A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the use of an electronic device in a
2 voice-activated or hands-free mode while driving, providing
3 penalties, and making penalties applicable.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321.178, subsection 2, paragraph
2 a, subparagraph (2), Code 2022, is amended by striking the
3 subparagraph.

4 Sec. 2. Section 321.178, subsection 2, paragraphs b and c,
5 Code 2022, are amended to read as follows:

6 ~~b. The department may suspend a restricted driver's license~~
7 ~~issued under [this section](#) upon receiving satisfactory evidence~~
8 ~~that the licensee has violated the restrictions imposed under~~
9 ~~paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), subparagraph division (a).~~
10 The department may also suspend a restricted license issued
11 under [this section](#) upon receiving a record of the person's
12 conviction for one violation and shall revoke the license upon
13 receiving a record of conviction for two or more violations
14 of a law of this state or a city ordinance regulating the
15 operation of motor vehicles on highways, other than parking
16 violations as defined in [section 321.210](#). After revoking a
17 license under [this section](#) the department shall not grant an
18 application for a new license or permit until the expiration
19 of one year or until the person attains the age of eighteen,
20 whichever is the longer period.

21 ~~c. A person who violates the restrictions imposed under~~
22 ~~paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), subparagraph division (a),~~
23 ~~may be issued a citation under [this section](#) and shall not be~~
24 ~~issued a citation under [section 321.193](#). A violation of the~~
25 ~~restrictions imposed under paragraph "a", subparagraph (2),~~
26 ~~subparagraph division (a), shall not be considered a moving~~
27 ~~violation.~~

28 Sec. 3. Section 321.180B, subsection 3, paragraph b, Code
29 2022, is amended to read as follows:

30 ~~b. The department may suspend an instruction permit,~~
31 intermediate license, or full license issued under [this section](#)
32 upon receiving satisfactory evidence that the person issued
33 the instruction permit, intermediate license, or full license
34 violated the restrictions imposed under subsection 1, or 2, ~~or~~
35 6 during the term of the instruction permit or intermediate

1 license.

2 Sec. 4. Section 321.180B, subsection 6, Code 2022, is
3 amended by striking the subsection.

4 Sec. 5. Section 321.180B, subsection 7, Code 2022, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 7. *Citations for violation of restrictions.* A person who
7 violates the restrictions imposed under subsection ~~17~~ or 27 ~~or~~
8 6 may be issued a citation under [this section](#) and shall not be
9 issued a citation under [section 321.193](#). A violation of the
10 restrictions imposed under [subsection 17](#) or 27 ~~or 6~~ shall not
11 be considered a moving violation.

12 Sec. 6. Section 321.194, subsection 2, paragraph b,
13 subparagraph (2), Code 2022, is amended by striking the
14 subparagraph.

15 Sec. 7. Section 321.210, subsection 2, paragraph e, Code
16 2022, is amended by striking the paragraph.

17 Sec. 8. Section 321.238, Code 2022, is amended to read as
18 follows:

19 **321.238 Use of electronic devices while driving — preemption**
20 **of local legislation.**

21 The provisions of [this chapter](#) restricting the use of
22 electronic ~~communication devices and electronic entertainment~~
23 devices by motor vehicle operators shall be implemented
24 uniformly throughout the state. Such provisions shall preempt
25 any county or municipal ordinance regarding the use of an
26 electronic ~~communication device or electronic entertainment~~
27 device by a motor vehicle operator. In addition, a county or
28 municipality shall not adopt or continue in effect an ordinance
29 regarding the use of an electronic ~~communication device or~~
30 ~~electronic entertainment~~ device by a motor vehicle operator.

31 Sec. 9. Section 321.276, subsection 1, Code 2022, is amended
32 by striking the subsection and inserting in lieu thereof the
33 following:

34 1. For purposes of this section:

35 a. "Electronic device" means a device powered by electricity

1 that is capable of being used to compose, send, receive, or
2 read an electronic message, or that is capable of storing,
3 retrieving on-demand, or displaying videos, movies, broadcast
4 television images, visual images, or audio or video data
5 files. *“Electronic device”* includes but is not limited to
6 a telephone, personal digital assistant, portable or mobile
7 computer, and any substantially similar portable device that is
8 used to initiate, store, or receive electronic communication,
9 information, or data. *“Electronic device”* does not include a
10 device that is physically or electronically integrated into
11 a motor vehicle, including but not limited to an integrated
12 global positioning system or navigation system.

13 *b. “Voice-activated or hands-free mode”* means an attachment,
14 accessory, application, wireless connection, or built-in
15 feature of an electronic device or motor vehicle that allows a
16 person to use verbal or single-touch commands to activate or
17 deactivate the device or a function or software application
18 of the device. *“Voice-activated or hands-free mode”* does not
19 include accessing nonnavigation video content, engaging in a
20 video call, accessing or engaging in video streaming, accessing
21 gaming data, or reading an electronic message.

