS. The bill requires the commissioners
- 14 to publish a notice of a vacancy in the district and accept
- 15 applications from persons interested in being appointed to fill
- 16 that vacancy. The commissioners must submit to the committee
- 17 a list of the names and qualifications of one or more persons
- 18 nominated by the commissioners and any applications that it
- 19 received after publishing the notice. The committee must
- 20 place consideration of the appointment on the published agenda
- 21 for the next regularly scheduled meeting of the committee
- 22 following receipt of the list of nominations and applications.
- 23 The commissioners and the committee shall make all decisions
- 24 regarding an appointment in open session under Iowa's open
- 25 meeting law (Code chapter 21). The commissioners and the
- 26 committee must consider representation on the commission
- 27 in a manner that reflects the diversity of the district's
- 28 population.
