A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for veterinary medicine, including the
- 2 care of animals under the supervision of a licensed
- 3 veterinarian, providing penalties, and including effective
- 4 date provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 169.3, subsection 3, Code 2023, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 3. "Animal" means any nonhuman primate, dog, cat, rabbit,
- 4 rodent, fish, reptile, and livestock, or other vertebrate or
- 5 nonvertebrate life forms form, living or dead, except domestic
- 6 poultry.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 169.3, Code 2023, is amended by adding the
- 8 following new subsections:
- 9 NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. "Diagnosis" means the act or process
- 10 of identifying or determining the health status, including
- 11 the diagnosis of pregnancy, sterility, or infertility, of an
- 12 animal through manual or laboratory examination and the opinion
- 13 derived from that examination.
- 14 NEW SUBSECTION. 7A. "Livestock" means an animal belonging
- 15 to the bovine, caprine, equine, ovine, or porcine species; farm
- 16 deer as defined in section 170.1; ostriches, rheas, or emus; or
- 17 turkeys, chickens, domestic geese or ducks, or other domestic
- 18 fowl.
- 19 NEW SUBSECTION. 10A. a. "Surgery" means the branch of
- 20 veterinary science conducted under elective or emergency
- 21 circumstances, that treats diseases, injuries, and deformities
- 22 by manual or operative methods including but not limited to
- 23 abdominal, cosmetic, dental, reconstructive, ophthalmic,
- 24 orthopedic, vascular, thoracic, and obstetric procedures.
- 25 b. "Surgery" does not include an accepted livestock
- 26 management practice.
- 27 Sec. 3. Section 169.3, subsection 10, Code 2023, is amended
- 28 by striking the subsection and inserting in lieu thereof the
- 29 following:
- 30 10. "Practice of veterinary medicine" means any of the
- 31 following:
- 32 a. Representing oneself as engaged in the practice of
- 33 veterinary medicine.
- 34 b. Using words, letters, or titles in connection with,
- 35 or under circumstances that may induce another person to

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- 1 believe that the person using them is engaged in, the practice
- 2 of veterinary medicine, veterinary surgery, or veterinary
- 3 dentistry.
- 4 c. Accepting compensation for providing veterinary medical
- 5 services to an animal patient by doing any of the following:
- 6 (1) Providing a diagnosis, treatment, or correction, or
- 7 providing for the prevention, of a disease, defect, injury,
- 8 deformity, pain, or condition of an animal.
- 9 (2) Prescribing, dispensing, administering, or ordering
- 10 the administration of a drug, including a medicine or a
- 11 biologic; prescribing or attaching a medical appliance; or
- 12 providing an application or treatment of whatever nature for
- 13 the prevention, cure, or relief of a disease, ailment, defect,
- 14 injury, deformity, pain, or other condition of an animal.
- 15 (3) Performing any of the following:
- 16 (a) A surgical operation in which an animal is diagnosed or
- 17 receives treatment.
- 18 (b) Complementary or alternative therapy in which an animal
- 19 receives treatment.
- 20 (4) Doing any of the following:
- 21 (a) Certifying the health, fitness, or soundness of an
- 22 animal.
- 23 (b) Performing any procedure for the diagnosis of
- 24 pregnancy, sterility, or infertility on an animal.
- 25 d. "Practice of veterinary medicine" does not include any of
- 26 the following:
- 27 (1) Providing authorized veterinary medical services to an
- 28 animal patient by veterinary auxiliary personnel, if performing
- 29 a delegated task when acting under a level of supervision by a
- 30 supervising veterinarian under subchapter II.
- 31 (2) Practicing animal massage therapy.
- 32 (a) As used in this subparagraph, "animal massage therapy"
- 33 means a method of treating the body of any animal for remedial
- 34 or hygienic purposes through techniques that include rubbing,
- 35 stroking, or kneading the body of the animal.

