## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to medical personnel authorized to withdraw a
- 2 specimen of blood from a person suspected of operating while
- 3 intoxicated.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

      Section 1. Section 321J.11, subsection 1, Code 2024, is
 2 amended to read as follows:
      1. Only a licensed physician, licensed physician assistant
 4 as defined in section 148C.1, emergency medical technician if
 5 authorized by the technician's designated medical director,
 6 emergency medical technician-paramedic if authorized by the
 7 technician-paramedic's designated medical director, medical
 8 technologist, or registered nurse, licensed practical nurse,
 9 medical laboratory technician, phlebotomist, laboratory
10 assistant, or other qualified person acting at the request of a
11 peace officer, may withdraw a specimen of blood for the purpose
12 of determining the alcohol concentration or the presence of
13 a controlled substance or other drugs. However, any peace
14 officer, using devices and methods approved by the commissioner
15 of public safety, may take a specimen of a person's breath or
16 urine for the purpose of determining the alcohol concentration,
17 or may take a specimen of a person's urine for the purpose of
18 determining the presence of a controlled substance or other
19 drugs. Except in cases of negligence while withdrawing a
20 specimen of blood, a person authorized to withdraw a specimen
21 of blood under this subsection who acts reasonably, in good
22 faith, and in accordance with standard medical procedures,
23 shall not be liable in any civil or criminal action for the
24 withdrawal of the specimen. Only new equipment kept under
25 strictly sanitary and sterile conditions shall be used for
26 drawing blood.

      Under current law, when a person is suspected of operating
31 a motor vehicle in violation of Code chapter 321J (operating
32 while intoxicated), only a licensed physician, licensed
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35 specimen of blood for the purpose of determining the alcohol

33 physician assistant, medical technologist, or registered nurse, 34 who is acting at the request of a peace officer, may withdraw a

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- 1 concentration or the presence of a controlled substance or
- 2 other drugs.
- 3 This bill expands the list of persons authorized to withdraw
- 4 a specimen of blood. Under the bill, an emergency medical
- 5 technician if authorized by the technician's designated medical
- 6 director, emergency medical technician-paramedic if authorized
- 7 by the technician-paramedic's designated medical director,
- 8 licensed practical nurse, medical laboratory technician,
- 9 phlebotomist, laboratory assistant, and other qualified persons
- 10 are also authorized to withdraw a specimen of blood. The
- 11 bill shields all authorized persons from civil and criminal
- 12 liability for the withdrawal of a specimen of blood, except in
- 13 cases of negligence, so long as the person acts reasonably, in
- 14 good faith, and in accordance with standard medical procedures.
