## A BILL FOR

An Act relating to statewide voluntary preschool program
required hours of instruction and funding calculations.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

TLSB 5555YH (3) 90 dg/jh 1 Section 1. Section 256C.3, subsection 3, paragraph f, Code 2 2024, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in 3 lieu thereof the following:

4 f. A minimum of one thousand eighty hours of instruction 5 during the calendar year.

Sec. 2. Section 256C.5, subsection 1, paragraph c, Code 6 7 2024, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in 8 lieu thereof the following:

"Preschool budget enrollment" means the actual enrollment C. 9 10 of eligible students in the preschool programming provided by ll a school district approved to participate in the preschool 12 program on October 1 of the base year, or the first Monday in 13 October if October 1 falls on a Saturday or Sunday. 14 EXPLANATION

15 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 16 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

17 This bill relates to statewide voluntary preschool program 18 required hours of instruction and funding calculations.

19 The bill requires that each statewide voluntary preschool 20 program (SVPP) offered by a school district to include a 21 minimum of 1,080 hours of instruction during a calendar year. 22 This is the current minimum hours of instruction required for 23 students attending kindergarten through grade 12 classes.

24 A school district with an approved SVPP is funded in part by 25 preschool foundation aid payments. The preschool foundation 26 aid is calculated by multiplying the regular program state cost 27 per pupil by the school district's preschool budget enrollment. 28 Currently, the preschool budget enrollment for a given year 29 is calculated by multiplying the number of eligible students 30 enrolled in the preschool program by 50 percent.

31 The bill changes the calculation for preschool budget 32 enrollment to 100 percent of eligible students enrolled in the 33 preschool program. This is the same as the current method for 34 calculating budget enrollment for a school district.

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
