A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act concerning persons appointed to a convention called by
- 2 the United States Congress to propose amendments to the
- 3 United States Constitution, and providing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 38.1 Definitions.
- 2 For the purposes of this chapter, unless the context
- 3 otherwise requires:
- 4 l. "Commission" means the resolution or other measure
- 5 adopted by the general assembly which sets forth the names of
- 6 the appointed commissioners, the scope of their authority, and
- 7 other instructions.
- 8 2. "Commissioner" means a person selected by resolution of
- 9 the general assembly to represent this state at a convention
- 10 called by the United States Congress pursuant to Article V of
- 11 the Constitution of the United States.
- 12 3. "Interim commissioner" means a person selected to fill
- 13 a vacancy in a delegation sent to represent this state at a
- 14 convention called by the United States Congress pursuant to
- 15 Article V of the Constitution of the United States.
- 16 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 38.2 Commissioner scope of
- 17 authority penalty.
- 18 1. A commissioner or interim commissioner shall not exceed
- 19 the scope of the commissioner's or interim commissioner's
- 20 authority when acting as a commissioner or interim
- 21 commissioner. A commissioner or interim commissioner exceeds
- 22 the scope of the commissioner's or interim commissioner's
- 23 authority by voting or otherwise acting beyond the authority
- 24 granted by the commission appointing the commissioner or
- 25 interim commissioner, as altered by any duly issued subsequent
- 26 instructions provided before the vote or other action.
- 27 2. A commissioner or interim commissioner who exceeds
- 28 the scope of the authority of the commissioner or interim
- 29 commissioner is guilty of a class "D" felony.
- 30 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 38.3 Interference with commissioner's
- 31 duties penalty.
- 32 A person who, except as authorized by law, knowingly
- 33 bribes, threatens, intimidates, or obstructs a commissioner,
- 34 interim commissioner, or person representing another state
- 35 in the capacity of a commissioner or interim commissioner at

- 1 a convention held in this state, in the performance of the
 2 commissioner's or interim commissioner's duties, or attempts to
 3 do so, is guilty of a class "D" felony.
 4 EXPLANATION
 5 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
 6 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
 7 This bill relates to persons selected by the general
- 8 assembly to represent the state at a convention called by the 9 U.S. Congress to propose amendments to the U.S. Constitution. 10 The bill prohibits a commissioner, defined in the bill as ll a person selected by a resolution of the general assembly to 12 represent the state of Iowa at a convention called by the 13 U.S. Congress pursuant to Article V of the U.S. Constitution, 14 or an interim commissioner selected to fill a vacancy in a 15 delegation sent by Iowa to such a convention, from exceeding 16 the scope of the commissioner's or interim commissioner's 17 authority by voting or otherwise acting beyond the scope of 18 the commissioner's or interim commissioner's commission. 19 bill defines "commission" as the resolution or other measure 20 adopted by the general assembly setting forth the names 21 of commissioners, the scope of their authority, and other 22 instructions. A commissioner or interim commissioner who 23 exceeds the scope of authority set forth in a commission or 24 subsequent instructions is guilty of a class "D" felony. A 25 class "D" felony is punishable by confinement for no more than 26 five years and a fine of at least \$1,025 but not more than 27 \$10,245.
- The bill also prohibits a person from knowingly bribing, threatening, intimidating, or obstructing a commissioner, interim commissioner, or person serving in that capacity from another state at a convention held in Iowa, in the performance of the person's official duties, or attempting to do so. A person who violates this provision of the bill is guilty of a class "D" felony.
