A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for procedures to verify eligibility
- 2 for unemployment benefits and including effective date
- 3 provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 96.1A, Code 2021, is amended by adding
the following new subsections:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 26A. "Integrity data hub" means a 4 centralized, electronic platform, including a successor 5 platform, maintained by the national association of state 6 workforce agencies, or a successor organization, to compare 7 and analyze benefit claims data across states for enhanced 8 detection and prevention of fraud and improper payments.

9 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 26B. *National directory of new hires"* 10 means a database, including a successor database, established 11 by the federal office of child support enforcement pursuant 12 to the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity 13 Reconciliation Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-193, for the 14 purposes of assisting state child support agencies in locating 15 parents and enforcing child support orders.

16 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 96.33 Verification of benefit 17 eligibility.

18 1. The department shall participate in and utilize the
19 integrity data hub to verify the integrity of all claims for
20 benefits in this state.

21 2. On a weekly basis, the department shall check all 22 claims for benefits submitted in the previous week against 23 the most recent list of inmates provided by the department 24 of corrections pursuant to section 904.108 to verify the 25 eligibility for benefits of each claimant.

3. On a weekly basis, the department shall check all claims for benefits against the national directory of new hires, as well as any other source of information on newly hired or rehired employees available to the department under state or deferal law, to verify the eligibility for benefits of each claimant.

32 4. The department may enter into an agreement pursuant to 33 chapter 28E or execute a memorandum of understanding with other 34 state and federal agencies in order to acquire or gain access 35 to information required to be shared between agencies pursuant

5. If the department receives information concerning a claimant that indicates a change in the claimant's circumstances that may affect the claimant's eligibility for benefits, the department shall review the claimant's eligibility.

7 Sec. 3. Section 904.108, Code 2021, is amended by adding the 8 following new subsection:

<u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 7. The director shall provide the
department of workforce development access to a list of inmates
confined in institutions under the department's jurisdiction on
a weekly basis for purposes of compliance with section 96.33.
Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect January 1,
2022.

18 This bill provides for procedures for the department of 19 workforce development to verify eligibility for unemployment 20 benefits.

The bill requires the department to participate in and utilize the integrity data hub, as defined in the bill, to verify the integrity of all claims for benefits in Iowa. The bill requires the department to check, on a weekly basis, all claims for benefits submitted in the previous week against the most recent list of inmates provided by the department of corrections pursuant to the bill to verify the eligibility for benefits of each claimant.

The bill requires the department to check, on a weekly basis, all claims for benefits against the national directory of new hires, as defined in the bill, as well as any other source of information on newly hired or rehired employees available to the department under state or federal law, to verify the eligibility for benefits of each claimant.

35 The bill authorizes the department to enter into an

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1 agreement pursuant to Code chapter 28E or execute a memorandum 2 of understanding with other state and federal agencies in order 3 to acquire or gain access to information required to be shared 4 between agencies pursuant to the bill.

5 If the department receives information concerning a claimant 6 that indicates a change in the claimant's circumstances that 7 may affect the claimant's eligibility for benefits, the bill 8 requires the department to review the claimant's eligibility. 9 The bill takes effect January 1, 2022.

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
