A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations and related
2 statutory changes involving state government entities
3 involved with agriculture, natural resources, and
4 environmental protection.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP
GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION

Section 1. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For purposes of supporting the department, including divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs and for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
..... \$ 18,335,679

2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, the following amount is transferred to Iowa state university of science and technology, to be used for the university's midwest grape and wine industry institute:
..... \$ 288,000

3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department of management, the members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated in this section to support the department's administration, regulation, and programs.

MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS

Sec. 2. UNCLAIMED PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING WINNINGS — HORSE AND DOG RACING. There is appropriated from the moneys available under [section 99D.13](#) to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes

1 designated:

2 For purposes of supporting the department's administration
3 and enforcement of horse and dog racing law pursuant to section
4 99D.22, including for salaries, support, maintenance, and
5 miscellaneous purposes:

6 \$ 305,516

7 Sec. 3. RENEWABLE FUEL INFRASTRUCTURE FUND — MOTOR
8 FUEL INSPECTION. There is appropriated from the renewable
9 fuel infrastructure fund created in [section 159A.16](#) to the
10 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
11 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the
12 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
13 used for the purposes designated:

14 For purposes of the inspection of motor fuel, including
15 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

16 \$ 500,000

17 SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS

18 GENERAL FUND

19 Sec. 4. DAIRY REGULATION.

20 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
21 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
22 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
23 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
24 used for the purposes designated:

25 For purposes of performing functions pursuant to section
26 192.109, including conducting a survey of grade "A" milk and
27 certifying the results to the secretary of agriculture:

28 \$ 189,186

29 2. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
30 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
31 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
32 available to be used for the purposes designated until the
33 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

34 Sec. 5. LOCAL FOOD AND FARM PROGRAM.

35 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state

1 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
2 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
3 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
4 used for the purposes designated:

5 For purposes of supporting the local food and farm program
6 pursuant to [chapter 267A](#):

7 \$ 75,000

8 2. The department shall enter into a cost-sharing agreement
9 with Iowa state university of science and technology to support
10 the local food and farm program coordinator position as part of
11 the university's cooperative extension service in agriculture
12 and home economics pursuant to [chapter 267A](#).

13 3. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
14 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
15 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
16 available to be used for the purposes designated until the
17 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

18 Sec. 6. AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

19 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
20 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
21 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
22 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
23 used for the purposes designated:

24 For purposes of allocating moneys to an Iowa association
25 affiliated with a national organization which promotes
26 agricultural education providing for future farmers:

27 \$ 25,000

28 2. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
29 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
30 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
31 available to be used for the purposes designated until the
32 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

33 Sec. 7. FOREIGN ANIMAL DISEASES AFFLICTING LIVESTOCK.

34 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
35 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal

1 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the
2 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
3 used for the purposes designated:

4 For deposit in the foreign animal disease preparedness and
5 response fund created in [section 163.3B](#):
6 \$ 1,000,000

7 Sec. 8. FARMERS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

8 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
9 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
10 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
11 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
12 used for the purposes designated:

13 For purposes of supporting a program for farmers with
14 disabilities:
15 \$ 180,000

16 2. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for
17 the public purpose of providing a grant to a national nonprofit
18 organization with over 80 years of experience in assisting
19 children and adults with disabilities and special needs. The
20 moneys shall be used to support a nationally recognized program
21 that began in 1986 and has been replicated in at least 30 other
22 states, but which is not available through any other entity
23 in this state, and that provides assistance to farmers with
24 disabilities in all 99 counties to allow the farmers to remain
25 in their own homes and be gainfully engaged in farming through
26 provision of agricultural worksite and home modification
27 consultations, peer support services, services to families,
28 information and referral, and equipment loan services.

29 3. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
30 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
31 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
32 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
33 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

34 Sec. 9. LOESS HILLS DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION FUND —
35 HUNGRY CANYONS ACCOUNT

1 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
2 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
4 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
5 used for the purposes designated:

6 For deposit in the hungry canyons account of the loess hills
7 development and conservation fund created pursuant to section
8 161D.2:

9 \$ 50,000

10 2. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated to
11 the hungry canyons account as provided in subsection 1 may be
12 used for administrative costs.

