## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to administrators employed by school districts,
- 2 including requiring administrators to provide instruction to
- 3 students and modifying the responsibilities of the board of
- 4 educational examiners.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 256.146, subsection 13, Code 2024, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. f. The board may suspend the license of an
- 4 administrator upon the board's finding by a preponderance of
- 5 the evidence that the administrator violated section 279.84.
- 6 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **279.84 Administrators** teaching
- 7 requirements.
- Each school district containing two or more high schools,
- 9 three or more middle schools, or four or more elementary
- 10 schools shall do all of the following:
- 11 a. Require all administrators who are employed by the
- 12 school district as a superintendent, assistant superintendent,
- 13 or school district department head to teach at least one
- 14 one-semester class, or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at
- 15 least once every three years.
- 16 b. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 17 district as a high school principal or middle school principal
- 18 to teach at least three one-semester classes, or the trimester
- 19 or quarter equivalent, at least once every three years.
- 20 c. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 21 district as an elementary school principal to teach at least
- 22 two subject areas in an elementary school class for at least
- 23 one semester, or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at least
- 24 once every three years.
- 25 d. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 26 district as a high school or middle school assistant principal,
- 27 director of athletics, dean of students, or any similar
- 28 position to teach at least three one-semester classes, or the
- 29 trimester or quarter equivalent, at least once every two years.
- 30 e. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 31 district as an elementary school assistant principal, dean of
- 32 students, or any similar position to teach at least two subject
- 33 areas in an elementary school class for at least one semester,
- 34 or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at least once every two
- 35 years.

- Each school district containing one high school, at
- 2 least one but not more than two middle schools, or at least one
- 3 but not more than three elementary schools shall do all of the
- 4 following:
- 5 a. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 6 district as a superintendent or assistant superintendent to
- 7 teach at least one one-semester class, or the trimester or
- 8 quarter equivalent, at least once every three years.
- 9 b. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 10 district as an administrator in a high school or middle school,
- ll and who are not described in paragraph "a", "c", "d", or "e", to
- 12 teach at least three one-semester classes, or the trimester or
- 13 quarter equivalent, at least once every three years.
- 14 c. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 15 district as an administrator in an elementary school, and who
- 16 are not described in paragraph "a", "b", "d", or "e", to teach
- 17 at least two subject areas in an elementary school class for at
- 18 least one semester, or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at
- 19 least once every three years.
- 20 d. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 21 district as a high school or middle school assistant principal,
- 22 director of athletics, dean of students, or any similar
- 23 position to teach at least two one-semester classes, or the
- 24 trimester or quarter equivalent, at least once every two years.
- 25 e. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 26 district as an elementary school assistant principal, dean of
- 27 students, or any similar position to teach at least two subject
- 28 areas in an elementary school class for at least one semester,
- 29 or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at least once every two
- 30 years.
- 31 3. Each school district containing one middle school, one
- 32 elementary school, or no high schools shall do all of the
- 33 following:
- 34 a. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 35 district as a superintendent or assistant superintendent to

- 1 teach at least one one-semester class, or the trimester or
- 2 quarter equivalent, at least once every three years.
- 3 b. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 4 district as an administrator in a high school or middle school,
- 5 and who are not described in paragraph "a" or "c", to teach at
- 6 least three one-semester classes, or the trimester or quarter
- 7 equivalent, at least once every three years.
- 8 c. Require all administrators who are employed by the school
- 9 district as an administrator in an elementary school, and who
- 10 are not described in paragraph "a" or "b", to teach at least two
- 11 subject areas in an elementary school class for at least one
- 12 semester, or the trimester or quarter equivalent, at least once
- 13 every three years.
- 4. If more than one of subsections 1, 2, and 3 apply
- 15 to a school district, the school district shall meet the
- 16 requirements of subsection 2 in order to comply with this
- 17 section.
- 18 5. The superintendent of each school district shall ensure
- 19 that administrators employed by the school district comply
- 20 with this section. The superintendent of each school district
- 21 shall report to the department of education on an annual basis
- 22 regarding the school district's compliance with this section.
- 23 6. If the board of directors of a school district finds
- 24 that an administrator employed by the school district failed to
- 25 comply with this section, the administrator shall be subject
- 26 to a hearing conducted by the board of educational examiners
- 27 pursuant to section 256.146, subsection 13, which may result
- 28 in disciplinary action, including the suspension of the
- 29 administrator's license.
- 30 7. An administrator providing instruction pursuant to
- 31 this section shall hold a valid license issued by the board
- 32 of educational examiners with an endorsement for the type of
- 33 instruction provided by the administrator.
- 34 8. A school district that employs an administrator
- 35 who is jointly employed by another school district as an

