# House File 429 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to school districts, including authorizing
- 2 the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a school
- 3 district to enroll the student in another attendance
- 4 center within the same school district in certain specified
- 5 circumstances, requiring classroom teachers employed
- 6 by school districts to provide notice to the parents or
- 7 guardians of students enrolled in the school district if the
- 8 classroom teacher witnesses the student being physically
- 9 injured, harassed, or bullied, and including effective date
- 10 provisions.
- 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 279.77 Intra-district enrollment.
- 2 l. A parent or quardian of a student enrolled in a school
- 3 district may enroll the student in another attendance center
- 4 within the same school district that offers classes at the
- 5 student's grade level in the manner provided in this section
- 6 if the board of directors of the school district reasonably
- 7 believes that any student enrolled in the school district
- 8 has harassed or bullied the student. For purposes of this
- 9 subsection, "harassment" and "bullying" mean the same as defined
- 10 in section 280.28.
- 11 2. a. A parent or guardian shall send notification to the
- 12 board of directors of the school district, on forms prescribed
- 13 by the department of education, that the parent or quardian
- 14 intends to enroll the student in another attendance center
- 15 within the same school district that offers classes at the
- 16 student's grade level.
- 17 b. The board of directors of the school district shall
- 18 enroll the student in another attendance center within the same
- 19 school district unless the attendance center has insufficient
- 20 classroom space for the student. The board of directors of a
- 21 school district may adopt a policy granting the superintendent
- 22 of the school district authority to approve requests submitted
- 23 pursuant to this section. If the request is granted, the board
- 24 of directors of the school district shall transmit a copy of
- 25 the form to the parent or guardian within five days after board
- 26 action. The parent or guardian may withdraw the request at any
- 27 time prior to the board of directors' action on the request.
- 28 A denial of a request by the board of directors is not subject
- 29 to appeal.
- 30 c. Each school district shall adopt a policy that defines
- 31 the term "insufficient classroom space" for that district.
- 32 3. A request under this section is for a period of not
- 33 less than one year. A student who attends school in another
- 34 attendance center pursuant to this section may return to the
- 35 original attendance center and enroll at any time, once the

- 1 parent or guardian has notified the board of directors of
- 2 the school district in writing of the decision to enroll the
- 3 student in the original attendance center.
- 4 4. If a request filed under this section is for a student
- 5 requiring special education under chapter 256B, the request to
- 6 transfer to another attendance center shall only be granted if
- 7 all of the following conditions are met:
- 8 a. The attendance center maintains a special education
- 9 instructional program that is appropriate to meet the student's
- 10 educational needs and the enrollment of the student in the
- 11 attendance center would not cause the size of the class or
- 12 caseload in that special education instructional program in the
- 13 attendance center to exceed the maximum class size or caseload
- 14 established pursuant to rules adopted by the state board of
- 15 education.
- 16 b. If the student would be assigned to a general education
- 17 class, there is sufficient classroom space for the general
- 18 education class to which the student would be assigned.
- 19 5. If a student, for whom a request to transfer has been
- 20 filed with the board of directors of a school district, has
- 21 been suspended or expelled in the school district, the student
- 22 shall not be permitted to transfer until the student has been
- 23 reinstated. Once the student has been reinstated, however, the
- 24 student shall be permitted to transfer in the same manner as if
- 25 the student had not been suspended or expelled. If a student,
- 26 for whom a request to transfer has been filed with the board
- 27 of directors of a school district, is expelled in the school
- 28 district, the student shall be permitted to transfer under this
- 29 section if the student applies for and is reinstated. However,
- 30 if the student applies for reinstatement but is not reinstated
- 31 in the school district, the board of directors of the school
- 32 district may deny the request to transfer. The decision of
- 33 the board of directors of the school district is not subject
- 34 to appeal.
- 35 6. A student who is enrolled in another attendance center

- 1 within the same school district pursuant to this section is
- 2 eligible to participate immediately in varsity interscholastic
- 3 athletic contests and athletic competitions as a member of a
- 4 team from the receiving attendance center.
- 5 7. This section shall not be construed to prohibit a
- 6 school district from allowing the parent or guardian of a
- 7 student enrolled in the school district to enroll the student
- 8 in another attendance center within the same school district
- 9 that offers classes at the student's grade level pursuant to a
- 10 policy adopted by the board of directors of the school district
- 11 that allows for transfers for reasons in addition to those
- 12 allowed pursuant to this section.
- 13 8. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant
- 14 to chapter 17A to administer this section.
- 15 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 279.78 Notice to parents or guardians
- 16 related to physical injuries, harassment, or bullying.
- 17 A classroom teacher employed by a school district shall
- 18 notify the parents or quardians of a student enrolled in
- 19 the school district in writing or by electronic mail within
- 20 twenty-four hours after the classroom teacher witnesses any of
- 21 the following:
- 22 1. Any student enrolled in the school district physically
- 23 injuring the student.
- 24 2. Any student enrolled in the school district harassing
- 25 or bullying the student. For purposes of this subsection,
- 26 "harassment" and "bullying" mean the same as defined in section
- 27 280.28.
- 28 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate
- 29 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 30 EXPLANATION
- 31 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 32 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 33 This bill relates to school districts, including authorizing
- 34 the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a school
- 35 district to enroll the student in another attendance