- 1 (b) "Animal massage therapy" may be applied with or without
- 2 the aid of a massage device that mimics the actions possible
- 3 using human hands.
- 4 (c) "Animal massage therapy" does not include making
- 5 a diagnosis; prescribing a drug, including a medicine or
- 6 biologic; performing surgery; performing chiropractic care; or
- 7 performing acupuncture.
- 8 Sec. 4. Section 169.3, subsection 12, Code 2023, is amended
- 9 by striking the subsection.
- 10 Sec. 5. Section 169.4, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2023,
- 11 is amended to read as follows:
- 12 A person may shall not practice veterinary medicine in the
- 13 state who is not a licensed veterinarian or the holder of a
- 14 valid temporary permit issued by the board. This chapter shall
- 15 not be construed to prohibit any of the following:
- 16 Sec. 6. Section 169.4, subsections 2 and 10, Code 2023, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 2. A person who is a veterinary student in an accredited
- 19 or approved college of veterinary medicine from performing
- 20 duties or actions assigned by instructors an instructor of
- 21 the college, or working acting under the direct supervision
- 22 direction of a licensed veterinarian or the supervision of a
- 23 supervising veterinarian as provided in subchapter II. The
- 24 board shall issue to any a veterinary medicine student who
- 25 attends an accredited veterinary medicine college or school
- 26 and who has been certified as being competent by an instructor
- 27 of such college or school to perform veterinary duties under
- 28 the direction of an instructor of veterinary medicine or under
- 29 the direct supervision direction of a licensed veterinarian or

- 3 Sec. 7. Section 169.4, subsection 9, Code 2023, is amended
- 4 by striking the subsection.
- 5 Sec. 8. Section 169.5, subsection 7, paragraph i, Code 2023,
- 6 is amended to read as follows:
- 7 i. Adopt, amend, or repeal rules relating to the
- 8 qualifications, standards of conduct for, and disciplinary
- 9 action of veterinary auxiliary personnel providing authorized
- 10 veterinary medical services to an animal patient under
- 11 subchapter II. The rules may provide for the testing of
- 12 veterinary technicians, and the revocation or suspension of
- 13 certificates issued to veterinary assistants technicians.
- 14 However, a certificate of registration shall not be suspended
- 15 or revoked by less than a two-thirds vote of the entire board
- 16 in a proceeding conducted in compliance with section 17A.12.

- 24 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 169.31 Subchapter definitions.
- 25 1. "Accredited or approved veterinary technology program"
- 26 means a program in veterinary technology that is accredited by
- 27 the American veterinary medical association and an accrediting
- 28 agency that has been approved by the United States department
- 29 of education or its successor.
- 30 2. "Direct supervision" means a level of supervision by
- 31 a supervising veterinarian that occurs when the supervising
- 32 veterinarian is readily available and on the premises where an
- 33 animal patient is being provided authorized veterinary medical
- 34 services by veterinary auxiliary personnel.
- 35 3. "Immediate supervision" means a level of supervision by

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- l a supervising veterinarian that occurs when the supervising
- 2 veterinarian is in the immediate area, and within audible and
- 3 visual range, of an animal patient and veterinary auxiliary
- 4 personnel providing the animal patient with authorized
- 5 veterinary medical services.
- 6 4. "Indirect supervision" means a level of supervision by
- 7 a supervising veterinarian, other than direct supervision or
- 8 immediate supervision, that occurs when all of the following
- 9 apply:
- 10 a. The supervising veterinarian is present within the
- 11 veterinarian's usual practice area.
- 12 b. The supervising veterinarian has given written protocols
- 13 or real-time oral instructions to veterinary auxiliary
- 14 personnel for the treatment of an animal for which a licensed
- 15 veterinarian and animal patient relationship exists.
- 16 c. The supervising veterinarian is readily available by
- 17 telephone or other means of immediate communication with the
- 18 veterinary auxiliary personnel providing the animal patient
- 19 with authorized veterinary medical services.
- 20 5. "Level of supervision" means direct supervision,
- 21 immediate supervision, or indirect supervision.
- 22 6. "Registered veterinary technician" means a veterinary
- 23 technician who has been issued a valid certificate of
- 24 registration by the board pursuant to section 169.34.
- 25 7. "Supervising veterinarian" means a licensed veterinarian
- 26 who assumes responsibility for supervising authorized
- 27 veterinary medical services provided to an animal patient
- 28 by veterinary auxiliary personnel acting under a level of
- 29 supervision by the licensed veterinarian.
- 30 8. a. "Veterinary assistant" means an individual employed
- 31 to work in veterinary practice who performs tasks at the
- 32 direction of a licensed veterinarian.
- 33 b. "Veterinary assistant" does not include a person who is a
- 34 licensed veterinarian or a veterinary technician, veterinary
- 35 student, or graduate from a foreign college of veterinary

1 medicine.

