## A BILL FOR

An Act authorizing the parent or guardian of a student enrolled
in a school district to enroll the student in another
attendance center within the same school district in certain
specified circumstances and including effective date
provisions.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 279.77 Intra-district enrollment. 2 1. A parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a school 3 district may enroll the student in another attendance center 4 within the same school district that offers classes at the 5 student's grade level in the manner provided in this section 6 if the board of directors of the school district reasonably 7 believes that any employee or contractor of the school 8 district, or any student enrolled in the school district, has 9 committed any crime specified under chapter 708 or 709 against 10 the student.

11 2. *a.* A parent or guardian shall send notification to the 12 board of directors of the school district, on forms prescribed 13 by the department of education, that the parent or guardian 14 intends to enroll the student in another attendance center 15 within the same school district that offers classes at the 16 student's grade level.

b. The board of directors of the school district shall enroll the student in another attendance center within the same school district unless the attendance center has insufficient classroom space for the student. The board of directors of a school district may adopt a policy granting the superintendent of the school district authority to approve requests submitted pursuant to this section. If the request is granted, the board of directors of the school district shall transmit a copy of the form to the parent or guardian within five days after board action. The parent or guardian may withdraw the request at any time prior to the board of directors' action on the request.

30 c. Each school district shall adopt a policy that defines 31 the term "*insufficient classroom space*" for that district. 32 3. A request under this section is for a period of not 33 less than one year. A student who attends school in another 34 attendance center pursuant to this section may return to the 35 original attendance center and enroll at any time, once the

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1 parent or guardian has notified the board of directors of 2 the school district in writing of the decision to enroll the 3 student in the original attendance center.

4 4. If a request filed under this section is for a student 5 requiring special education under chapter 256B, the request to 6 transfer to another attendance center shall only be granted if 7 all of the following conditions are met:

8 a. The attendance center maintains a special education 9 instructional program that is appropriate to meet the student's 10 educational needs and the enrollment of the student in the 11 attendance center would not cause the size of the class or 12 caseload in that special education instructional program in the 13 attendance center to exceed the maximum class size or caseload 14 established pursuant to rules adopted by the state board of 15 education.

16 *b*. If the student would be assigned to a general education 17 class, there is sufficient classroom space for the general 18 education class to which the student would be assigned. 19 5. If a student, for whom a request to transfer has been 20 filed with the board of directors of a school district, has 21 been suspended or expelled in the school district, the student 22 shall not be permitted to transfer until the student has been 23 reinstated. Once the student has been reinstated, however, the 24 student shall be permitted to transfer in the same manner as if 25 the student had not been suspended or expelled. If a student, 26 for whom a request to transfer has been filed with the board 27 of directors of a school district, is expelled in the school 28 district, the student shall be permitted to transfer under this 29 section if the student applies for and is reinstated. However, 30 if the student applies for reinstatement but is not reinstated 31 in the school district, the board of directors of the school 32 district may deny the request to transfer. The decision of 33 the board of directors of the school district is not subject 34 to appeal.

35 6. A student who is enrolled in another attendance center

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eligible to participate immediately in varsity interscholastic
athletic contests and athletic competitions as a member of a
team from the receiving attendance center.

5 7. This section shall not be construed to prohibit a 6 school district from allowing the parent or guardian of a 7 student enrolled in the school district to enroll the student 8 in another attendance center within the same school district 9 that offers classes at the student's grade level pursuant to a 10 policy adopted by the board of directors of the school district 11 that allows for transfers for reasons in addition to those 12 allowed pursuant to this section.

13 8. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant14 to chapter 17A to administer this section.

15 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate 16 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

EXPLANATION

18 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 19 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

20 This bill authorizes the parent or guardian of a student 21 enrolled in a school district to enroll the student in another 22 attendance center within the same school district in certain 23 specified circumstances.

The bill enacts new Code section 279.77, which provides that a parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a school district may enroll the student in another attendance center within the same school district that offers classes at the student's grade level in the manner provided in new Code section 279.77 if the board of directors of the school district reasonably believes that any employee or contractor of the school district, or any student enrolled in the school district, has committed any crime specified under Code chapter 708 (assault) or 709 (sexual abuse) against the student.

The bill requires a parent or guardian to send a request to the board of directors indicating that the parent or

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1 guardian intends to enroll the student in another attendance 2 center within the same school district. Additionally, the 3 bill requires the board of directors to enroll the student 4 in another attendance center within the same school district 5 unless the attendance center has insufficient classroom space 6 for the student. The bill authorizes the board of directors 7 to adopt a policy granting the superintendent the authority 8 to approve these requests. The bill requires the board 9 of directors to transmit a copy of the form to the parent 10 or guardian within five days after board action. The bill 11 authorizes the parent or guardian to withdraw the request 12 at any time prior to the board of directors' action on the 13 request.

14 The bill provides that these requests are for a period of 15 not less than one year. The bill also provides that a student 16 who attends school in another attendance center pursuant to 17 new Code section 279.77 may return to the original attendance 18 center and enroll at any time, once the parent or guardian has 19 notified the board of directors of the decision to enroll the 20 student in the original attendance center.

The bill provides that, if a request filed pursuant to new Code section 279.77 is for a student requiring special education, the request to transfer to another attendance center shall only be granted if the attendance center maintains a special education instructional program that is appropriate to meet the student's educational needs and the enrollment of the rstudent in the attendance center would not cause the size of the class or caseload in that special education instructional program in the attendance center to exceed the maximum class size or caseload established pursuant to rules adopted by the state board of education, and, if the student would be assigned a space for the general education class to which the student would be assigned.

35 The bill provides that if a student for whom a request to

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1 transfer has been filed with the board of directors has been 2 suspended or expelled in the school district, the student 3 shall not be permitted to transfer until the student has been 4 reinstated. The bill also provides that, once the student 5 has been reinstated, the student is permitted to transfer in 6 the same manner as if the student had not been suspended or 7 expelled. The bill establishes that if a student for whom a 8 request to transfer has been filed with the board of directors 9 is expelled, the student shall be permitted to transfer if the 10 student applies for and is reinstated. The bill provides that 11 if the student applies for reinstatement but is not reinstated 12 in the school district, the board of directors may deny the 13 request to transfer.

14 The bill provides that a student who is enrolled in 15 another attendance center within the same school district 16 pursuant to new Code section 279.77 is eligible to participate 17 immediately in varsity interscholastic athletic contests and 18 athletic competitions as a member of a team from the receiving 19 attendance center.

The bill prohibits new Code section 279.77 from being construed to prohibit a school district from allowing the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in the school district to enroll the student in another attendance center within the same school district that offers classes at the student's grade level pursuant to a policy adopted by the board of directors of the school district that allows for transfers for reasons in addition to those allowed pursuant to the bill.

The bill requires the state board of education to adopt rules of administer the new Code section. The bill takes effect upon enactment.

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
