A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to ignition interlock device requirements
- 2 following a violation detected by a device.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 321J.20, Code 2024, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 6A. a. Notwithstanding section 321J.17 or
- 4 any other provision of this chapter to the contrary regarding
- 5 the length of time a person is required to maintain an ignition
- 6 interlock device on vehicles owned or operated by the person,
- 7 if an ignition interlock device detects a violation within
- 8 thirty days of the date the device would otherwise no longer be
- 9 required to be installed on vehicles owned or operated by the
- 10 person, as applicable, the department shall extend the period a
- ll person is required to maintain an ignition interlock device for
- 12 an additional thirty days. The person is responsible for any
- 13 additional fees associated with the extension.
- 14 b. The provider of an ignition interlock device that detects
- 15 a violation under paragraph "a" shall report the violation to
- 16 the department prior to the date the device would otherwise
- 17 no longer be required to be installed on vehicles owned or
- 18 operated by the person, as applicable.
- 19 c. Nothing in this subsection shall limit the number
- 20 of subsequent extensions a person may receive following a
- 21 violation detected by an ignition interlock device.
- 22 d. For purposes of this subsection, "violation" means a
- 23 detection of a level of alcohol concentration beyond which
- 24 an ignition interlock device will not allow operation of the
- 25 motor vehicle in which it is installed, established under
- 26 rules adopted by the commissioner of public safety pursuant to
- 27 section 321J.4.
- 28 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 31 Under current law, a person whose driver's license is
- 32 revoked under Code chapter 321J (operating while intoxicated
- 33 (OWI)) must install an ignition interlock device (IID) before
- 34 the department of transportation (DOT) can issue a temporary
- 35 restricted license, or reinstate a person's unrestricted

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- 1 driver's license if the person has one or more previous OWI 2 violations.
- 3 This bill requires an IID provider to report a violation,
- 4 as described in the bill, detected by the IID to the DOT if
- 5 the violation occurs within the last 30 days the person would
- 6 otherwise be required to maintain an IID on vehicles owned
- 7 or operated by the person. The DOT must then extend the
- 8 requirement for the person to maintain an IID for an additional
- 9 30 days. The person is responsible for any additional fees
- 10 associated with the extension. An IID provider must report a
- 11 violation to the DOT prior to the date the IID would otherwise
- 12 no longer be required to be installed on vehicles owned or
- 13 operated by the person.
- 14 The bill does not limit the number of subsequent extensions a
- 15 person may receive following a violation detected by an IID.
