A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to student access to broad-spectrum cannabidiol
2 products from school nurses during the school day.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. **280.16B Broad-spectrum cannabidiol**
2 **products.**

3 1. For purposes of this section, unless the context
4 otherwise requires:

5 *a. "Broad-spectrum cannabidiol"* means any pharmaceutical
6 grade cannabinoid found in the plant *Cannabis sativa L.* or
7 *Cannabis indica* or any other preparation thereof that contains
8 no tetrahydrocannabinol. *"Broad-spectrum cannabidiol"* does not
9 include *"medical cannabidiol"* as defined in section 124E.2.

10 *b. "Broad-spectrum cannabidiol product"* means a product
11 that contains broad-spectrum cannabidiol and contains no
12 tetrahydrocannabinol.

13 *c. "Licensed health care professional"* means the same as
14 provided in section 280.16, subsection 1.

15 *d. "School nurse"* means the same as provided in section
16 280.16A, subsection 1.

17 2. The board of directors in charge of each school district
18 and the authorities in charge of each accredited nonpublic
19 school shall establish procedures for a school nurse to
20 provide a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student. The
21 policy must provide that a school nurse shall only provide a
22 broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student if the product
23 was provided to the school district or school by the parent
24 or guardian of the student and if the product is provided in
25 accordance with written instructions provided by the parent
26 or guardian. The policy shall provide for the broad-spectrum
27 cannabidiol product to be stored in a secure location when not
28 in use.

29 3. The policy established pursuant to subsection 2 must
30 provide for a form for a parent or guardian that shall be
31 filled out to the satisfaction of the school district or school
32 and signed before the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product is
33 provided to the student. The form must include all of the
34 following:

35 *a.* Instructions to the school district or school on the

1 use of the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product, including
2 the specific circumstances under which the product is to
3 be provided and, if applicable, the time and frequency for
4 providing the product and the expiration date of the product.

5 *b.* Authorization for the school district or school to
6 provide the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to the student
7 in accordance with the instructions.

8 *c.* Certification that the product provided by the parent or
9 guardian is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product.

10 *d.* Contact information for the parent or guardian and for a
11 licensed health care professional who provides medical care for
12 the student.

13 4. The parent or guardian shall include with the form
14 written documentation that the product provided by the parent
15 or guardian is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product, which
16 shall include documentation from the manufacturer of the
17 product specifically indicating that the product contains no
18 tetrahydrocannabinol.

19 EXPLANATION

20 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
21 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

22 This bill requires school boards and authorities in charge
23 of accredited nonpublic schools to establish procedures for a
24 school nurse to provide a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to
25 a student. The policy shall provide that a school nurse shall
26 only provide a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product to a student
27 if the product was provided to the school district or school
28 by the parent or guardian of the student and if the product is
29 provided in accordance with written instructions provided by
30 the parent or guardian.

31 The bill defines "broad-spectrum cannabidiol" as any
32 pharmaceutical grade cannabinoid found in the plant *Cannabis*
33 *sativa* L. or *Cannabis indica* or any other preparation thereof
34 that contains no tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). The bill defines
35 "broad-spectrum cannabidiol product" as a product that contains

1 broad-spectrum cannabidiol and contains no THC.

2 The bill requires that the policy provide for a form
3 for a parent or guardian that shall be filled out to the
4 satisfaction of the school district or school and signed before
5 the broad-spectrum cannabidiol product is provided to the
6 student. The bill includes required content for the form,
7 including instructions on use of the broad-spectrum cannabidiol
8 product, authorization for such use, certification that the
9 product provided by the parent or guardian is a broad-spectrum
10 cannabidiol product as defined in the bill, and contact
11 information for the parent or guardian and a licensed health
12 care professional who provides medical care for the student.

13 The bill requires a parent or guardian to include with the
14 form written documentation that the product provided by the
15 parent or guardian is a broad-spectrum cannabidiol product,
16 which shall include documentation from the manufacturer of the
17 product specifically indicating that the product contains no
18 THC.
