HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution
- of the State of Iowa relating to medical treatment.
- 3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 2 the State of Iowa is proposed:
- 3 Article I of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is amended
- 4 by adding the following new section:
- 5 Sec. 26. Medical treatment. The right of a person to refuse
- 6 any medical procedure, treatment, injection, device, vaccine,
- 7 or prophylactic shall not be questioned or interfered with in
- 8 any manner. Equality of rights and liberty under the law and
- 9 in the domain of public accommodations shall not be denied,
- 10 abridged, or restricted due to the exercise of the right under
- ll this section.
- 12 Sec. 2. REFERRAL AND PUBLICATION. The foregoing proposed
- 13 amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is referred
- 14 to the general assembly to be chosen at the next general
- 15 election for members of the general assembly, and shall be
- 16 published as provided by law for three consecutive months
- 17 previous to the date of that election.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 21 This joint resolution proposes an amendment to the
- 22 Constitution of the State of Iowa relating to medical
- 23 treatment specifying "The right of a person to refuse any
- 24 medical procedure, treatment, injection, device, vaccine, or
- 25 prophylactic shall not be questioned or interfered with in
- 26 any manner. Equality of rights and liberty under the law and
- 27 in the domain of public accommodations shall not be denied,
- 28 abridged, or restricted due to the exercise of the right under
- 29 this section."
- 30 The resolution, if adopted, would be published and then
- 31 referred to the next general assembly (91st) for adoption
- 32 before being submitted to the electorate for ratification.