22 Sec. 10. Section 321.276, subsections 2, 3, and 4, Code
23 2022, are amended to read as follows:

24 2. A person shall not use a ~~hand-held~~ an electronic
25 ~~communication device to write, send, or view an electronic~~
26 ~~message~~ while driving a motor vehicle unless the motor vehicle
27 is at a complete stop off the traveled portion of the roadway,
28 or as far away from the center of the roadway as is practicable
29 if the vehicle cannot be entirely removed from the traveled
30 portion of the roadway.

31 *a.* A person does not violate this section by using a ~~global~~
32 ~~positioning system or navigation system or when, for the~~
33 ~~purpose of engaging in a call, the person selects or enters a~~
34 ~~telephone number or name in a hand-held mobile telephone or~~
35 ~~activates, deactivates, or initiates a function of a hand-held~~

1 ~~mobile telephone~~ an electronic device in a voice-activated or
2 hands-free mode.

3 *b.* The provisions of **this subsection** relating to ~~writing,~~
4 ~~sending, or viewing an electronic message~~ the use of an
5 electronic device do not apply to the following persons:

6 (1) A member of a public safety agency, as defined in
7 section 34.1, performing official duties.

8 (2) A health care professional in the course of an emergency
9 situation.

10 (3) A person receiving safety-related information including
11 emergency, ~~traffic,~~ or weather alerts.

12 (4) A person using an electronic device for the purpose
13 of reporting an emergency situation, including any continued
14 communication with emergency personnel during the emergency
15 situation, or public transit personnel responding to a
16 transit-specific situation.

17 (5) A person using a two-way radio transmitter or receiver
18 who is licensed with the federal communications commission in
19 amateur radio service.

20 (6) A member of a public transit system, as defined in
21 section 324A.1, performing official duties while in a vehicle
22 that is not in motion.

23 (7) A utility maintenance employee or contractor using
24 an electronic device while in a utility maintenance vehicle,
25 for the purpose of providing utility services including
26 but not limited to cable, electric, natural gas, telephone,
27 telecommunication, water, and wastewater treatment services,
28 provided the employee or contractor is acting within the scope
29 of their employment or agency.

30 (8) A transportation network company driver, as defined in
31 section 321N.1, while engaged in a prearranged ride, as defined
32 in section 321N.1, provided the vehicle is not in motion.

33 (9) A person using an electronic device for the purpose of
34 accessing or using a fleet management system.

35 3. Nothing in **this section** shall be construed to authorize

1 a peace officer to confiscate a ~~hand-held~~ an electronic
2 ~~communication~~ device from the driver or occupant of a motor
3 vehicle.

4 4. a. A person convicted of a violation of this section
5 is guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled
6 violation under [section 805.8A, subsection 14](#), paragraph "1".

7 b. A violation of this section shall ~~not~~ be considered a
8 moving violation for purposes of [this chapter](#) or rules adopted
9 pursuant to [this chapter](#).

10 c. Notwithstanding paragraphs "a" and "b", a peace officer
11 shall issue a warning memorandum in lieu of a citation to a
12 person for violating this section. This paragraph is repealed
13 January 1, 2023.

14 Sec. 11. Section 321.482A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code
15 2022, is amended to read as follows:

16 Notwithstanding [section 321.482](#), a person who is convicted
17 of operating a motor vehicle in violation of ~~section 321.178,~~
18 ~~subsection 2, paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), section~~
19 ~~321.180B, subsection 6, [section 321.194, subsection 2,](#)~~
20 ~~paragraph "b", subparagraph (2), [section 321.256, 321.257,](#)~~
21 ~~section 321.275, subsection 4, [section 321.276, 321.297,](#)~~
22 ~~321.298, [321.299, 321.302, 321.303, 321.304, 321.305, 321.306,](#)~~
23 ~~321.307, [321.311, 321.319, 321.320, 321.321, 321.322, 321.323,](#)~~
24 ~~321.324, [321.324A, 321.327, 321.329, 321.333,](#) section 321.372,~~

30 Sec. 12. Section 321.555, subsection 2, Code 2022, is
31 amended to read as follows:

32 2. Six or more of any separate and distinct offenses within
33 a two-year period in the operation of a motor vehicle, which
34 are required to be reported to the department by section
35 321.491 or [chapter 321C](#), except equipment violations, parking

1 violations as defined in [section 321.210](#), violations of
2 registration laws, violations of [sections 321.445](#) and [321.446](#),
3 ~~violations of [section 321.276](#)~~, operating a vehicle with an
4 expired license or permit, failure to appear, weights and
5 measures violations and speeding violations of less than
6 fifteen miles per hour over the legal speed limit.

7 Sec. 13. Section 707.6A, subsection 2, paragraph a,
8 subparagraphs (1), (2), and (3), Code 2022, are amended by
9 striking the subparagraphs and inserting in lieu thereof the
10 following:

11 (1) For purposes of this paragraph "a", a person's use of
12 an electronic device while driving a motor vehicle shall be
13 considered prima facie evidence that the person was driving
14 the motor vehicle in a reckless manner with willful or wanton
15 disregard for the safety of persons or property, in violation
16 of section 321.277.

