A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to programs that address food insecurity,
- 2 making appropriations, and including effective date and
- 3 retroactive applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. PARTICIPATION IN SUMMER ELECTRONIC BENEFITS TRANSFER (EBT) FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM — APPROPRIATION. The department of health and human services, in coordination with the department of education, shall do all of the following: 1. Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, submit a letter of intent to the United States secretary of agriculture to apply for and participate in the summer EBT for children program established as a permanent program under the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, 42 U.S.C. §1762, during summer 2024.

11 2. Coordinate with the United States department of 12 agriculture food and nutrition service to develop a successful 13 management and administration plan for the summer EBT for 14 children program, and submit the plan to the United States 15 secretary of agriculture by February 15, 2024.

16 Sec. 2. SUMMER ELECTRONIC BENEFITS TRANSFER (EBT) FOR 17 CHILDREN PROGRAM — HEALTHIEST STATE INITIATIVE COORDINATION 18 — APPROPRIATIONS.

19 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 20 to the department of health and human services for the fiscal 21 year beginning July 1, 2023, the following amount, or so much 22 thereof as is necessary, to be used for administration of the 23 summer EBT for children program as provided under the federal 24 Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, during summer 2024: 25 \$ 2,900,000

26 a. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, at least 27 \$700,000 shall be used by the department of health and human 28 services to contract with the Iowa institute of public health 29 research and policy at the university of Iowa college of public 30 health to evaluate the nutritional and other health impacts of 31 the summer EBT for children program.

32 b. Any moneys appropriated in this subsection that remain 33 unexpended or unobligated at the end of the fiscal year 34 beginning July 1, 2023, shall not revert but shall remain 35 available for use in the succeeding fiscal year for the

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1 purposes authorized in this subsection.

2 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 3 to the department of health and human services for the fiscal 4 year beginning July 1, 2023, the following amount, or so much 5 thereof as is necessary, to support the double up food bucks 6 program administered by the Iowa healthiest state initiative 7 to coordinate the double up food bucks program with the summer 8 EBT for children program: 9 \$ 2,800,000 10 a. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to 11 10 percent may be used for promotion of the programs and for 12 public education. b. Any moneys appropriated under this subsection that 13 14 remain unexpended or unobligated at the end of the fiscal 15 year beginning July 1, 2023, shall not revert but shall 16 remain available for use in the succeeding fiscal year for the 17 purposes authorized in this subsection. 18 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate 19 importance, takes effect upon enactment. 20 Sec. 4. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. This Act applies 21 retroactively to July 1, 2023. 22 EXPLANATION 23 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 24 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 25 This bill relates to programs that address food insecurity. 26 The bill requires the department of health and human 27 services (HHS), in coordination with the department of 28 education, to immediately upon the effective date of the bill 29 submit a letter of intent to apply for and participate in the 30 summer electronic benefits transfer (EBT) for children program 31 made permanent by the federal Consolidated Appropriations 32 Act, 2023, administered by the United States department of 33 agriculture food and nutrition service (USDA) during summer 34 2024, to coordinate with the USDA to develop a successful 35 management and administration plan for the summer EBT program

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1 for children, and to submit the plan to the USDA by February 2 15, 2024.

3 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of 4 the state to HHS for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be used for 5 administration of the summer EBT for children program during 6 summer 2024. The bill authorizes the use of a portion of the 7 funds appropriated for HHS to contract with the Iowa institute 8 of public health research and policy at the university of Iowa 9 college of public health to evaluate the nutritional and other 10 health impacts of the summer EBT for children program.

11 The bill also appropriates moneys from the general fund 12 of the state to HHS for fiscal year 2023-2024 to support 13 the double up food bucks program administered by the Iowa 14 healthiest state initiative to coordinate the double up food 15 bucks program with the summer EBT for children program. The 16 bill authorizes the use of up to 10 percent of the amount 17 appropriated for promotion of the programs and public 18 education.

19 The bill takes effect upon enactment and is retroactively 20 applicable to July 1, 2023.

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
