A BILL FOR

An Act requiring the development of an attendance improvement
 plan when a student is chronically absent from school.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 299.1C Students who are chronically
2 absent.

3 1. When a student who is enrolled in a public school was 4 absent from school for at least ten percent of the school days 5 in the prior school year for any reason, all of the following 6 persons shall meet to discuss how to improve the student's 7 attendance, create an attendance improvement plan, and sign the 8 attendance improvement plan:

9 *a.* The student's parent, guardian, or legal or actual 10 custodian, if the student is not an emancipated minor.

11 b. The student, if the student is an emancipated minor.
12 c. A representative of the public school in which the
13 student is enrolled.

14 d. A representative of the county attorney of a county in 15 which the school district is located.

16 2. During the meeting described in subsection 1, the 17 representative of the county attorney shall provide the 18 student or the student's parent, guardian, or legal or actual 19 custodian, as applicable, with information related to this 20 state's laws related to attendance requirements, penalties 21 associated with violating the attendance requirements, and 22 exceptions to the attendance requirements.

This bill requires the development of an attendance improvement plan when a student is chronically absent from school.

The bill provides that, when a student who is enrolled in a public school was absent from school for at least 10 percent of the school days in the prior school year for any reason, the student or the student's parent, guardian, or custodian, as applicable, a representative of the public school, and a representative of the county attorney of a county in which the public school is located shall meet to discuss

1 how to improve the student's attendance, create an attendance 2 improvement plan, and sign the attendance improvement plan. 3 The bill requires that, during the meeting, the representative 4 of the county attorney shall provide the student or the 5 student's parent, guardian, or custodian, as applicable, 6 with information related to this state's laws related to 7 attendance requirements, penalties associated with violating 8 the attendance requirements, and exceptions to the attendance 9 requirements.
