- 1 An Act relating to workers' compensation claims for mental
- 2 injuries.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 85.17 Mental injury.
- In order for an injury of a purely mental nature that is
- 3 not associated with any physical injury to be compensable under
- 4 this chapter, the employee claiming the injury must establish
- 5 that the injury was caused by workplace stress of greater
- 6 magnitude than the day-to-day mental stresses experienced
- 7 by other employees employed in the same or similar jobs,
- 8 regardless of whether such employees are employed by the same
- 9 employer.
- 2. Subsection 1 applies in addition to all other
- 11 requirements of this chapter. Subsection 1 does not apply
- 12 to an employee who is an emergency medical care provider
- 13 as defined in section 147A.1, a fire fighter, or a peace
- 14 officer as defined in section 801.4 if a court determines
- 15 that the employee's workplace stress was due to extreme
- 16 circumstances related to the employee's employment in one of
- 17 these occupations.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 21 This bill establishes a requirement for an employee claiming
- 22 workers' compensation for an injury of a purely mental nature
- 23 that is not associated with any physical injury. In order for
- 24 such an injury to be compensable, the employee claiming the
- 25 injury must establish that the injury was caused by workplace
- 26 stress of greater magnitude than the day-to-day mental stresses
- 27 experienced by other employees employed in the same or similar
- 28 jobs, regardless of whether such employees are employed by the
- 29 same employer.
- 30 This requirement applies in addition to all other
- 31 requirements for workers' compensation claims under Code
- 32 chapter 85. The requirement does not apply to an employee
- 33 who is an emergency medical care provider, a fire fighter,
- 34 or a peace officer if a court determines that the employee's
- 35 workplace stress was due to extreme circumstances related to
