## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to sales of catalytic converters to scrap metal
- 2 dealers, and making penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 714.27, subsection 2, Code 2022, is 2 amended to read as follows:

- 2. a. A person shall not sell scrap metal to a scrap metal 4 dealer in this state unless the person provides to the scrap 5 metal dealer, at or before the time of sale, the person's name, 6 address, and place of business, if any, and presents to the 7 scrap metal dealer a valid driver's license or nonoperator's 8 identification card, military identification card, passport, 9 or other government-issued photo identification. If the 10 scrap metal is a catalytic converter, the person shall sign a 11 statement swearing or affirming that the catalytic converter is
- 12 owned by the person and that the catalytic converter was not
- 13 taken from a vehicle without the vehicle owner's consent, and
- 14  $\underline{\text{shall submit the statement to the scrap metal dealer.}}$
- 15 b. (1) A scrap metal dealer shall not make an initial a
  16 purchase of scrap metal from a person without demanding and
  17 receiving the information required by this subsection.
- 18 (2) However, after an initial transaction, a scrap metal
- 19 dealer may only require the person's name and place of
- 20 business for subsequent purchases, provided the scrap metal
- 21 dealer retains all information received during the initial
- 22 transaction. This subparagraph does not apply to transactions
- 23 involving a catalytic converter.
- 24 Sec. 2. Section 714.27, subsection 5, paragraph b, Code
- 25 2022, is amended by striking the paragraph.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 29 Under current law, a person is prohibited from selling scrap
- 30 metal, which includes a catalytic converter detached from
- 31 a motor vehicle, to a scrap metal dealer unless the person
- 32 provides to the scrap metal dealer, at or before the time
- 33 of sale, the person's name, address, and place of business,
- 34 if any, and presents to the scrap metal dealer a valid
- 35 government-issued photo identification. A scrap metal dealer

- 1 is required to keep a confidential register or log of each
- 2 transaction, including a record of the required information
- 3 provided by the seller. All records and information must be
- 4 retained for at least two years, and must be provided to a law
- 5 enforcement agency or other officer or employee designated by
- 6 a county or city upon request during normal business hours as
- 7 part of an investigation. A scrap metal dealer is prohibited
- 8 from making an initial purchase of scrap metal from a person
- 9 without demanding and receiving the required transaction
- 10 information. However, after an initial transaction, a scrap
- 11 metal dealer may only require the person's name and place of
- 12 business for subsequent purchases, provided the scrap metal
- 13 dealer retains all information received during the initial
- 14 transaction. A person who violates these provisions is subject
- 15 to a civil penalty of between \$100 and \$1,000.
- 16 This bill requires a person selling a catalytic converter
- 17 to sign a statement swearing or affirming that the catalytic
- 18 converter is owned by the person and that the catalytic
- 19 converter was not taken from a vehicle without the vehicle
- 20 owner's consent. The seller must submit the statement to the
- 21 scrap metal dealer.
- 22 The bill requires a scrap metal dealer to demand and receive
- 23 the required information for every transaction involving a
- 24 catalytic converter.
- 25 Under current law, transactions for the sale of catalytic
- 26 converters in which the total sale price is \$75 or less
- 27 are exempt from the scrap metal transaction information and
- 28 recordkeeping requirements. The bill strikes this exemption,
- 29 thereby applying the bill and the provisions of Code section
- 30 714.27 to any sale of a catalytic converter.