13 Sec. 10. GRAIN REGULATION. There is appropriated from the
14 general fund of the state to the department of agriculture
15 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
16 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so
17 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
18 designated:

19 For the administration and enforcement of chapters 203
20 and 203C, including salaries, support, maintenance, and
21 miscellaneous purposes:

22 \$ 350,000

23 Sec. 11. VALUE ADDED AGRICULTURE GRANT PROGRAM. There
24 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
25 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
26 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the
27 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
28 used for the purposes designated:

29 For the administration and execution of a value added
30 agriculture grant program to identify, evaluate, and support
31 programs and services which add value to agriculture products,
32 enable new technology, and support marketing strategies:

33 \$ 500,000

35 GENERAL FUND

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE

Sec. 12. WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE — GENERAL.

1 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
2 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
4 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
5 used for the purposes designated:

6 For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created in
7 section 466B.45, for purposes of supporting the water quality
8 initiative administered by the division of soil conservation
9 and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, including
10 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
11 \$ 3,000,000

12 2. a. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be
13 used to support projects in subwatersheds as designated by the
14 division that are part of high-priority watersheds identified
15 by the water resources coordinating council established
16 pursuant to section 466B.3.

17 b. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used to
18 support projects in watersheds generally, including regional
19 watersheds, as designated by the division and high-priority
20 watersheds identified by the water resources coordinating
21 council established pursuant to section 466B.3.

22 3. In supporting projects in subwatersheds and watersheds
23 as provided in subsection 2, all of the following shall apply:

24 a. The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
25 practices as described in the Iowa nutrient reduction strategy
26 as defined in section 455B.171.

27 b. The division shall implement demonstration projects as
28 provided in paragraph "a" by providing for participation by
29 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in
30 farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide
31 for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a
32 legal interest in agricultural land located within the same

1 subwatershed.

2 c. The division shall implement a demonstration project on
3 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,
4 except for edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the
5 amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of
6 establishing the practice as determined by the division or
7 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing the practice,
8 whichever is less.

9 d. The demonstration projects shall be used to educate other
10 persons about the feasibility and value of establishing similar
11 water quality practices. The division shall promote field day
12 events for purposes of allowing interested persons to establish
13 water quality practices on their agricultural land.

14 e. The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
15 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
16 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the
17 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality
18 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
19 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
20 land shall be a confidential record under [section 22.7](#).

21 4. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used
22 to support education and outreach in a manner that encourages
23 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used for
24 farming to implement water quality practices, including the
25 establishment of such practices in watersheds generally, and
26 not limited to subwatersheds or high-priority watersheds.

27 5. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used
28 to contract with persons to coordinate the implementation of
29 efforts provided in this section.

30 6. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used by
31 the department to support urban soil and water conservation
32 efforts, which may include but are not limited to management
33 practices related to bioretention, landscaping, the use of
34 permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality restoration.
35 The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share basis as provided

1 in chapter 161A.

2 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
3 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in
4 subsection 1 to carry out the provisions of this section on a
5 cost-share basis in combination with other moneys available to
6 the department from a state or federal source.

7 8. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
8 this section may be used to pay for the costs of administering
9 and implementing the water quality initiative by the
10 department's division of soil conservation and water quality as
11 provided in section 466B.42 and this section.

12 DIVISION III

13 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

14 Sec. 13. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

15 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
16 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
18 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
19 purposes designated:

20 For purposes of supporting the department, including
21 divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs and for
22 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
23 \$ 11,958,058

24 2. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the
25 fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department
26 of management, the members of the joint appropriations
27 subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the
28 chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house
29 committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in
30 detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated under this
31 section to support the department's administration, regulation,
32 and programs.

33 Sec. 14. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND — REGULATION
34 AND ADVANCEMENT OF OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES.

35 1. There is appropriated from the state fish and game

1 protection fund created pursuant to section 456A.17 to the
2 department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning
3 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount,
4 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
5 designated:

6 For purposes of supporting the regulation or advancement of
7 hunting, fishing, or trapping, or the protection, propagation,
8 restoration, management, or harvest of fish or wildlife,
9 including for administration, regulation, law enforcement, and
10 programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,
11 and miscellaneous purposes:

12 \$ 46,273,501

13 2. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department may use
14 the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish and game
15 protection fund to provide for the funding of health and life
16 insurance premium payments from unused sick leave balances of
17 conservation peace officers employed in a protection occupation
18 who retire, pursuant to [section 97B.49B](#).

