A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to renewal requirements for licenses issued by
- 2 the board of educational examiners to practitioners with
- 3 master's or doctoral degrees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 272.2, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 2 2022, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. License practitioners, which includes the authority to
- 4 establish do all of the following:
- 5 (1) Establish criteria for the licenses; establish.
- 6 (2) Establish issuance and renewal requirements, provided
- 7 that a continuing education requirement may be completed
- 8 by electronic means; create, and there shall be no renewal
- 9 requirement for a practitioner who possesses a master's or
- 10 doctoral degree.
- 11 (3) Create application and renewal forms; create.
- 12 (4) Create licenses that authorize different instructional
- 13 functions or specialties; develop.
- 14 (5) Develop a code of professional rights and
- 15 responsibilities, practices, and ethics, which shall, among
- 16 other things, address the all of the following:
- 17 (a) The failure of a practitioner to fulfill contractual
- 18 obligations under section 279.13, the.
- 19 (b) The failure of an administrator to protect the safety of
- 20 staff and students, the.
- 21 (c) The failure of an administrator to meet mandatory
- 22 reporter obligations, the.
- 23 (d) The refusal of a practitioner to implement provisions of
- 24 an individualized education program or behavioral intervention
- 25 plan, and habitual.
- 26 (e) Habitual nonparticipation in professional development;
- 27 and develop.
- 28 (f) The development of any other classifications,
- 29 distinctions, and procedures which may be necessary to exercise
- 30 licensing duties. In addressing the failure of a practitioner
- 31 to fulfill contractual obligations, the board shall consider
- 32 factors beyond the practitioner's control.
- 33 Sec. 2. Section 272.7, subsection 1, Code 2022, is amended
- 34 to read as follows:
- 35 l. A license issued under board authority is valid

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- 1 for the period of time for which it is issued, unless the
- 2 license is suspended or revoked. No Except as provided in
- 3 section 272.2, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (2),
- 4 permanent licenses shall not be issued. A person employed as
- 5 a practitioner shall hold a valid license with an endorsement
- 6 for the type of service for which the person is employed.
- 7 This section does not limit the duties or powers of a school
- 8 board to select or discharge practitioners or to terminate
- 9 practitioners' contracts. A professional development program,
- 10 except for a program offered by a practitioner preparation
- 11 institution or area education agency and approved by the state
- 12 board of education, must possess a valid license for the types
- 13 of programs offered.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 17 This bill relates to renewal requirements for licenses
- 18 issued by the board of educational examiners to practitioners
- 19 with master's or doctoral degrees.
- 20 Current law authorizes the board of educational examiners
- 21 (BOEE) to establish renewal requirements for licensed
- 22 practitioners. The bill provides that there shall be no
- 23 renewal requirement for a practitioner who possesses a
- 24 master's or doctoral degree. The bill makes conforming
- 25 changes, including changes to authorize permanent licensure for
- 26 practitioners who possess a master's or doctoral degree. The
- 27 bill does not affect the BOEE's ability to deny or revoke a
- 28 license under Code section 272.2(14).
