A BILL FOR

1	An	Act relating to facial covering policies adopted by the
2		boards of directors of school districts or the authorities
3		in charge of accredited nonpublic schools and providing
4		civil penalties.
5	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 280.31, Code 2022, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 280.31 Facial coverings.

The board of directors of a school district, the 4 1. 5 superintendent or chief administering officer of a school 6 or school district, and the authorities in charge of each 7 accredited nonpublic school shall not adopt, enforce, or 8 implement a policy that requires its employees, students, or 9 members of the public to wear a facial covering for any purpose 10 while on the school district's or accredited nonpublic school's 11 property unless the facial covering is necessary for a specific 12 extracurricular or instructional purpose, or is required by 13 section 280.10 or 280.11 or any other provision of law. 14 2. a. If the board of directors of a school district or the 15 authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school adopt a 16 facial covering policy as a necessary accommodation for a child 17 with disabilities, the board or authorities shall grant an 18 exception to the policy to any student whose parent or guardian 19 provides written notice to the school district or accredited 20 nonpublic school indicating that wearing a facial covering is 21 detrimental to the student's education. b. The board of directors of a school district and the 22 23 authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school shall 24 process all written notices submitted pursuant to paragraph "a" 25 within twenty-four hours after receipt. 26 c. The board of directors of a school district or the 27 authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school shall 28 not take any adverse action against a student who is granted 29 an exception to a policy that requires students to wear 30 facial coverings as a necessary accommodation for a child with 31 disabilities. d. The department of education shall adopt rules pursuant 32 33 to chapter 17A to create a process to accept complaints from 34 parents and guardians related to violations of this subsection. 35 If, after investigation, the department of education determines

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1	that any employee or contractor of the board of directors of a
2	school district or the authorities in charge of an accredited
3	nonpublic school has violated this subsection, the department
4	of education shall assess a civil penalty against the employee
5	or contractor not to exceed five hundred dollars for each
6	violation. Revenue from the civil penalty provided in this
7	paragraph shall be remitted to the treasurer of state for
8	deposit in the general fund of the state.
9	EXPLANATION
10	The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
11	the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

12 This bill relates to facial covering policies adopted by 13 the boards of directors of school districts or the authorities 14 in charge of accredited nonpublic schools and provides civil 15 penalties.

The bill requires that if the board of directors of a rschool district or the authorities in charge of an accredited round a facial covering policy as a necessary accommodation for a child with disabilities, the board or authorities shall grant an exception to the policy to any student whose parent or guardian provides written notice to the school district or accredited nonpublic school indicating that wearing a facial covering is detrimental to the student's education. Additionally, the bill requires the board of directors of a school district and the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school to process these requests within requires a student who is granted an exception.

The bill requires the department of education to adopt rules to create a process to accept complaints from parents and guardians related to violations of the bill's provisions. The bill provides that if the department determines that any employee or contractor of the board of directors of a school district or the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school has violated the bill's provisions, the

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1 department shall assess a civil penalty against the employee or 2 contractor not to exceed \$500 for each violation.

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