- 2 9. "Veterinary auxiliary personnel" means a registered
- 3 veterinary technician, a veterinary technician who is not
- 4 registered, a veterinary assistant, a veterinary student, or a
- 5 graduate of a foreign college of veterinary medicine subject to
- 6 the provisions of this subchapter.
- 7 10. "Veterinary student" means an individual currently
- 8 admitted and in good academic standing in an accredited or
- 9 approved college of veterinary medicine.
- 10 ll. "Veterinary technician" means an individual who has
- 11 graduated from an accredited or approved veterinary technology
- 12 program.
- 13 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 169.32 Supervising veterinarian.
- 14 l. A licensed veterinarian may provide veterinary medical
- 15 services to an animal patient by acting as a supervising
- 16 veterinarian exercising a level of supervision as provided in
- 17 this subchapter and rules adopted by the board pursuant to this
- 18 subchapter.
- 19 2. A licensed veterinarian shall not act as a supervising
- 20 veterinarian until the licensed veterinarian examines the
- 21 animal patient pursuant to acceptable practices established by
- 22 rules adopted by the board.
- 23 3. A supervising veterinarian shall determine the
- 24 applicable level of supervision required for veterinary
- 25 auxiliary personnel within the limits provided in this
- 26 subchapter and rules adopted by the board pursuant to this
- 27 subchapter. Based on that determination, the supervising
- 28 veterinarian shall decide the specific tasks to be delegated
- 29 to the veterinary auxiliary personnel within the limits of the
- 30 applicable level of supervision, subject to any applicable
- 31 rules adopted by the board, as provided in this subchapter.
- 32 The supervising veterinarian's decision must be based on
- 33 factors such as the veterinary auxiliary personnel's training,
- 34 experience, and skill. The supervising veterinarian is solely

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35 responsible for both the determination and decision.

- 1 Sec. 12. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 169.33 Veterinary auxiliary personnel 2 employment.
- A licensed veterinarian may employ any number of veterinary
- 4 auxiliary personnel who may be delegated tasks associated with
- 5 providing authorized veterinary medical services to an animal
- 6 patient within the limits provided in this subchapter and rules
- 7 adopted by the board pursuant to this subchapter.
- 8 Sec. 13. NEW SECTION. 169.34 Veterinary technician —
- 9 certificate of registration.
- 10 l. The board shall issue a certificate of registration to a
- 11 veterinary technician if all of the following apply:
- 12 a. The veterinary technician has received a passing score on
- 13 a national veterinary technician examination approved by the
- 14 board.
- 15 b. The veterinary technician has submitted a complete
- 16 application to the board that is approved by the board subject
- 17 to all of the following:
- 18 (1) The application must be in a form prescribed by the
- 19 board.
- 20 (2) To be complete, the application must include all of the
- 21 following:
- 22 (a) Information and material required by the board.
- 23 (b) A registration fee in an amount established by the
- 24 board.
- 25 (c) Proof as required by the board that the applicant meets
- 26 the requirements of a veterinary technician.
- 27 2. The board may issue an endorsed certificate of
- 28 registration to a veterinary technician if the veterinary
- 29 technician holds a valid registration, certificate, license, or
- 30 other authorization issued by a jurisdiction recognized by the
- 31 board, and all of the following apply:
- 32 a. The veterinary technician has been actively employed as a
- 33 veterinary technician in a jurisdiction recognized by the board
- 34 under section 169.35 for at least two thousand hours during the
- 35 five years preceding the filing of the application with the

1 board.