17 (2) Subparagraph (1) does not apply to any of the following:

18 (a) A person using an electronic device in a voice-activated
19 or hands-free mode.

20 (b) A member of a public safety agency, as defined in
21 section 34.1, performing official duties.

22 (c) A health care professional in the course of an emergency
23 situation.

24 (d) A person receiving safety-related information including
25 emergency or weather alerts.

26 (e) A person using an electronic device for the purpose
27 of reporting an emergency situation, including any continued
28 communication with emergency personnel during the emergency
29 situation, or public transit personnel responding to a
30 transit-specific situation.

31 (f) A person using a two-way radio transmitter or receiver
32 who is licensed with the federal communications commission in
33 amateur radio service.

34 (g) A member of a public transit system, as defined in
35 section 324A.1, performing official duties while in a vehicle

1 that is not in motion.

2 (h) A utility maintenance employee or contractor using
3 an electronic device while in a utility maintenance vehicle,
4 for the purpose of providing utility services including
5 but not limited to cable, electric, natural gas, telephone,
6 telecommunication, water, and wastewater treatment services,
7 provided the employee or contractor is acting within the scope
8 of their employment or agency.

9 (i) A transportation network company driver, as defined in
10 section 321N.1, while engaged in a prearranged ride, as defined
11 in section 321N.1, provided the vehicle is not in motion.

12 (j) A person using an electronic device for the purpose of
13 accessing or using a fleet management system.

14 (3) For purposes of this paragraph "a", the following
15 definitions apply:

16 (a) "*Electronic device*" means the same as defined in section
17 321.276.

18 (b) "*Voice-activated or hands-free mode*" means the same as
19 defined in section 321.276.

20 Sec. 14. Section 805.8A, subsection 4, paragraph c, Code
21 2022, is amended by striking the paragraph.

22 Sec. 15. Section 805.8A, subsection 14, paragraph 1, Code
23 2022, is amended to read as follows:

24 1. ~~*Writing, sending, or viewing an*~~ *Use of electronic message*
25 *device while driving violations*. For violations under section
26 321.276, the scheduled fine is forty-five dollars.

EXPLANATION

28 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
29 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

30 Under current law, Code section 321.276 prohibits the use of
31 hand-held electronic communication devices to write, send, or
32 view electronic messages while driving a motor vehicle. This
33 bill expands Code section 321.276 to prohibit any use of an
34 electronic device while driving. The bill defines the terms
35 "electronic device" and "voice-activated or hands-free mode".

1 The bill allows the use of an electronic device if the vehicle
2 is at a complete stop off the traveled portion of the roadway,
3 or as far away from the center of the roadway as is practicable
4 if the vehicle cannot be entirely removed.

5 The bill provides exceptions for the use of an electronic
6 device in a voice-activated or hands-free mode, for members of
7 a public safety agency performing official duties, for health
8 care professionals in the course of emergency situations, for
9 the purpose of receiving safety-related information, for the
10 purpose of reporting an emergency situation, for certain radio
11 operators, for members of a public transit system performing
12 official duties while in a vehicle that is not in motion, for
13 utility maintenance employees or contractors for the purpose of
14 providing utility services, for transportation network company
15 drivers engaged in a prearranged ride while the vehicle is not
16 in motion, and for a person using an electronic device for the
17 purpose of accessing or using a fleet management system.

18 The scheduled fine for a violation of Code section 321.276
19 remains \$45. The bill makes a violation of Code section
20 321.276 a moving violation. Under current law, a moving
21 violation can be considered for purposes of administrative
22 suspension of a driver's license or to establish habitual
23 offender status. However, a peace officer is required to issue
24 a warning memorandum in lieu of a citation for violations that
25 occur during the period between the effective date of the bill
26 and January 1, 2023.

27 Under Code section 321.482A, if a person is convicted for a
28 violation and if the violation causes a serious injury, a court
29 could impose an additional fine of \$500 or suspend the person's
30 driver's license for not more than 90 days, or both. If a
31 person is convicted for a violation and if the violation causes
32 a death, a court could impose an additional fine of \$1,000 or
33 suspend the person's driver's license for not more than 180
34 days, or both.

35 The bill makes corresponding changes to Code sections

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1 321.238 (preemption of local legislation) and 707.6A (homicide
2 or serious injury by vehicle) to align those provisions to the
3 provisions of Code section 321.276 as amended by the bill.
4 The bill also makes corresponding changes to Code sections
5 321.178, 321.180B, and 321.194, by striking provisions relating
6 to the use of electronic communication devices while driving
7 by persons under the age of 18 who are issued certain types
8 of driver's licenses, thereby making Code section 321.276 as
9 amended by the bill applicable to such persons.