19 3. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department of
20 natural resources may use the unappropriated balance remaining
21 in the state fish and game protection fund for the fiscal
22 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, as is
23 necessary to fund salary adjustments for departmental employees
24 for which the general assembly has made an operating budget
25 appropriation in subsection 1.

26 Sec. 15. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — WATER
27 QUALITY. There is appropriated from the groundwater protection
28 fund created in [section 455E.11](#) to the department of natural
29 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021,
30 and ending June 30, 2022, from those moneys which are not
31 allocated pursuant to that section, the following amount, or
32 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
33 designated:

34 For purposes of supporting the department's protection
35 of the state's groundwater, including for administration,

1 regulation, and programs, and for salaries, support,
2 maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous purposes:
3 \$ 3,455,850

4 DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS

5 MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS

6 Sec. 16. SPECIAL SNOWMOBILE FUND — SNOWMOBILE
7 PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the special snowmobile
8 fund created under section 321G.7 to the department of natural
9 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and
10 ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so much thereof
11 as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

12 For purposes of administering and enforcing the state
13 snowmobile programs:
14 \$ 100,000

15 Sec. 17. UNASSIGNED REVENUE FUND — UNDERGROUND STORAGE
16 TANKS SECTION EXPENSES. There is appropriated from the
17 unassigned revenue fund administered by the Iowa comprehensive
18 petroleum underground storage tank fund board established
19 pursuant to section 455G.4 to the department of natural
20 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and
21 ending June 30, 2022, the following amount, or so much thereof
22 as is necessary, to be used for the purpose designated:

23 For purposes of paying for administration expenses of the
24 department's underground storage tanks section:
25 \$ 200,000

26 SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS

27 GENERAL FUND

28 Sec. 18. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT AND DAM SAFETY.
29 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
30 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
31 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
32 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
33 purpose designated:

34 For purposes of supporting floodplain management and dam
35 safety:

1 \$ 1,510,000

2 2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, up to
3 \$400,000 may be used by the department to acquire or install
4 stream gages for purposes of tracking and predicting flood
5 events and for compiling necessary data to improve flood
6 frequency analysis.

7 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
8 subsection 1 that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
9 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
10 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
11 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

12 Sec. 19. FORESTRY HEALTH MANAGEMENT.

13 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
14 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
15 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following
16 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
17 purposes designated:

18 For purposes of providing for forestry health management
19 programs:

20 \$ 500,000

21 2. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
22 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
23 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
24 available to be used for the purposes designated until the
25 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

26 DIVISION IV

27 IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

28 SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS

29 VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY

30 Sec. 20. VETERINARY DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY.

31 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
32 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the
33 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
34 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
35 used for the purposes designated:

1 For purposes of supporting the college of veterinary
2 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic
3 laboratory:

4 \$ 4,337,528

5 2. a. Iowa state university of science and technology
6 shall not reduce the amount that it allocates to support the
7 college of veterinary medicine from any other source due to the
8 appropriation made in this section.

9 b. Paragraph "a" does not apply to a reduction made to
10 support the college of veterinary medicine, if the same
11 percentage of reduction imposed on the college of veterinary
12 medicine is also imposed on all of Iowa state university of
13 science and technology's budget units.

14 3. If by June 30, 2022, Iowa state university of science and
15 technology fails to allocate the moneys appropriated in this
16 section to the college of veterinary medicine in accordance
17 with this section, the moneys appropriated in this section for
18 that fiscal year shall revert to the general fund of the state.

19 DIVISION V

20 STATE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

21 SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION

22 AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

23 Sec. 21. IOWA'S CENTER FOR AGRICULTURAL SAFETY AND HEALTH
24 (I-CASH).

25 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
26 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning
27 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amount,
28 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
29 designated:

30 For supporting the operations of Iowa's center for
31 agricultural safety and health, as part of the university's
32 college of public health, and in cooperation with the
33 department of agriculture and land stewardship, to anticipate,
34 recognize, and prevent occupational illness and injury among
35 members of the agricultural community:

1 \$ 128,154

2 2. As a condition of the appropriation in subsection 1,
3 the state university of Iowa shall retain the director of
4 Iowa's center for agricultural safety and health employed on
5 the effective date of this division of this Act for at least
6 the same number of hours for the fiscal year beginning July
7 1, 2021, as worked by the director during the fiscal year
8 beginning July 1, 2020.