- 2 b. The veterinary technician has not previously failed and
- 3 not subsequently passed a veterinarian technician certification
- 4 examination.
- 5 c. The veterinary technician is not subject to an
- 6 investigation or disciplinary action which may result or has
- 7 resulted in the suspension or revocation of a registration,
- 8 certificate, license, or other authorization issued by a
- 9 jurisdiction recognized by the board.
- 10 d. The veterinary technician has submitted a complete
- 11 application to the board that is approved by the board.
- 12 (1) The application must be in a form prescribed by the
- 13 board.
- 14 (2) To be complete, the application must include all of the
- 15 following:
- 16 (a) Information and material required by the board.
- 17 (b) A registration fee in an amount established by the
- 18 board.
- 19 3. A certificate of registration issued to a veterinary
- 20 technician under this section does not expire.
- 21 4. A veterinary technician is subject to investigation and
- 22 disciplinary action taken by the board pursuant to section
- 23 272C.3. However, the board shall utilize the procedures set
- 24 forth in section 169.14.
- 25 Sec. 14. NEW SECTION. 169.35 Credentials of veterinary
- 26 technicians.
- 27 l. The board shall recognize credentials of veterinary
- 28 technicians issued by another state, a United States territory,
- 29 and a province of Canada. The board may recognize credentials
- 30 of veterinary technicians issued by other jurisdictions.
- 31 2. a. A person shall not use any recognized title,
- 32 abbreviation, or sign to indicate that such person is a
- 33 registered veterinary technician unless that person is an
- 34 individual who has been issued a certificate of registration
- 35 pursuant to section 169.34.

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- b. A person who violates paragraph "a" commits a simple
 misdemeanor.
- 3 Sec. 15. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 169.36 Veterinary technician scope 4 of authority.
- A veterinary technician shall only perform tasks
- 6 associated with providing authorized veterinary medical
- 7 services to an animal patient under the level of supervision
- 8 determined by the board according to rules adopted by the
- 9 board under this subchapter. The board may determine a lower
- 10 level of supervision is required for registered veterinary
- 11 technicians. The board shall adopt rules designating types
- 12 of tasks that a veterinary technician may perform under a
- 13 determined level of supervision.
- 14 2. A veterinary technician shall not do any of the
- 15 following:
- 16 a. Treat floating teeth.
- 17 b. Provide for the closure of surgical wounds and
- 18 lacerations.
- 19 c. Perform treatments for gingival resection.
- 20 3. A supervising veterinarian shall decide the specific
- 21 tasks delegated to a veterinary technician for a determined
- 22 level of supervision pursuant to section 169.32.
- 23 4. A licensed veterinarian who employs a veterinary
- 24 technician shall alone owe the veterinarian technician the
- 25 amount required to be paid in exchange for performing the
- 26 delegated task.
- 27 Sec. 16. NEW SECTION. 169.37 Veterinary assistant scope
- 28 of authority.
- 29 1. A veterinary assistant shall only perform tasks
- 30 associated with providing authorized veterinary medical
- 31 services to an animal patient under the direct supervision of a
- 32 licensed veterinarian. The board shall adopt rules designating
- 33 types of tasks that a veterinary assistant may perform under
- 34 that determined level of supervision.
- 35 2. A veterinary assistant shall not do any of the following:

- 1 a. Treat floating teeth.
- 2 b. Provide for the closure of surgical wounds and
- 3 lacerations.
- 4 c. Perform gingival resection.
- 5 3. A supervising veterinarian shall decide the specific
- 6 tasks delegated to a veterinary assistant for the determined
- 7 level of supervision pursuant to section 169.32.
- 8 Sec. 17. NEW SECTION. 169.38 Veterinary student scope
- 9 of authority.
- 10 l. A veterinary student shall only perform tasks associated
- ll with providing authorized veterinary medical services to an
- 12 animal patient under the level of supervision determined by the
- 13 supervising veterinarian. The determination shall be based
- 14 on the number of academic years successfully completed by the
- 15 veterinary student.
- 16 2. A supervising veterinarian shall decide the specific
- 17 tasks delegated to a veterinary student for the determined
- 18 level of supervision pursuant to section 169.32.
- 19 Sec. 18. NEW SECTION. 169.39 Graduate from foreign college
- 20 of veterinary medicine scope of authority.
- 21 1. A graduate from a foreign college of veterinary
- 22 medicine shall only perform tasks associated with providing
- 23 authorized veterinary medical services to an animal patient
- 24 under the level of supervision determined by the supervising
- 25 veterinarian. The determination shall be based on whether the
- 26 graduate from a foreign college of veterinary medicine holds an
- 27 ECFVG certificate.
- 28 2. A supervising veterinarian shall decide the specific
- 29 tasks delegated to a graduate from a foreign college of
- 30 veterinary medicine for the determined level of supervision
- 31 pursuant to section 169.32.
- 32 Sec. 19. Section 714.8, Code 2023, is amended by adding the
- 33 following new subsection:
- 34 NEW SUBSECTION. 22. a. Practicing veterinary medicine
- 35 without a valid license or temporary permit issued by the board

