A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to criminal history background checks for the
- 2 sale or transfer of firearms, providing penalties, and
- 3 including applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 724.33 Sale or transfer of firearms
- 2 criminal history background check.
- 3 1. Unless otherwise authorized by this chapter or federal
- 4 law, a person shall not sell or transfer a firearm to another
- 5 person without receiving verification from a licensed firearms
- 6 dealer that information on the prospective purchaser or
- 7 transferee has been submitted to the department of public
- 8 safety for a criminal history background check and that a
- 9 determination has been received by the department of public
- 10 safety that the prospective purchaser or transferee is not
- ll prohibited under either state or federal law from possessing a
- 12 firearm. A criminal history background check conducted under
- 13 this section shall include an inquiry of the national instant
- 14 criminal background check system maintained by the federal
- 15 bureau of investigation.
- 16 2. a. Except as provided in paragraph "b", a person who
- 17 sells or transfers a firearm in violation of this section is
- 18 guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor.
- 19 b. A person does not violate this section under any of the
- 20 following circumstances:
- 21 (1) A sale or transfer of a firearm to a firearm buyback
- 22 program sponsored by a law enforcement agency.
- 23 (2) A transfer of a firearm to another person during an
- 24 act of justified self-defense or justified defense of another
- 25 person, provided that the possession after the transfer
- 26 lasts no longer than is immediately necessary to resolve the
- 27 emergency.
- 28 (3) A transfer of a firearm between family members.
- 29 (4) The receipt of a firearm bequeathed to the recipient.
- 30 3. A licensed firearms dealer may charge and collect fees
- 31 for obtaining criminal history record information checks on
- 32 behalf of sellers or transferors.
- 33 4. The department of public safety shall adopt rules
- 34 pursuant to chapter 17A as necessary to carry out the
- 35 provisions of this section.

- 5. For purposes of this section, "licensed firearms dealer"
- 2 means the same as defined in section 724.29A.
- 3 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to the sale or
- 4 transfer of firearms on or after July 1, 2024.
- 5 EXPLANATION
- 6 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 7 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 8 This bill relates to criminal history background checks for
- 9 the sale or transfer of firearms.
- 10 The bill provides that unless otherwise authorized by Code
- 11 chapter 724 (weapons) or federal law, a person shall not sell
- 12 or transfer a firearm to another person without receiving
- 13 verification from a licensed firearms dealer that information
- 14 on the prospective purchaser or transferee has been submitted
- 15 to the department of public safety for a criminal history
- 16 background check and that a determination has been received by
- 17 the department of public safety that the prospective purchaser
- 18 or transferee is not prohibited under either state or federal
- 19 law from possessing a firearm. A criminal history background
- 20 check must include an inquiry of the national instant criminal
- 21 background check system maintained by the federal bureau of
- 22 investigation.
- 23 The bill provides that, except as provided, a person who
- 24 sells or transfers a firearm in violation of the bill is guilty
- 25 of an aggravated misdemeanor.
- 26 The bill provides that the following are not violations:
- 27 a sale or transfer of a firearm to a firearm buyback program
- 28 sponsored by a law enforcement agency; a transfer of a firearm
- 29 to another person during an act of justified self-defense
- 30 or justified defense of another person, provided that
- 31 the possession after the transfer lasts no longer than is
- 32 immediately necessary to resolve the emergency; a transfer of
- 33 a firearm between family members; or the receipt of a firearm
- 34 bequeathed to the recipient.
- 35 The bill allows a licensed firearms dealer to charge and

- 1 collect fees for obtaining criminal history record information
- 2 checks on behalf of sellers or transferors.
- 3 The bill directs the department of public safety to adopt
- 4 rules as necessary to carry out the provisions of the bill.
- 5 The bill defines a "licensed firearms dealer" to mean
- 6 the same as defined in Code section 724.29A, which defines a
- 7 "licensed firearms dealer" as a person who is licensed pursuant
- 8 to 18 U.S.C. §923 to engage in the business of dealing in
- 9 firearms.
- 10 The bill applies to the sale or transfer of firearms on or 11 after July 1, 2024.
