A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations involving certain
2 state departments, agencies, funds, and certain other
3 entities, providing for regulatory authority, and providing
4 for other properly related matters.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I
2 FY 2022-2023

3 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES.

4 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
5 to the department of administrative services for the fiscal
6 year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the
7 following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
8 used for the purposes designated:

9 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
10 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
11 equivalent positions:
12 \$ 3,603,404
13 FTEs 53.82

14 b. For the payment of utility costs, and for not more than
15 the following full-time equivalent positions:
16 \$ 4,104,239
17 FTEs 1.00

18 Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), any excess moneys appropriated
19 for utility costs in this lettered paragraph shall not revert
20 to the general fund of the state at the end of the fiscal year
21 but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes of
22 this lettered paragraph during the succeeding fiscal year.

23 c. For Terrace Hill operations, and for not more than the
24 following full-time equivalent positions:
25 \$ 461,674
26 FTEs 4.37

27 2. Any moneys and premiums collected by the department
28 for workers' compensation shall be segregated into a separate
29 workers' compensation fund in the state treasury to be used
30 for payment of state employees' workers' compensation claims
31 and administrative costs. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#),
32 unencumbered or unobligated moneys remaining in this workers'
33 compensation fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not
34 revert but shall be available for expenditure for purposes of
35 the fund for subsequent fiscal years.

1 3. The auditor of state shall allocate moneys from the
2 appropriation in this section solely for audit work related to
3 the comprehensive annual financial report, federally required
4 audits, and investigations of embezzlement, theft, or other
5 significant financial irregularities until the audit of the
6 comprehensive annual financial report is complete.

7 Sec. 5. IOWA ETHICS AND CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE BOARD. There
8 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
9 Iowa ethics and campaign disclosure board for the fiscal year
10 beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following
11 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
12 purposes designated:

13 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
14 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
15 equivalent positions:

18 Sec. 6. OFFICE OF THE CHIEF INFORMATION OFFICER.

19 1. There is appropriated to the office of the chief
20 information officer for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022,
21 and ending June 30, 2023, from the revolving funds designated
22 in [chapter 8B](#) and from internal service funds created by the
23 office such amounts as the office deems necessary for the
24 operation of the office consistent with the requirements of
25 chapter 8B.

26 2. a. Notwithstanding [section 321A.3, subsection 1](#), for the
27 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
28 the first \$750,000 collected and transferred to the treasurer
29 of state with respect to the fees for transactions involving
30 the furnishing of a certified abstract of a vehicle operating
31 record under [section 321A.3, subsection 1](#), shall be transferred
32 to the IowAccess revolving fund created in [section 8B.33](#) for
33 the purposes of developing, implementing, maintaining, and
34 expanding electronic access to government records as provided
35 by law.

1 b. All fees collected with respect to transactions
2 involving IowAccess shall be deposited in the IowAccess
3 revolving fund created under section 8B.33 and shall be used
4 only for the support of IowAccess projects.

5 Sec. 7. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE.

6 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
7 to the department of commerce for the fiscal year beginning
8 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amounts,
9 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
10 designated:

12 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
13 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
14 equivalent positions:

18 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

24 revolving fund created in section 546.12 to the department of
25 commerce for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending

29 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
30 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
31 equivalent positions:

34 b. CREDIT UNION DIVISION

35 For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

1 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
2 equivalent positions:

5 c. INSURANCE DIVISION

6 (1) For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
7 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
8 equivalent positions:

9 \$ 6,523,101
10 FTEs 121.85

11 (2) From the full-time equivalent positions authorized in
12 this paragraph, the insurance division shall use 2.00 full-time
13 equivalent positions for two fraud investigators.

14 (3) The insurance division shall use 1.00 full-time
15 equivalent position authorized in this paragraph for an
16 employee whose sole responsibility is investigating complaints
17 and notifications related to financial exploitation of eligible
18 adults.

