Senate Resolution 101 - Introduced

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 101 BY COMMITTEE ON ETHICS (SUCCESSOR TO SSB 3038)

- 1 A Resolution relating to the requirements under the
- 2 Senate Code of Ethics for filing personal financial
- 3 disclosure forms by senators and candidates for
- 4 senate.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, That Rule 11 of the
- 6 Senate Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth General
- 7 Assembly, as adopted during the 2021 Session in Senate
- 8 Resolution 1, is amended as follows:
- 9 11. DISCLOSURE REQUIRED BY SENATORS. Each senator
- 10 shall file with the secretary of the senate within ten
- 11 days after the adoption of the code of ethics by the
- 12 senate, and within ten days after the convening of the
- 13 second session of the general assembly, a financial
- 14 statement under section 68B.35 on forms provided by
- 15 the secretary of the senate setting forth the following
- 16 information:
- 17 The nature of each business in which the senator
- 18 is engaged and the nature of the business of each
- 19 company in which the senator has a financial interest.
- 20 A senator shall not be required to file a report
- 21 financial statement or be assumed to have a financial
- 22 interest if the annual income derived from the
- 23 investment in stocks, bonds, bills, notes, mortgages,
- 24 or other securities offered for sale through recognized
- 25 financial brokers is less than one thousand dollars.
- 26 Disclosures required under this rule shall be as
- 27 of the date filed unless provided to the contrary,

- 1 and shall be amended to include interests and changes
- 2 encompassed by this rule that occur while the general
- 3 assembly is in session. All filings under this rule
- 4 shall be open to public inspection in the office of the
- 5 secretary of the senate at all reasonable times.
- 6 The secretary of the senate shall inform the ethics
- 7 committee of the financial statements which are filed
- 8 and shall report to the ethics committee the names
- 9 of any senators who appear not to have filed complete
- 10 financial statements. The chairperson of the ethics
- 11 committee shall request in writing that a senator who
- 12 has failed to complete the report financial statement
- 13 or appears to have filed an incomplete report financial
- 14 statement do so within five days, and, upon the failure
- 15 of the senator to comply, the ethics committee shall
- 16 require the senator to appear before the committee.
- 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Senate Code of
- 18 Ethics for the Eighty-ninth General Assembly, as
- 19 adopted during the 2021 Session in Senate Resolution 1,
- 20 is amended by adding the following new rule:
- 21 11A. DISCLOSURE REQUIRED BY CANDIDATES FOR SENATE.
- 22 Each candidate for senate shall file with the secretary
- 23 of the senate within fourteen days after the deadline
- 24 for the filing of nomination papers or fourteen days
- 25 after the nominating convention, as applicable, a
- 26 financial statement under section 68B.35 on forms
- 27 provided by the secretary of the senate setting forth
- 28 the following information:
- 29 The nature of each business in which the candidate
- 30 for senate is engaged and the nature of the business

- 1 of each company in which the candidate for senate has a
- 2 financial interest. A candidate for senate shall not
- 3 be required to file a financial statement or be assumed
- 4 to have a financial interest if the annual income
- 5 derived from the investment in stocks, bonds, bills,
- 6 notes, mortgages, or other securities offered for sale
- 7 through recognized financial brokers is less than one
- 8 thousand dollars.
- 9 Disclosures required under this rule shall be for
- 10 the year preceding the year in which the election is to
- 11 be held. All filings under this rule shall be open to
- 12 public inspection in the office of the secretary of the
- 13 senate at all reasonable times.
- 14 The secretary of the senate shall provide
- 15 information to persons interested in becoming
- 16 candidates for senate of the duty to file financial
- 17 statements under this rule and the applicable
- 18 deadlines.
- 19 A candidate for senate who fails to file a complete
- 20 financial statement with the secretary of senate by
- 21 the applicable deadline shall be fined fifty dollars,
- 22 payable to the Iowa senate for deposit in the general
- 23 fund.
- 24 The secretary of the senate may refer a candidate
- 25 who has failed to file a complete financial statement
- 26 by the deadlines established under this code of ethics
- 27 two or more consecutive times to the ethics committee
- 28 and the committee may require the candidate to appear
- 29 before the committee.
- 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 15 of the Senate