- 1 of veterinary medicine pursuant to chapter 169, as described
- 2 in section 169.19.
- 3 b. Acting as a supervising veterinarian, by providing
- 4 veterinary medical services to an animal patient in violation
- 5 of chapter 169, subchapter II, as described in section 169.19.
- 6 Sec. 20. REPEAL. Section 169.20, Code 2023, is repealed.
- 7 Sec. 21. CODE EDITOR DIRECTIVES. The Code editor shall do
- 8 all of the following:
- 9 1. Create a new subchapter in chapter 169 that includes
- 10 sections 169.1 through 169.30.
- 11 2. Create a new subchapter in chapter 169 that includes
- 12 sections 169.31 through 169.39, as enacted in this Act.
- 3. Correct internal references in the Code and in any
- 14 enacted legislation as necessary due to the enactment of this
- 15 section.
- 16 Sec. 22. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES. The board of veterinary
- 17 medicine shall submit a notice of intended action to the
- 18 administrative rules coordinator and the Iowa administrative
- 19 code editor pursuant to section 17A.4, subsection 1, paragraph
- 20 "a", not later than September 1, 2023, for the adoption of
- 21 rules required to implement this Act.
- 22 Sec. 23. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section of this Act requiring
- 23 the board of veterinary medicine to submit a notice of intended
- 24 action for the adoption of rules, being deemed of immediate
- 25 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- 27 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 29 GENERAL. This bill amends the "Iowa Veterinary Practice
- 30 Act" (Code chapter 169) regulating the practice of veterinary
- 31 medicine by individuals receiving a doctor of veterinary
- 32 medicine degree or equivalent (veterinarians) (amended Code
- 33 section 162.3) and licensed by the Iowa board of veterinary
- 34 medicine (board) by examination or endorsement (licensed
- 35 veterinarians) (Code sections 169.4, 169.9, and 169.10). The

- 1 board may issue a temporary permit to certain members of the
- 2 college of veterinary medicine of Iowa state university of
- 3 science and technology or persons waiting to be licensed (Code
- 4 sections 169.4 and 169.11). The bill provides definitions
- 5 of terms used throughout the Code chapter and creates a
- 6 new subchapter authorizing certain individuals to provide
- 7 authorized veterinary medical services to animals in a manner
- 8 that would otherwise constitute the practice of veterinary
- 9 medicine, so long as the authorized veterinary medical services
- 10 are provided under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian
- 11 (supervising veterinarian).
- 12 DEFINITIONS. The bill amends the term "animal" to expressly
- 13 include livestock. The bill provides new definitions for
- 14 the terms "diagnosis" and "surgery". The bill rewrites the
- 15 definition of "practice of veterinary medicine" to include
- 16 an action taken for compensation that involves providing
- 17 authorized veterinary medical services to animals, including by
- 18 providing a diagnosis or treatment, prescribing, dispensing,
- 19 or administering or ordering the administration of a drug or
- 20 appliance, or taking an action associated with the prevention,
- 21 cure, or relief of disease or injury. The term does not
- 22 include taking an action under the direction of a supervising
- 23 veterinarian or practicing animal massage therapy (amended Code
- 24 section 169.3).
- 25 SUPERVISION BY LICENSED VETERINARIAN VETERINARY AUXILIARY
- 26 PERSONNEL. The bill provides that a licensed veterinarian
- 27 may act as a supervising veterinarian directing certain
- 28 individuals in performing delegated tasks under different
- 29 levels of supervision. Such an individual is classified as a
- 30 veterinary auxiliary personnel and includes (1) a veterinary
- 31 technician who has graduated from an accredited or approved
- 32 veterinary technology program, (2) a veterinary assistant who
- 33 has not graduated from that program, (3) a veterinary student
- 34 attending a college of veterinary medicine, and (4) a graduate
- 35 of a foreign college of veterinary medicine. The levels of