19 (4) Except as provided in subparagraphs (2) and (3),
20 the insurance division may reallocate authorized full-time
21 equivalent positions as necessary to respond to accreditation
22 recommendations or requirements.

23 (5) The insurance division expenditures for examination
24 purposes may exceed the projected receipts, refunds, and
25 reimbursements, estimated pursuant to section 505.7, subsection
26 7, including the expenditures for retention of additional
27 personnel, if the expenditures are fully reimbursable and the
28 division first does both of the following:

29 (a) Notifies the department of management, the legislative
30 services agency, and the legislative fiscal committee of the
31 need for the expenditures.

32 (b) Files with each of the entities named in subparagraph
33 division (a) the legislative and regulatory justification for
34 the expenditures, along with an estimate of the expenditures.

35 d. UTILITIES DIVISION

1 (1) For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
2 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
3 equivalent positions:

6 (2) The utilities division may expend additional moneys,
7 including moneys for additional personnel, if those additional
8 expenditures are actual expenses which exceed the moneys
9 budgeted for utility regulation and the expenditures are fully
10 reimbursable. Before the division expends or encumbers an
11 amount in excess of the moneys budgeted for regulation, the
12 division shall first do both of the following:

13 (a) Notify the department of management, the legislative
14 services agency, and the legislative fiscal committee of the
15 need for the expenditures.

16 (b) File with each of the entities named in subparagraph
17 division (a) the legislative and regulatory justification for
18 the expenditures, along with an estimate of the expenditures.

19 3. CHARGES. Each division and the office of consumer
20 advocate shall include in its charges assessed or revenues
21 generated an amount sufficient to cover the amount stated
22 in its appropriation and any state-assessed indirect costs
23 determined by the department of administrative services.

24 Sec. 8. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE — PROFESSIONAL LICENSING
25 AND REGULATION BUREAU. There is appropriated from the housing
26 trust fund created pursuant to [section 16.181](#), to the bureau of
27 professional licensing and regulation of the banking division
28 of the department of commerce for the fiscal year beginning
29 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023, the following amounts,
30 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
31 designated:

1 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the offices

4 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
5 purposes designated:

2 b. By December 1, 2022, the department, in coordination
3 with the investigations division, shall submit a report to the
4 general assembly concerning the division's activities relative
5 to fraud in public assistance programs for the fiscal year
6 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022. The report
7 shall include but is not limited to a summary of the number
8 of cases investigated, case outcomes, overpayment dollars
9 identified, amount of cost avoidance, and actual dollars
10 recovered.

11 4. HEALTH FACILITIES DIVISION

12 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
13 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
14 equivalent positions:

17 b. The department shall, in coordination with the health
18 facilities division, make the following information available
19 to the public as part of the department's development efforts
20 to revise the department's internet site:

21 (1) The number of inspections conducted by the division
22 annually by type of service provider and type of inspection.

23 (2) The total annual operations budget for the division,
24 including general fund appropriations and federal contract
25 dollars received by type of service provider inspected.

26 (3) The total number of full-time equivalent positions in
27 the division, to include the number of full-time equivalent
28 positions serving in a supervisory capacity, and serving as
29 surveyors, inspectors, or monitors in the field by type of
30 service provider inspected.

31 (4) Identification of state and federal survey trends,
32 cited regulations, the scope and severity of deficiencies
33 identified, and federal and state fines assessed and collected
34 concerning nursing and assisted living facilities and programs.

35 c. It is the intent of the general assembly that the

1 department and division continuously solicit input from
2 facilities regulated by the division to assess and improve
3 the division's level of collaboration and to identify new
4 opportunities for cooperation.

