A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the referral of a patient by a physical
- 2 therapist for diagnostic imaging.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **148A.5A** Referral for diagnostic 2 imaging.
- Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a
 physical therapist, as part of the physical therapy patient
- 5 evaluation and treatment as specified under section 148A.1, may
- 6 order diagnostic imaging to be performed and interpreted by
- 7 other appropriately licensed health care professionals.
- Unless a patient does not have a primary care provider,
- 9 a physical therapist who orders diagnostic imaging shall
- 10 report the results of the diagnostic imaging to the patient's
- 11 designated primary care provider within seven days following
- 12 receipt of the results to ensure patient coordination of care.
- 13 3. The board of physical and occupational therapy shall
- 14 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A to administer this section
- 15 and to ensure patient coordination of care.
- 4. For the purposes of this section, "diagnostic imaging"
- 17 means medical imaging technologies that are used to view the
- 18 human body in order to diagnose, monitor, or treat medical
- 19 conditions. "Diagnostic imaging" includes but is not limited to
- 20 ultrasound imaging, magnetic resonance imaging, x-ray imaging,
- 21 and computed tomography.
- 22 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 25 This bill authorizes a physical therapist, as part of the
- 26 physical therapy patient evaluation and treatment described
- 27 in the definition of and authorization for physical therapy,
- 28 to order diagnostic imaging to be performed and interpreted
- 29 by other appropriately licensed health care professionals.
- 30 Unless a patient does not have a primary care provider, a
- 31 physical therapist who orders diagnostic imaging shall report
- 32 the diagnostic imaging results to the patient's designated
- 33 primary care provider within seven days following receipt of
- 34 the results to ensure patient coordination of care. The bill
- 35 directs the board of physical and occupational therapy to adopt

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- 1 administrative rules to administer the bill and to ensure
- 2 patient coordination of care. Under the bill, "diagnostic
- 3 imaging" means medical imaging technologies that are used to
- 4 view the human body in order to diagnose, monitor, or treat
- 5 medical conditions. "Diagnostic imaging" includes but is not
- 6 limited to ultrasound imaging, magnetic resonance imaging,
- 7 x-ray imaging, and computed tomography.