9 3. The state university of Iowa shall not reduce the amount
10 allocated to support Iowa's center for agricultural safety from
11 any other source due to the appropriation made in this division
12 of this Act.

13 4. If by June 30, 2022, the state university of Iowa fails
14 to use the moneys appropriated in subsection 1 in accordance
15 with purposes and conditions of this section, any unencumbered
16 and unobligated moneys appropriated in subsection 1 for the
17 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022,
18 shall revert to the general fund of the state. In addition, if
19 moneys are required to be reverted pursuant to section 8.33,
20 the state university of Iowa shall transfer to the general
21 fund from any otherwise unencumbered and unobligated moneys
22 from any other general fund appropriation or from any moneys
23 available from other funding sources an amount equal to the
24 amount appropriated in subsection 1 less any amount reverted to
25 the general fund of the state pursuant to this subsection.

26 DIVISION VI

27 ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND

28 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS

29 Sec. 22. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND
30 STEWARDSHIP. There is appropriated from the environment first
31 fund created in [section 8.57A](#) to the department of agriculture
32 and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
33 2021, and ending June 30, 2022, the following amounts, or so
34 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
35 designated:

- 1 1. CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)
- 2 a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to
- 3 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of intercepting
- 4 tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss, improving water
- 5 quality, and enhancing agricultural production practices:
- 6 \$ 1,000,000
- 7 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
- 8 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
- 9 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.
- 10 c. Notwithstanding any other provision in law, the
- 11 department may use moneys appropriated in this subsection,
- 12 in combination with other appropriate environment first
- 13 fund appropriations, for cost sharing to match United States
- 14 department of agriculture, natural resources conservation
- 15 service, wetlands reserve enhancement program (WREP) funding
- 16 available to Iowa.
- 17 2. WATERSHED PROTECTION
- 18 a. For continuation of a program that provides
- 19 multiobjective resource protections for flood control, water
- 20 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:
- 21 \$ 900,000
- 22 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
- 23 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
- 24 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.
- 25 3. CONSERVATION RESERVE PROGRAM (CRP)
- 26 a. To encourage and assist farmers in enrolling in and the
- 27 implementation of the federal conservation reserve program and
- 28 to work with them to enhance their revegetation efforts to
- 29 improve water quality and habitat:
- 30 \$ 900,000
- 31 b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated
- 32 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and
- 33 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.
- 34 4. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION
- 35 a. For use by the department in providing for soil and water

1 conservation:

2 \$ 8,325,000

3 b. (1) Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "a", for
4 transfer to the loess hills development and conservation fund
5 created in section 161D.2:

6 \$ 490,000

7 (2) (a) Of the amount transferred to the loess hills
8 development and conservation fund in subparagraph (1), \$450,000
9 shall be allocated to the fund's hungry canyons account.

10 (b) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated to
11 the fund's hungry canyons account as provided in subparagraph
12 division (a) may be used for administrative costs.

13 (3) (a) Of the amount transferred to the loess hills
14 development and conservation fund in subparagraph (1), \$40,000
15 shall be allocated to the fund's loess hills alliance account.

16 (b) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys allocated to the
17 fund's loess hills alliance account as provided in subparagraph
18 division (a) may be used for administrative costs.

19 c. Of the remaining amount appropriated in paragraph "a",
20 for use by the department in providing for soil and water
21 conservation administration, the conservation of soil and
22 water resources, or the support of soil and water conservation
23 districts:

24 \$ 7,835,000

25 d. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "c" that the
26 department allocates to a soil and water conservation district,

26 enhancement and protection fund, up to \$1,000,000 may be
27 used by the department of natural resources for state park
28 maintenance and repair for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
29 2022, and ending on June 30, 2023.

30 EXPLANATION

31 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
32 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

33 GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural
34 resources by making appropriations for the fiscal years
35 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 to support related entities, including

1 the department of agriculture and land stewardship (DALs),
2 the department of natural resources (DNR), and Iowa state
3 university (ISU), and the university of Iowa (UI).