- 1 center within the same school district in certain specified
- 2 circumstances and requiring classroom teachers employed by
- 3 school districts to provide notice to the parents or guardians
- 4 of students enrolled in the school district if the classroom
- 5 teacher witnesses the student being physically injured,
- 6 harassed, or bullied.
- 7 The bill enacts new Code section 279.77, which provides that
- 8 a parent or guardian of a student enrolled in a school district
- 9 may enroll the student in another attendance center within the
- 10 same school district that offers classes at the student's grade
- 11 level in the manner provided in new Code section 279.77 if the
- 12 board of directors of the school district reasonably believes
- 13 that any student enrolled in the school district has harassed
- 14 or bullied the student. The bill defines "harassment" and
- 15 "bullying".
- 16 The bill requires a parent or guardian to send a request
- 17 to the board of directors indicating that the parent or
- 18 guardian intends to enroll the student in another attendance
- 19 center within the same school district. Additionally, the
- 20 bill requires the board of directors to enroll the student
- 21 in another attendance center within the same school district
- 22 unless the attendance center has insufficient classroom space
- 23 for the student. The bill authorizes the board of directors
- 24 to adopt a policy granting the superintendent the authority
- 25 to approve these requests. The bill requires the board
- 26 of directors to transmit a copy of the form to the parent
- 27 or quardian within five days after board action. The bill
- 28 authorizes the parent or quardian to withdraw the request
- 29 at any time prior to the board of directors' action on the
- 30 request.
- 31 The bill provides that these requests are for a period of
- 32 not less than one year. The bill also provides that a student
- 33 who attends school in another attendance center pursuant to
- 34 new Code section 279.77 may return to the original attendance
- 35 center and enroll at any time, once the parent or guardian has

- 1 notified the board of directors of the decision to enroll the
  2 student in the original attendance center.
- 3 The bill provides that, if a request filed pursuant to
- 4 new Code section 279.77 is for a student requiring special
- 5 education, the request to transfer to another attendance center
- 6 shall only be granted if the attendance center maintains a
- 7 special education instructional program that is appropriate to
- 8 meet the student's educational needs and the enrollment of the
- 9 student in the attendance center would not cause the size of
- 10 the class or caseload in that special education instructional
- 11 program in the attendance center to exceed the maximum class
- 12 size or caseload established pursuant to rules adopted by the
- 13 state board of education, and, if the student would be assigned
- 14 to a general education class, there is sufficient classroom
- 15 space for the general education class to which the student
- 16 would be assigned.
- 17 The bill provides that if a student for whom a request to
- 18 transfer has been filed with the board of directors has been
- 19 suspended or expelled in the school district, the student
- 20 shall not be permitted to transfer until the student has been
- 21 reinstated. The bill also provides that, once the student
- 22 has been reinstated, the student is permitted to transfer in
- 23 the same manner as if the student had not been suspended or
- 24 expelled. The bill establishes that if a student for whom a
- 25 request to transfer has been filed with the board of directors
- 26 is expelled, the student shall be permitted to transfer if the
- 27 student applies for and is reinstated. The bill provides that
- 28 if the student applies for reinstatement but is not reinstated
- 29 in the school district, the board of directors may deny the
- 30 request to transfer.
- 31 The bill provides that a student who is enrolled in
- 32 another attendance center within the same school district
- 33 pursuant to new Code section 279.77 is eligible to participate
- 34 immediately in varsity interscholastic athletic contests and
- 35 athletic competitions as a member of a team from the receiving

- 1 attendance center.
- 2 The bill prohibits new Code section 279.77 from being
- 3 construed to prohibit a school district from allowing the
- 4 parent or quardian of a student enrolled in the school district
- 5 to enroll the student in another attendance center within the
- 6 same school district that offers classes at the student's grade
- 7 level pursuant to a policy adopted by the board of directors
- 8 of the school district that allows for transfers for reasons
- 9 in addition to those allowed pursuant to the bill. The
- 10 bill requires the state board of education to adopt rules to
- ll administer the new Code section.
- 12 The bill enacts new Code section 279.78, which requires
- 13 a classroom teacher employed by a school district to notify
- 14 the parents or guardians of a student enrolled in the school
- 15 district in writing or by electronic mail within 24 hours after
- 16 the classroom teacher witnesses any student enrolled in the
- 17 school district physically injuring, harassing, or bullying the
- 18 student.
- 19 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
