      Section 1. Section 85.34, subsection 2, unnumbered
 2 paragraph 1, Code 2024, is amended to read as follows:
      Compensation for permanent partial disability shall begin
 4 when it is medically indicated that maximum medical improvement
 5 from the injury has been reached and that the extent of loss or
 6 percentage of permanent impairment can be determined by use of
 7 the most recent annual update to the most recent edition of the
 8 guides to the evaluation of permanent impairment, published by
 9 the American medical association, as adopted by the workers'
10 compensation commissioner by rule pursuant to chapter 17A.
11 compensation shall be in addition to the benefits provided by
12 sections 85.27 and 85.28. The compensation shall be based
13 upon the extent of the disability and upon the basis of eighty
14 percent per week of the employee's average spendable weekly
15 earnings, but not more than a weekly benefit amount, rounded to
16 the nearest dollar, equal to one hundred eighty-four percent of
17 the statewide average weekly wage paid employees as determined
18 by the department of workforce development under section 96.1A,
19 subsection 35, and in effect at the time of the injury.
20 minimum weekly benefit amount shall be equal to the weekly
21 benefit amount of a person whose gross weekly earnings are
22 thirty-five percent of the statewide average weekly wage. For

          In all cases of permanent partial disability described in

- 1 or agency expertise shall not be utilized in determining loss
- 2 or percentage of permanent impairment pursuant to paragraphs
- 3 "a" through "u", or paragraph "v" when determining functional

- 5 Sec. 3. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to determinations
- 6 of extent of loss or percentage of permanent impairment for
- 7 purposes of section 85.34, subsection 2, occurring on or after
- 8 the effective date of this Act.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 12 Under current law, determinations of extent of loss or
- 13 percentage of permanent impairment for purposes of permanent
- 14 partial disability under workers' compensation use the guides
- 15 to the evaluation of permanent impairment published by the
- 16 American medical association, as adopted by the workers'
- 17 compensation commissioner by rule. This bill specifies that
- 18 the most recent annual update to the most recent edition of
- 19 the guides shall be used. The bill strikes the requirement
- 20 that the workers' compensation commissioner adopt the guides
- 21 by rule.
- 22 The workers' compensation commissioner has adopted the fifth
- 23 edition of the guides, published in 2001, by rule. The most
- 24 recent annual update to the most recent edition of the guides
- 25 is the 2023 update to the sixth edition.
- 26 The bill applies to determinations of extent of loss or
- 27 percentage of permanent impairment for purposes of permanent
- 28 partial disability under workers' compensation occurring on or
- 29 after the effective date of the bill.