4 The bill primarily appropriates moneys to DALs and DNR.
5 The appropriations are made to support those departments for
6 administration, regulation, and support of programs. The bill
7 requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to the
8 general assembly and department of management regarding the
9 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
10 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered
11 by those departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a
12 number of sources, including the general fund of the state
13 (general fund), the state fish and game protection fund, the
14 groundwater protection fund, and the environment first fund
15 (EFF). Appropriations are made from a number of sources to
16 support the water quality initiative (WQI).

17 The bill is organized into divisions.

18 DALs — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill appropriates
19 moneys to DALs from the general fund in order to support its
20 administrative divisions, including consumer protection and
21 industry services, soil conservation, and food safety and
22 animal health. Moneys are transferred to ISU to support its
23 midwest grape and wine institute.

24 DALs — MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS — DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS.
25 The bill appropriates moneys from several sources to support a
26 number of designated purposes, including moneys derived from
27 unclaimed winnings from horse and dog races, for administration
28 and enforcement of racing regulations; and moneys credited
29 to the renewable fuel infrastructure fund, for purposes of
30 regulating motor fuel.

31 DALs — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill also
32 makes special appropriations from the general fund to DALs in
33 order to support specific purposes including milk inspection,
34 the local food and farm program, an agricultural education
35 organization, foreign animal disease preparedness, assistance

1 to farmers with disabilities, loess hills protections, grain
2 regulation, and a value added agriculture grant program.

3 DALS — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS — WATER QUALITY. The
4 bill appropriates moneys from the general fund to DALS for
5 deposit in the water quality initiative fund, to support the
6 WQI including high-priority watershed projects.

7 DNR — GENERAL FUND AND OTHER MAJOR FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS.
8 The bill makes appropriations from a number of funds to DNR in
9 order to support its administrative divisions involving natural
10 resources and environmental protection from the general fund,
11 the state fish and game protection fund, and the groundwater
12 protection fund.

13 DNR — MISCELLANEOUS FUNDS — DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS.
14 The bill appropriates moneys to DNR from a number of sources
15 to support designated purposes, including moneys deposited in
16 the special snowmobile fund to provide for administering and
17 enforcing the state snowmobile programs; and moneys deposited
18 in the unassigned revenue fund for purposes of paying for
19 administration of DNR's underground storage tanks section.

20 DNR — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill also
21 makes special appropriations from the general fund to DNR
22 in order to support specific purposes including floodplain
23 management and dam safety and forestry health management
24 programs.

25 ISU — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
26 appropriates moneys from the general fund to ISU to support the
27 operation of its veterinary diagnostic laboratory.

28 UI — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes
29 appropriations from the general fund to UI to support the
30 operations of Iowa's center for agricultural safety and health
31 which is part of UI's college of public health.

32 DALS, DNR, AND UI — EFF — GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS. The
33 bill appropriates moneys from the EFF to support a number of
34 programs administered by DALS, DNR, and UI. For DALS, the
35 moneys are appropriated to support programs involving soil

1 conservation, watershed protection and nutrient management,
2 and the loess hills development and conservation fund. For
3 DNR, moneys are appropriated to support programs involving
4 state parks, geographic information systems, water quality
5 monitoring, public water supplies, regulation of animal feeding
6 operations, air quality, and floodplain management and dam
7 safety. For UI, moneys are appropriated to support the Iowa
8 geological survey. The bill includes provisions that delay the
9 reversion of these moneys.

10 EFF — SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR WQI. The bill
11 appropriates moneys from the EFF to the water quality
12 initiative fund subject to the same conditions applicable to
13 moneys appropriated to the fund from the general fund.

14 IOWA RESOURCES ENHANCEMENT AND PROTECTION (REAP) FUND — EFF
15 APPROPRIATION IN LIEU OF GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATION. An amount
16 of moneys is appropriated from the EFF to the REAP fund instead
17 of the \$20 million otherwise required to be appropriated to
18 the fund from the general fund. Notwithstanding the standing
19 allocation from the REAP fund to the open spaces account, DNR
20 may use moneys in the account for state park maintenance and
21 repair.