- 1 administrator under section 280.15 shall be in compliance
- 2 with the requirements of this section if the school district
- 3 ensures that the administrator complies with the applicable
- 4 requirements of this section for at least one of the school
- 5 districts that employ the administrator.
- 9. For purposes of this section, "administrator" means the same as defined in section 256.145.
- 8 EXPLANATION
- 9 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 11 This bill relates to administrators employed by school
- 12 districts, including requiring administrators to provide
- 13 instruction to students and modifying the responsibilities of
- 14 the board of educational examiners (BOEE).
- 15 The bill provides that school districts containing two or
- 16 more high schools, three or more middle schools, or four or
- 17 more elementary schools shall require certain administrators
- 18 to provide instruction to students. The bill requires that
- 19 all administrators employed as superintendents, assistant
- 20 superintendents, or school district department heads teach at
- 21 least one one-semester class at least once every three years.
- 22 The bill also requires that all administrators employed as
- 23 high school principals or middle school principals teach at
- 24 least three one-semester classes at least once every three
- 25 years. Additionally, the bill requires that all administrators
- 26 employed as elementary school principals teach at least two
- 27 subject areas in an elementary school class for at least one
- 28 semester at least once every three years. The bill also
- 29 requires that all administrators employed as high school or
- 30 middle school assistant principals, directors of athletics,
- 31 deans of students, or any similar positions teach at least
- 32 three one-semester classes at least once every two years.
- 33 Additionally, the bill requires that all administrators
- 34 employed as elementary school assistant principals, deans of
- 35 students, or any similar positions teach at least two subject

1 areas in an elementary school class for at least one semester 2 at least once every two years. The bill provides that school districts containing one high 4 school, at least one but not more than two middle schools, 5 or at least one but not more than three elementary schools 6 shall require certain administrators to provide instruction 7 to students. The bill requires that all administrators 8 employed as superintendents or assistant superintendents teach 9 at least one one-semester class at least once every three 10 years. Additionally, the bill requires that all administrators 11 employed as high school or middle school assistant principals, 12 directors of athletics, deans of students, or any similar 13 positions teach at least two one-semester classes at least 14 once every two years. The bill also requires that all 15 administrators employed as elementary school assistant 16 principals, deans of students, or any similar positions teach 17 at least two subject areas in an elementary school class 18 for at least one semester at least once every two years. 19 Additionally, the bill requires other administrators in a high 20 school or middle school to teach at least three one-semester 21 classes at least once every three years. The bill also 22 requires other administrators in an elementary school to teach 23 at least two subject areas in an elementary school class for at 24 least one semester at least once every three years. The bill 25 applies these same requirements to each school district that 26 fits into two or more of the categories of school districts 27 described in the bill. The bill provides that school districts containing one 28 29 middle school, one elementary school, or no high schools shall 30 require certain administrators to provide instruction to 31 students. The bill requires that all administrators employed 32 as superintendents or assistant superintendents teach at 33 least one one-semester class at least once every three years. 34 Additionally, the bill requires other administrators in a high

35 school or middle school to teach at least three one-semester

- 1 classes at least once every three years. The bill also
- 2 requires other administrators in an elementary school to teach
- 3 at least two subject areas in an elementary school class for at
- 4 least one semester at least once every three years.
- 5 The bill provides that the superintendent of each school
- 6 district shall ensure that administrators employed by the
- 7 school district comply with the bill's provisions. The bill
- 8 requires the superintendent to report to the department of
- 9 education on an annual basis regarding the school district's
- 10 compliance with the bill's provisions.
- 11 The bill provides that if the board of directors of a school
- 12 district finds that an administrator failed to comply with the
- 13 bill's provisions, the administrator shall be subject to a
- 14 hearing conducted by the BOEE that may result in disciplinary
- 15 action, including the suspension of the administrator's
- 16 license.
- 17 The bill requires that an administrator providing
- 18 instruction pursuant to the bill's provisions hold a valid
- 19 license issued by the BOEE with an endorsement for the type of
- 20 instruction provided by the administrator.
- 21 The bill provides that jointly employed administrators are
- 22 only required to comply with the bill's provisions for one of
- 23 the school districts that employ the administrator.
- 24 The bill defines "administrator" as a person who is licensed
- 25 to coordinate, supervise, or direct an educational program or
- 26 the activities of other practitioners.