- 1 Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth General Assembly,
- 2 as adopted during the 2021 Session in Senate Resolution
- 3 l, is amended as follows:
- 4 15. COMPLAINTS. Complaints or charges against any
- 5 senator, candidate for senate, lobbyist, or any client
- 6 of a lobbyist shall be in writing, made under penalty
- 7 of perjury, and filed with the secretary of the senate.
- 8 When filed with the secretary of the senate, the
- 9 secretary shall immediately advise the chairperson of
- 10 the ethics committee of the receipt of the complaint.
- 11 Complaint forms shall be available from the
- 12 secretary of the senate, or the chairperson of the
- 13 ethics committee, but a complaint shall not be rejected
- 14 for failure to use an approved form if the complaint
- 15 substantially complies with senate requirements.
- 16 A complainant may submit exhibits and affidavits
- 17 attached to the complaint.
- 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 16, paragraph
- 19 "a" of the Senate Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth
- 20 General Assembly, as adopted during the 2021 Session in
- 21 Senate Resolution 1, is amended as follows:
- 22 a. Persons entitled. Complaints may be filed by
- 23 any person believing that a senator, candidate for
- 24 senate, lobbyist, or client of a lobbyist has violated
- 25 the senate ethics code, the joint rules governing
- 26 lobbyists, or chapter 68B, as applicable. A violation
- 27 of the criminal law may be considered to be a violation
- 28 of this code of ethics if the violation constitutes a
- 29 serious misdemeanor or greater, or a repetitive and
- 30 flagrant violation of the law.

- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 19, paragraph
- 2 "f", subparagraph (2) of the Senate Code of Ethics for
- 3 the Eighty-ninth General Assembly, as adopted during
- 4 the 2021 Session in Senate Resolution 1, is amended as
- 5 follows:
- 6 (2) That the senator, candidate for senate,
- 7 lobbyist, or client of a lobbyist be censured or
- 8 reprimanded, and recommend the appropriate form of
- 9 censure or reprimand.
- 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 20 of the Senate
- 11 Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth General Assembly,
- 12 as adopted during the 2021 Session in Senate Resolution
- 13 1, is amended as follows:
- 14 20. COMMITTEE AUTHORIZED TO MEET. The senate
- 15 ethics committee is authorized to meet at the
- 16 discretion of the chairperson to conduct hearings and
- 17 other business that properly may come before it. If
- 18 the committee submits a report seeking senate action
- 19 against a senator, candidate for senate, lobbyist, or
- 20 client of a lobbyist after the second regular session
- 21 of a general assembly has adjourned sine die, the
- 22 report shall be submitted to and considered by the
- 23 subsequent general assembly. However, the report
- 24 may be submitted to and considered during any special
- 25 session which may take place after the second regular
- 26 session of a general assembly has adjourned sine die,
- 27 but before the convening of the next general assembly.
- 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 21, paragraph
- 29 "b" of the Senate Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth
- 30 General Assembly, as adopted during the 2021 Session in

1 Senate Resolution 1, is amended as follows: b. Form and contents of requests. A request for 3 a formal advisory opinion shall be in writing and 4 may pertain to any subject matter that is related 5 to the application of the senate code of ethics, the 6 joint rules governing lobbyists, or chapter 68B to 7 any person who is subject to the authority of the 8 ethics committee. Requests shall contain one or 9 more specific questions and shall relate either to 10 future conduct or be stated in the hypothetical. 11 request for an advisory opinion shall not specifically 12 name any individual or contain any other specific 13 identifying information, unless the request relates 14 to the requester's own conduct. However, any request 15 may contain information which identifies the kind 16 of individual who may be affected by the subject 17 matter of the request. Examples of this latter kind 18 of identifying information may include references 19 to conduct of a category of individuals, such as but 20 not limited to conduct of legislators, legislative 21 staff, candidates for senate, lobbyists, or clients of 22 lobbyists. 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rules 23, 24, and 25 of 24 the Senate Code of Ethics for the Eighty-ninth General 25 Assembly, as adopted during the 2021 Session in Senate 26 Resolution 1, are amended as follows: 27 23.