- 1 supervision allowing a supervising veterinarian to delegate
- 2 tasks to veterinary auxiliary personnel include: (1) direct
- 3 supervision in which the supervising veterinarian is on the
- 4 premises where the animal patient is being cared for, (2)
- 5 immediate supervision in which a supervising veterinarian is
- 6 in the immediate area of the animal patient, and (3) indirect
- 7 supervision in which a supervising veterinarian is available by
- 8 telephone or other means of immediate communication.
- 9 SUPERVISION BY LICENSED VETERINARIAN DUTY. A licensed
- 10 veterinarian cannot act as a supervising veterinarian until
- ll examining the animal patient. A supervising veterinarian must
- 12 decide the applicable level of supervision subject to the
- 13 requirements in the bill and the tasks that may be delegated to
- 14 the veterinary auxiliary personnel which may be based on the
- 15 level of supervision required and the training, experience, and
- 16 skill of the veterinary auxiliary personnel (new Code section
- 17 169.32).
- 18 VETERINARY AUXILIARY PERSONNEL CERTIFICATION OF
- 19 VETERINARY TECHNICIAN. The bill provides for the board's
- 20 certification of veterinary technicians as registered
- 21 veterinary technicians. An application may be based on
- 22 either: (1) passing a national exam (veterinary technician
- 23 national examination or "VTNE") or (2) by endorsement when the
- 24 applicant veterinary technician has been actively employed as a
- 25 veterinarian technician in another jurisdiction for at least
- 26 2,000 hours during the prior five years. In each case, the
- 27 application must be completed as required by the board and
- 28 include a fee for an amount established by the board (new Code
- 29 section 169.34). The bill provides that a person who is not
- 30 registered commits a simple misdemeanor by wrongfully claiming
- 31 to hold such a credential.
- 32 VETERINARY AUXILIARY PERSONNEL SCOPE OF AUTHORITY. Each
- 33 type of veterinary auxiliary personnel is subject to its own
- 34 level of supervision which includes associated tasks that
- 35 may be delegated. For a veterinary technician, the level is

- 1 established by rules adopted by the board which also provides
- 2 for associated tasks that may be delegated. For a veterinary
- 3 assistant, the level is restricted to direct supervision and
- 4 the board by rule provides for associated tasks that may be
- 5 delegated. For a veterinary student, the level of supervision
- 6 and the associated tasks that may be delegated are determined
- 7 by the supervising veterinarian based on the number of academic
- 8 years that the student has successfully completed. For a
- 9 graduate from a foreign college of veterinary medicine, the
- 10 level of supervision and associated tasks that may be delegated
- 11 are also determined by the supervising veterinarian based on
- 12 whether the graduate holds a current certificate issued by the
- 13 American veterinary medical association educational commission
- 14 for foreign veterinary graduates (ECFVG).
- 15 ADMINISTRATIVE RULES. The bill requires the board to begin
- 16 the process of adopting rules required to implement the bill's
- 17 provisions by September 1, 2023. These provisions take effect
- 18 upon enactment.
- 19 PROHIBITIONS. A person who acts in violation of
- 20 requirements governing veterinary medicine may be guilty of
- 21 a fraudulent practice. This includes practicing veterinary
- 22 medicine without a valid license or temporary permit (Code
- 23 sections 169.4, 169.11, and 714.8). The bill provides that it
- 24 also includes a supervising veterinarian who knowingly wrongly
- 25 utilizes veterinary auxiliary personnel to provide medical care
- 26 to an animal (amended Code sections 169.19 and 714.8).
- 27 PENALTIES. A simple misdemeanor is punishable by
- 28 confinement for no more than 30 days and a fine of at least \$105
- 29 but not more than \$855. The penalties for fraudulent practice
- 30 range from a simple misdemeanor to a class "C" felony depending
- 31 upon the amount of money or value of the property involved. A
- 32 serious misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more
- 33 than one year and a fine of at least \$430 but not more than
- 34 \$2,560. An aggravated misdemeanor is punishable by confinement
- 35 for no more than two years and a fine of at least \$855 but

- 1 not more than \$8,540. A class "D" felony is punishable by
- 2 confinement for no more than five years and a fine of at least
- 3 \$1,025 but not more than \$10,245. A class "C" felony is
- 4 punishable by confinement for no more than 10 years and a fine
- 5 of at least \$1,370 but not more than \$13,660 (Code sections
- 6 714.8 to 714.14).
