

**House Study Bill 66 - Introduced**

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to nonstate moneys expended by the board of  
2 regents and institutions governed by the board of regents,  
3 and including applicability provisions.  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 262.26A Nonstate moneys — approval  
2 by general assembly required — annual report.

3 1. The board and institutions governed by the board  
4 pursuant to section 262.7 shall not expend any nonstate moneys,  
5 including federal funds, public or private gifts or donations,  
6 nonstate grants or receipts, and any other moneys from any  
7 nonstate public or private sources, unless the expenditure is  
8 approved by an Act of the general assembly.

9 2. On or before January 15 of each year, the board shall  
10 submit a report to the general assembly and the governor  
11 detailing all of the following:

12 a. The nature and amount of nonstate moneys received or  
13 expected to be received for expenditure in the following fiscal  
14 year by the board and each institution governed by the board.

15 b. The nature and amount of each proposed expenditure of  
16 nonstate moneys in the following fiscal year by the board and  
17 each institution governed by the board.

18 3. The report required under subsection 2 is in addition to  
19 the estimates and reports required under sections 8.23, 8.44,  
20 and 262.26, and any other provision of law.

21 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to expenditures for  
22 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and each fiscal year  
23 thereafter.

24 EXPLANATION

25 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
26 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

27 Under current practice, the general assembly appropriates  
28 federal funds and other nonstate moneys to state governmental  
29 entities, including the state board of regents (board), in the  
30 biennial block grant appropriations bill.

31 This bill prohibits the board and institutions governed  
32 by the board (the state university of Iowa, including  
33 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics; the Iowa  
34 state university of science and technology, including the  
35 agricultural experiment station; the university of northern

1 Iowa; the Iowa braille and sight saving school; the Iowa school  
2 for the deaf; the Oakdale campus; and the university of Iowa  
3 hospitals and clinics' center for disabilities and development)  
4 from expending any nonstate moneys, including federal funds,  
5 public or private gifts or donations, nonstate grants or  
6 receipts, and any other moneys from any nonstate public or  
7 private sources, unless the expenditure is approved by an Act  
8 of the general assembly.

9 The bill requires the board to, on or before January 15  
10 of each year, submit a report to the general assembly and  
11 the governor detailing the nature and amount of nonstate  
12 moneys received or expected to be received for expenditure in  
13 the following fiscal year by the board and each institution  
14 governed by the board, and the nature and amount of each  
15 proposed expenditure of nonstate moneys in the following fiscal  
16 year by the board and each institution governed by the board.

17 The report required by the bill is in addition to the other  
18 estimates and reports required by current law, including under  
19 Code section 8.23 (annual estimates of expenditure requirements  
20 submitted to the department of management (DOM)), Code section  
21 8.44 (quarterly report by the board to DOM on federal funds  
22 and other moneys received from any public or private sources  
23 except gifts or donations), and Code section 262.26 (report by  
24 the board to the governor and general assembly that includes an  
25 itemized account of the receipts and expenditures of the board,  
26 reports made to the board by the executive officers of the  
27 board's institutions, and budgets for biennial appropriations  
28 deemed necessary and proper for the support of the board's  
29 institutions and for extraordinary and special expenditures).

30 The bill applies to expenditures for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 2022, and each fiscal year thereafter.
