

**House File 507 - Introduced**

HOUSE FILE 507

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and DIEKEN

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to public health and safety, prohibiting health  
2 mandates and requirements by federal and nongovernmental  
3 health organizations, and including effective date  
4 provisions.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY — PROHIBITIONS ON  
2 CERTAIN MANDATES AND REQUIREMENTS.

3 1. The United States centers for disease control and  
4 prevention or any other federal agency, department, or  
5 official, and the world health organization or any other  
6 similar multinational entity asserting authority under  
7 color of law or pursuant to any alleged treaty shall have  
8 no jurisdiction in Iowa, and any requirements, mandates,  
9 recommendations, instructions, or guidance provided by these  
10 entities shall not be used in this state to justify any mask,  
11 vaccine, or medical testing requirements and shall have no  
12 force or effect in Iowa.

13 2. Notwithstanding any other provision to the contrary, the  
14 department of health and human services shall not do any of the  
15 following:

16 a. Require a person to enroll in the statewide immunization  
17 registry or otherwise submit to any form of immunization  
18 tracking.

19 b. Include a person's immunization record in any interstate  
20 or federal immunization tracking system.

21 c. For the purpose of including a person's immunization  
22 record in any interstate or federal immunization tracking  
23 system, allow any person, not otherwise authorized by law, to  
24 have access to another person's immunization record without  
25 first obtaining written informed consent for release of the  
26 record from the person who is the subject of the record or, if  
27 that person is a minor, the minor's parent or guardian.

28 3. The general assembly having found that the general  
29 assembly has validly reserved its powers concerning the issues  
30 specified in this section under the tenth amendment to the  
31 Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the  
32 State of Iowa, the attorney general is authorized and directed  
33 to request orders, injunctions, and such other writs as are  
34 necessary to compel compliance with this section.

35 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate

1 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

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EXPLANATION

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The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
4 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

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This bill relates to public health and safety including  
6 provisions relating to mask, vaccine, or medical testing  
7 requirements and those relating to immunizations.

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The bill provides that the United States centers for disease  
9 control and prevention or any other federal agency, department,  
10 or official, and the world health organization or any similar  
11 multinational entity shall have no jurisdiction in Iowa, and  
12 any requirements, mandates, recommendations, instructions,  
13 or guidance provided by these entities shall not be used in  
14 this state to justify any mask, vaccine, or medical testing  
15 requirements and shall have no force or effect in Iowa.

The bill prohibits the department of health and human  
17 services from requiring a person to enroll in the statewide  
18 immunization registry or otherwise submit to any form of  
19 immunization tracking; from including a person's immunization  
20 record in any interstate or federal immunization tracking  
21 system; and for the purpose of including a person's  
22 immunization record in any interstate or federal immunization  
23 tracking system, from allowing any person, not otherwise  
24 authorized by law, to have access to another person's  
25 immunization record without first obtaining written informed  
26 consent for release of the record from the person who is the  
27 subject of the record or, if that person is a minor, the  
28 minor's parent or guardian.

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The bill also authorizes and directs the attorney general to  
30 request orders, injunctions, and other writs as are necessary  
31 to compel compliance with the bill.

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The bill takes effect upon enactment.
