## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act requiring school districts to provide the parent or
- 2 guardian of each student enrolled in the school district
- 3 with a printed copy of the student's report card.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 279.84 Report cards.
- Each semester, or the trimester or quarter equivalent, the
- 3 board of directors of a school district shall provide the
- 4 parent or guardian of each student enrolled in the school
- 5 district with a printed copy of the student's report card in
- 6 one of the following ways:
- 7 1. By mailing the report card to the parent or guardian.
- 8 2. By providing the report card to the parent or guardian
- 9 by hand delivery.
- 10 3. By providing the report card to the student during the
- 11 school day and directing the student to take the report card
- 12 home to the student's parent or guardian.
- 13 Sec. 2. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACT. Section 25B.2, subsection
- 14 3, shall not apply to this Act.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- 16 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 17 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 18 This bill requires school districts to provide the parent
- 19 or quardian of each student enrolled in the school district
- 20 with a printed copy of the student's report card each semester,
- 21 or the trimester or quarter equivalent. The bill establishes
- 22 that school districts may fulfill this requirement either by
- 23 mailing the report card to the parent or guardian, by providing
- 24 the report card to the parent or guardian by hand delivery, or
- 25 by providing the report card to the student and directing the
- 26 student to take the report card home to the student's parent
- 27 or quardian.
- The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code
- 29 section 25B.3. The bill makes inapplicable Code section
- 30 25B.2, subsection 3, which would relieve a school district
- 31 from complying with a state mandate if funding for the cost of
- 32 the state mandate is not provided or specified. Therefore,
- 33 school districts are required to comply with any state mandate
