## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to signals at certain railroad grade crossings.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 321.342, subsection 2, Code 2023, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. The department, city, or county shall be required to
- $4\,$  post the standard sign as prescribed by the manual on uniform
- 5 traffic-control devices adopted by the department pursuant to
- 6 section 321.252 in advance of each railroad grade crossing to
- 7 warn the motorist that the motorist is approaching a railroad
- 8 grade crossing. Upon properly posting all railroad grade
- 9 crossings within its jurisdiction, placing crossing signals
- 10 if required in accordance with section 327G.15, and upon
- 11 implementing the standards established in accordance with
- 12 section 307.26, the department, city, or county shall not have
- 13 any other affirmative duty to warn a motor vehicle operator
- 14 approaching or at the railroad grade crossing.
- 15 Sec. 2. Section 327G.15, subsection 1, Code 2023, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 l. Wherever a railway track crosses or shall hereafter cross
- 18 a highway, street or alley, the railway corporation owning such
- 19 track and the The department, in the case of primary highways
- 20 crossed by railway tracks, the board of supervisors of the
- 21 county in which such a crossing is located, in the case of
- 22 secondary roads crossed by railway tracks, or the city council
- 23 of the city in which a crossing is located, in the case of
- 24 streets and alleys <del>located</del> crossed by railway tracks within
- 25 a city, may agree with the railway corporation owning such
- 26 tracks upon the location, manner, vacation, physical structure,
- 27 characteristics, and maintenance of the crossing and flasher
- 28 lights crossing signals or gate arm signals at the crossing
- 29 and allocation of costs thereof. The department shall become
- 30 a party to the agreement if grade crossing safety funds fund
- 31 moneys are to be used. Up to seventy-five percent of the
- 32 maintenance cost of flasher lights crossing signals or gate arm
- 33 signals at the crossing and an unlimited portion of the cost of
- 34 installing flasher lights crossing signals or gate arm signals
- 35 at the crossing may be paid from the grade crossing safety

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1 fund.

- 2 Sec. 3. Section 327G.15, Code 2023, is amended by adding the 3 following new subsections:
- 4 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. A crossing signal shall be placed by
- 5 the appropriate entity at every railroad grade crossing where a
- 6 railway track crosses a paved highway, street, or alley. The
- 7 crossing signal must be placed so the signal is visible on
- 8 approach to the crossing from such an intersected roadway.
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. For purposes of this section, "crossing
- 10 signal" means any device, whether manually, electrically,
- 11 or mechanically operated, capable of displaying a flashing
- 12 red light, that is placed at a railroad grade crossing and
- 13 programmed to flash a red light to warn of the immediate
- 14 approach of a train or railroad track equipment.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 18 Under current law, wherever a railway track crosses a
- 19 highway, street, or alley, the railway corporation owning such
- 20 track and the department of transportation (DOT), in the case
- 21 of primary highways, the board of supervisors of the county in
- 22 which such crossing is located, in the case of secondary roads,
- 23 or the council of the city, in the case of streets and alleys
- 24 located within a city, may agree upon the location, manner,
- 25 vacation, physical structure, characteristics, and maintenance
- 26 of the crossing and flasher lights or gate arm signals at the
- 27 crossing and allocation of costs thereof. The DOT, city, or
- 28 county, as applicable, is required to post the standard sign
- 29 as prescribed by the manual on uniform traffic-control devices
- 30 adopted by the DOT in advance of each railroad grade crossing
- 31 to warn a motorist that the motorist is approaching a railroad
- 32 grade crossing. Upon properly posting all railroad grade
- 33 crossings within its jurisdiction and implementing standards
- 34 established by the DOT for modal programs and activities, the
- 35 DOT, city, or county, as applicable, does not have any other

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- 1 affirmative duty to warn a motor vehicle operator approaching
- 2 or at the railroad grade crossing.
- 3 This bill requires railroad grade crossings that cross a
- 4 paved highway, street, or alley to have a crossing signal
- 5 installed by the appropriate entity. The signal must be placed
- 6 so it is visible on approach to the crossing from such an
- 7 intersected roadway. The bill defines "crossing signal" as
- 8 any device, whether manually, electrically, or mechanically
- 9 operated, capable of displaying a flashing red light, that is
- 10 placed at a railway grade crossing and programmed to flash a
- 11 red light when a train or railroad track equipment approaches
- 12 the crossing.
- 13 Under current law, the DOT is required to become a party to
- 14 a crossing agreement if grade crossing safety fund moneys are
- 15 to be used, and may contribute from the grade crossing safety
- 16 fund up to 75 percent of the maintenance cost and an unlimited
- 17 portion of the installation cost for flasher lights and gate
- 18 arm signals. The bill extends this funding authorization to
- 19 installing and maintaining official traffic control signals
- 20 required under the bill.
- 21 In accordance with current law, maintenance of flasher
- 22 lights or gate signals installed or ordered to be installed
- 23 before July 1, 1973, are assumed wholly by the railroad
- 24 corporation owning the track. Such flasher lights may not meet
- 25 the requirements relating to crossing signals and necessary
- 26 locations for signals under the bill.
- 27 The bill makes conforming changes to Code section 327G.15.