5 d. Notwithstanding section 8.33, from moneys appropriated
6 in this subsection, any unencumbered or unobligated moneys that
7 remain at the close of the fiscal year, not to exceed \$318,900,
8 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for
9 the costs associated with the completion of additional surveys
10 required of long-term care facilities due to the COVID-19
11 pandemic. The moneys shall provide the one-time state match
12 moneys for a federal award from the centers for Medicare and
13 Medicaid services to the health facilities division of the
14 department of inspections and appeals. Any unencumbered or
15 unobligated moneys that remain at the close of the fiscal year
16 ending June 30, 2024, from the moneys that do not revert June
17 30, 2023, pursuant to this paragraph, shall revert to the
18 general fund.

19 5. EMPLOYMENT APPEAL BOARD

20 a. For salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
21 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time
22 equivalent positions:

25 b. The employment appeal board shall be reimbursed by
26 the labor services division of the department of workforce
27 development for all costs associated with hearings conducted
28 under [chapter 91C](#), related to contractor registration. The
29 board may expend, in addition to the amount appropriated under
30 this subsection, additional amounts as are directly billable
31 to the labor services division under this subsection and to
32 retain the additional full-time equivalent positions as needed
33 to conduct hearings required pursuant to [chapter 91C](#).

34 c. The employment appeal board may temporarily exceed and
35 draw more than the amount appropriated in this subsection and

1 incur a negative cash balance as long as there are receivables
2 of federal funds equal to or greater than the negative balance
3 and the amount appropriated in this subsection is not exceeded
4 at the close of the fiscal year.

31 8.39, the department of inspections and appeals, in
32 consultation with the department of management, may reallocate

1 appeals shall not reallocate moneys appropriated to the child
2 advocacy board in this section.

11 2. From the fees collected by the department under this
12 section on behalf of a municipal corporation with which
13 the department has an agreement pursuant to [section 137F.3,](#)
14 through a statewide electronic licensing system operated by
15 the department, notwithstanding [section 137F.6, subsection 2,](#)
16 the department shall remit the amount of those fees to the
17 municipal corporation for whom the fees were collected less
18 any electronic transaction fees collected by the department to
19 enable electronic payment.

20 3. From the fees collected by the department under this
21 section, other than those fees described in subsection 2,
22 the department shall deposit the amount of \$800,000 into the
23 general fund of the state prior to June 30, 2023.

24 4. From the fees collected by the department under this
25 section, other than those fees described in subsections 2 and
26 3, the department shall retain the remainder of the fees for

2 This bill makes appropriations to certain state departments,
3 agencies, funds, and certain other entities. The bill is
4 organized by divisions.

5 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS — FY 2022-2023. The bill relates
6 to and appropriates moneys to various state departments,
7 agencies, and funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022,
8 and ending June 30, 2023. The bill makes appropriations to
9 state departments and agencies including the department of
10 administrative services, auditor of state, Iowa ethics and
11 campaign disclosure board, office of the chief information
12 officer, department of commerce, offices of governor and
13 lieutenant governor, governor's office of drug control policy,
14 department of human rights, department of inspections and
15 appeals, department of management, Iowa public information
16 board, department of revenue, secretary of state, treasurer
17 of state, and Iowa public employees' retirement system. The
18 bill modifies the technology modernization fund. The bill
19 provides that on or after July 1, 2022, any unobligated or
20 unencumbered moneys remaining in the technology modernization
21 fund are appropriated to the secretary of state for purposes
22 of modernization within the business services division until
23 the moneys are fully expended or until June 30, 2026, whichever
24 occurs first. The bill removes language regarding moneys
25 credited to the fund. The bill provides that the technology
26 modernization fund shall be repealed on July 1, 2026.
27 Currently, up to \$2 million of certain fees may be credited to
28 the fund annually and the fund is to be repealed on July 1,
29 2022.

30 STANDING APPROPRIATIONS — LIMITATIONS. The bill limits a
31 standing appropriation for enforcement of Code chapter 453D
32 relating to tobacco product manufacturers under Code section
33 453D.8. The appropriation for FY 2022-2023 shall not exceed
