9	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I FY 2024-2025 APPROPRIATIONS 2 3 Section 1. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY - ECONOMIC 4 DEVELOPMENT. 5 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, the goals 6 for the economic development authority shall be to expand and 7 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and 8 increase the population of the state. 9 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the economic 10 development authority shall do all of the following for the 11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024: 12 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that 13 result in commercially viable products and services. Adopt practices and services consistent with free 14 b. 15 market, private sector philosophies. 16 Ensure economic growth and development throughout the c. 17 state. 18 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually 19 improve the economic development climate along with the 20 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans. 21 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they 22 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture. 23 Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to f. 24 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential. 25 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses, 26 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses. 27 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through 28 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks 29 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small 30 businesses. Encourage the development of communities and quality of 31 α. 32 life to foster economic growth. 33 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development 34 through development, expansion, and modernization of

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35 infrastructure.

i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses
 2 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism
 3 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to
 4 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

5 Sec. 2. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

6 1. APPROPRIATION

There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 8 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year 9 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, the following 10 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the 11 purposes designated in this subsection, and for not more than 12 the following full-time equivalent positions:

b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes, programs, marketing, administration, business development, community development, small business development, and any divisions the authority may organize.

(2) For business development operations and programs,

(3) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section
23 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure
24 projects.

(4) For community economic development programs, tourism
operations, community assistance, and the community development
block grant.

(5) For achieving the goals and accountability, and fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act. (6) The full-time equivalent positions authorized under this section are funded, in whole or in part, by the moneys appropriated under this subsection or by other moneys received 3 by the authority, including certain federal moneys.

c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in
35 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the

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close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this
 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

5 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in 6 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring 7 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are 8 citizens of the United States who reside within the United 9 States, or any person authorized to work in the United States 10 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens 11 residing in the United States.

b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who reside within the United States, or any person authorized to work in the United States, pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens residing in the United States.

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The bill transfers \$100,000 of the moneys collected by the
