A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to outdoor education and recreation programs
- 2 serving youth, and making appropriations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **456A.39** No child left inside 2 program fund created appropriation.
- 3 1. The director shall establish and administer a no
- 4 child left inside program to provide grants for outdoor
- 5 environmental, ecological, and other natural resource-based
- 6 education and recreation programs serving youth.
- 7 2. The director may award grants under this section to
- 8 accredited public school districts, accredited nonpublic
- 9 schools, or private nonprofit organizations.
- 10 3. a. In awarding grants under this section, the director
- 11 shall give preference to programs that satisfy the following
- 12 priorities:
- 13 (1) Provides students with opportunities to directly
- 14 experience and understand nature and the natural world.
- 15 (2) Uses a research-based, effective environmental,
- 16 ecological, or other natural resource-based educational
- 17 curriculum.
- 18 (3) Maximizes the number of participants that can be served.
- 19 (4) Serves children with limited opportunities to
- 20 participate in natural resource-based outdoor activities.
- 21 (5) Uses public park and other natural resource venues and
- 22 personnel as a resource.
- 23 (6) Commits to matching funds or in-kind resources.
- 24 b. In addition to considering the preferences in paragraph
- 25 "a", the director shall ensure that at least fifty percent
- 26 of the moneys awarded under this section benefit students
- 27 attending schools that qualify for funding under Tit. I of the
- 28 federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.
- 29 4. a. An outdoor education and recreation fund is
- 30 established in the state treasury under the control of the
- 31 department. The fund shall consist of moneys deposited
- 32 in the fund from appropriations, gifts, grants, and other
- 33 contributions. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the
- 34 department for the purpose of issuing grants as part of the
- 35 no child left inside program. Notwithstanding section 8.33,

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- 1 moneys in the fund that remain unencumbered or unobligated
 2 at the close of a fiscal year shall not revert but shall
 3 remain available for expenditure for the purpose designated.
 4 Notwithstanding section 12C.7, subsection 2, interest or
 5 earnings on moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund.
 6 b. The fund may consist of moneys that are deposited in
 7 the fund prior to July 1, 2025, from moneys received by the
 8 state from the elementary and secondary school emergency relief
 9 fund created pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and
 10 Economic Security Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, as amended by the
 11 Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 116-260,
 12 and from moneys received by the state under the American Rescue
 13 Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, unless the governor
 14 determines such deposit to be contrary to federal guidelines or
 15 regulations. Any moneys deposited pursuant to this paragraph

For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and for each 20 fiscal year thereafter, there is appropriated from the general 21 fund of the state to the outdoor education and recreation fund 22 established in paragraph "a" the sum of one million dollars. 23 At least fifty percent of the moneys appropriated under this 24 paragraph shall be used to provide grants to benefit students 25 attending schools that qualify for funding under Tit. I of the 26 federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.

- This bill relates to outdoor education and recreation programs serving youth. The bill requires the director of the department of natural resources (DNR) to establish and administer a no child left inside program to provide grants for dutdoor environmental, ecological, and other natural resource-based education and recreation programs serving

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1 youth. The director may award grants to accredited public 2 school districts, accredited nonpublic schools, or private 3 nonprofit organizations, with preference given to programs that 4 satisfy certain priorities. The director shall also ensure 5 that at least 50 percent of the moneys awarded benefit students 6 attending schools that qualify for funding under Tit. I of the 7 federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965. The bill establishes an outdoor education and recreation 9 fund in the state treasury under the control of DNR. 10 fund shall consist of moneys deposited in the fund from ll appropriations, gifts, grants, and other contributions, but may 12 also consist of moneys that are deposited in the fund prior 13 to July 1, 2025, from moneys received by the state from the 14 elementary and secondary school emergency relief fund created 15 pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security 16 Act and from moneys received by the state under the American 17 Rescue Plan Act of 2021, unless the governor determines such 18 deposit to be contrary to federal guidelines or regulations. 19 Any moneys deposited from either federal source shall be used 20 for the purpose of issuing grants as part of the no child left 21 inside program prior to using moneys deposited to the fund from 22 the general fund. 23 For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and each fiscal 24 year thereafter, the bill makes an appropriation of \$1 million 25 from the general fund to the outdoor education and recreation 26 fund. At least 50 percent of the moneys appropriated shall be 27 used to provide grants to benefit students attending schools 28 that qualify for funding under Tit. I of the federal Elementary 29 and Secondary Education Act of 1965.
