HOUSE FILE 15 BY KRESSIG

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing the pathways to education and employment
- 2 reentry program to be administered by the community
- 3 colleges division of the department of education and making 4 appropriations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 260C.51 Pathways to education and 2 employment reentry program.

3 1. The pathways to education and employment reentry program 4 is established to be administered by the community colleges 5 division of the department of education to reduce recidivism 6 and further develop the workforce in this state.

7 2. The community colleges division shall, through at 8 least eight community colleges, provide education related to 9 educational and employment opportunities in the community 10 to individuals exiting a correctional institution under the 11 control of the Iowa department of corrections or a city or 12 county jail. The pathways to education and employment reentry 13 program must provide all of the following services:

14 *a.* Case management.

15 b. Educational course information and counseling.

16 c. Career exploration.

17 *d.* Job training.

18 e. Job placement.

19 f. Assistance with creating a curriculum vitae.

20 g. Assistance with completing job applications.

21 h. Employability skills training.

22 *i.* Job referrals.

23 j. Notification of hiring events.

3. The community colleges division shall coordinate services with the Iowa department of corrections as well as other federal, state, local, and nonprofit entities to provide clothing, mental health services, probation services, travel assistance, food assistance, and gang-prevention programs of individuals exiting a correctional institution under the control of the Iowa department of corrections or a city or county jail.

32 4. The pathways to education and employment reentry program 33 shall work with nonprofit entities in developing a strategy for 34 attracting additional financial resources for the program from 35 other sources, including federal, state, local, and private

4 5. A pathways to education and employment reentry program 5 fund is created in the state treasury as a separate fund 6 under the control of the department of education. All moneys 7 deposited or paid into the pathways to education and employment 8 reentry program fund are appropriated and made available to 9 the department to be used for meeting the requirements of this 10 section. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys deposited in 11 the pathways to education and employment reentry program fund 12 shall not revert to any fund of the state at the end of any 13 fiscal year but shall remain in the pathways to education and 14 employment reentry program fund and be continuously available 15 under the pathways to education and employment reentry program. 16 The state board of education may adopt rules pursuant to 6. 17 chapter 17A to administer this section.

18 Sec. 2. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION — PATHWAYS TO EDUCATION 19 AND EMPLOYMENT REENTRY PROGRAM. There is appropriated from the 20 general fund of the state to the department of education for 21 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 22 2024, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, 23 to be used for the purposes designated:

For the pathways to education and employment reentry program setablished pursuant to section 260C.51, including salaries, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

This bill establishes the pathways to education and employment reentry program to be administered by the community colleges division of the department of education.

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1 The bill requires the division, through at least eight 2 community colleges, to provide education related to educational 3 and employment opportunities in the community to individuals 4 exiting a correctional institution under the control of the 5 Iowa department of corrections or a city or county jail. The 6 bill establishes the specific services the program is to 7 provide.

8 The bill requires the division to coordinate services with 9 the Iowa department of corrections as well as other federal, 10 state, local, and nonprofit entities to provide certain 11 specified services to individuals exiting a correctional 12 institution under the control of the Iowa department of 13 corrections or a city or county jail. The bill also requires 14 the division to develop a strategy for attracting additional 15 financial resources.

16 The bill establishes a pathways to education and employment 17 reentry program fund in the state treasury as a separate 18 fund under the control of the department of education. The 19 bill appropriates \$4.2 million from the general fund to the 20 department of education for FY 2023-2024 for purposes of the 21 program.

22 The bill authorizes the state board of education to adopt 23 rules to administer the program.

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
