A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the conduct of elections, and making
- 2 penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 1C.1, Code 2024, is amended by adding the 2 following new subsection:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 7A. Election Day, the first Tuesday after 4 the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year.

5 Sec. 2. Section 1C.2, subsection 1, Code 2024, is amended by 6 adding the following new paragraph:

7 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. *Of.* Election Day, the first Tuesday after 8 the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year.

9 Sec. 3. Section 49.57, Code 2024, is amended by adding the 10 following new subsection:

11 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 8. They shall include a unique code 12 or other identifier to distinguish genuine ballots from 13 counterfeit ballots. Notwithstanding any provision of law to 14 the contrary, a ballot that does not include a unique code or 15 other identifier that has not been previously included on a 16 cast ballot shall not be counted.

17 Sec. 4. Section 53.1, subsection 1, Code 2024, is amended 18 to read as follows:

19 1. Any registered voter may, subject to the provisions of
20 this chapter, vote at any election:

21 a. When the voter expects to will be absent on election day 22 during the time the polls are open from the precinct in which 23 the voter is a registered voter <u>due to a responsibility related</u> 24 to the person's employment.

25 b. When, through illness, age, or physical disability, the 26 voter expects to will be prevented from going to the polls and 27 voting on election day.

28 c. When the voter expects to be unable to go to the polls 29 and vote on election day <u>because the voter is a member of the</u> 30 <u>military</u>.

31 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 68A.507 Contributions from 32 out-of-state sources — limitations.

33 1. A candidate or candidate's committee shall not accept 34 contributions of greater than one dollar from a person not 35 living in or incorporated or organized under the laws of this

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1 state.

2 2. The general assembly recognizes that persons who are not 3 residents of Iowa have the right to free speech under the first 4 amendment to the Constitution of the United States and may have 5 a passing interest in elections in this state. However, the 6 general assembly finds that it is in the best interest of the 7 residents of Iowa for elections in this state to be influenced 8 and funded by residents of Iowa.

9 Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 68A.508 Contribution limits for 10 candidates.

11 1. For the purposes of this section, "election campaign 12 cycle" means the time period between elections for a particular 13 office. Each primary, general, and special election is a 14 separate election campaign cycle. Separate contribution limits 15 for each type of election for a particular office, including 16 primary, general, and special elections, apply in an election 17 campaign cycle.

18 2. A person shall not make, and a candidate, candidate's 19 committee, or anyone acting on behalf of any candidate or 20 candidate's committee shall not accept, any contribution which 21 will cause the total amount of the person's contributions to 22 a candidate or candidate's committee to exceed one hundred 23 dollars.

3. This section applies to candidates for any public office25 in this state.

EXPLANATION

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27The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with28the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

29 This bill relates to the conduct of elections.

The bill makes the day of the general election, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-numbered year, a legal public holiday. The bill also makes election day a paid holiday for state employees. The bill requires that each ballot include a unique code or other identifier to distinguish genuine ballots from

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LSB 6045YH (2) 90 ss/ns 1 counterfeit ballots. The bill prohibits a ballot from 2 being counted if it does not include a unique code or other 3 identifier that has not been previously included on a cast 4 ballot.

5 The bill alters the groups of voters who may cast an absentee 6 ballot. The bill allows a voter to cast an absentee ballot 7 only if the voter will be absent on election day during the 8 time the polls are open from the precinct in which the voter 9 is a registered voter due to a responsibility related to the 10 person's employment; the voter will be prevented from going to 11 the polls and voting on election day due to illness, age, or 12 physical disability; or the voter expects to be unable to go 13 to the polls and vote on election day because the voter is a 14 member of the military.

The bill prohibits a candidate for public office or 15 16 a candidate's committee from accepting contributions of 17 greater than \$1 from a person not living in or incorporated 18 or organized under the laws of this state. The bill states 19 the general assembly's recognition that persons who are not 20 residents of Iowa have the right to free speech under the 21 first amendment to the Constitution of the United States and 22 may have a passing interest in elections in Iowa but that the 23 general assembly finds that it is in the best interest of the 24 residents of Iowa for elections in Iowa to be influenced and 25 funded by residents of Iowa. By operation of law, a person who 26 willfully violates this provision of the bill is guilty of a 27 serious misdemeanor. A serious misdemeanor is punishable by 28 confinement for no more than one year and a fine of at least 29 \$430 but not more than \$2,560.

The bill imposes campaign contribution limits on candidates for public office. In an election campaign cycle, a person shall not contribute to a candidate, and the candidate shall not accept, more than \$100. A person who willfully makes or accepts a contribution in violation of this provision of the bill is, pursuant to Code section 68A.701, guilty of a serious

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2 A variety of civil remedies are also available in Code 3 section 68B.32D for a violation of the bill relating to 4 campaign finance, ranging from a reprimand to a civil penalty 5 of not more than \$2,000.

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
