

House Study Bill 532 - Introduced

A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to a state-funded psychiatric residency program
2 at the state mental health institutes and the Iowa medical
3 and classification center at Oakdale, creating a program
4 fund, and making appropriations.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 135.180 State-funded psychiatric
2 residency program — fund — appropriations.

3 1. The university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall
4 administer a state-funded psychiatric residency program
5 in cooperation with the state mental health institutes
6 at Independence and Cherokee and the Iowa medical and
7 classification center at Oakdale. The program shall provide
8 financial support for residency positions which are in excess
9 of the federal residency cap established by the federal
10 Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Pub. L. No. 105-33. Participating
11 residents shall complete their residency training at one of
12 the state mental health institutes or the Iowa medical and
13 classification center at Oakdale.

14 2. The residency program shall provide for the awarding
15 of twelve residency positions for each class of residents.
16 Preference in the awarding of residency positions shall
17 be given to candidates who are residents of Iowa, attended
18 and earned an undergraduate degree from an Iowa college or
19 university, or attended and earned a medical degree from a
20 medical school in Iowa.

21 3. A psychiatric residency program fund is created in
22 the state treasury consisting of the moneys appropriated or
23 credited to the fund by law. Notwithstanding section 8.33,
24 moneys in the fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not
25 revert to any other fund but shall remain in the psychiatric
26 residency program fund for use in subsequent fiscal years.
27 Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the university of Iowa
28 hospitals and clinics to be used for the purposes of the
29 program. For fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2023,
30 there is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
31 psychiatric residency program fund the following amounts to be
32 used for the purposes of the program:

33 a. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, one million
34 two hundred thousand dollars.

35 b. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, two million

1 four hundred thousand dollars.

2 *c.* For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, three million
3 six hundred thousand dollars.

4 *d.* For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and each
5 fiscal year thereafter, four million eight hundred thousand
6 dollars.

7 EXPLANATION

8 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
9 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

10 This bill requires the university of Iowa hospitals and
11 clinics to administer a state-funded psychiatric residency
12 program in cooperation with the state mental health institutes
13 at Independence and Cherokee and the Iowa medical and
14 classification center at Oakdale. The program shall provide
15 financial support for residency positions in excess of those
16 approved under the federal residency cap. Participating
17 residents shall complete their residency training at one of
18 the state mental health institutes or the Iowa medical and
19 classification center at Oakdale. The program shall award 12
20 residency positions for each class of residents and preference
21 in the awarding of residency positions shall be given to
22 candidates who are residents of Iowa, attended and earned an
23 undergraduate degree from an Iowa college or university, or
24 attended and earned a medical degree from a medical school in
25 Iowa.

26 The bill creates a psychiatric residency program fund in
27 the state treasury consisting of the moneys appropriated or
28 credited to the fund by law. Moneys in the fund at the end of
29 each fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain in the fund
30 for use in subsequent fiscal years. Moneys in the fund are
31 appropriated to the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics
32 to be used for the purposes of the program. The bill makes
33 appropriations for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2023, and
34 thereafter.
