1 DIVISION I 2 MEDICAID EXTENDED POSTPARTUM COVERAGE 3 Section 1. MEDICAID EXTENDED POSTPARTUM COVERAGE The department of health and human services shall 4 OPTION. 5 submit a Medicaid state plan amendment to the centers for 6 Medicare and Medicaid services of the United States department 7 of health and human services for approval of the option 8 to provide twelve months of continuous postpartum coverage 9 under the Medicaid program to pregnant women enrolled in the 10 Medicaid program in accordance with sections 9812 and 9822 11 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 12 117-2, as amended by section 5113 of the federal Consolidated 13 Appropriations Act of 2023. Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act, being 14 15 deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment. 16 DIVISION II POSTPARTUM COVERAGE APPROPRIATION 17 Sec. 3. MEDICAID EXTENDED POSTPARTUM COVERAGE -18 19 APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the general fund of 20 the state to the department of human services for the following 21 fiscal years, the following amounts or so much thereof as is 22 necessary to fund extended postpartum coverage to pregnant 23 women enrolled in the Medicaid program in accordance with this 24 Act: 25 FY 2023-2024: 26 5,588,660 \$ 27 FY 2024-2025: 8,878,785 28 ····· \$ 29 EXPLANATION 30 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 31 32 DIVISION I — MEDICAID EXTENDED POSTPARTUM COVERAGE. Under 33 current federal law, pregnant Medicaid beneficiaries are 34 eligible for at least pregnancy-related services through the 35 end of the month in which the 60-day period beginning on the

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1 last day of the pregnancy ends.

Provisions of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (H.R. 1319) provide the option to states to submit a state plan amendment to provide postpartum Medicaid coverage for 12 months after the end of a pregnancy for a five-year period. A provision under the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 removed the five-year limitation.

8 This division of the bill requires the department of health 9 and human services (HHS) to submit a Medicaid state plan 10 amendment to the centers for Medicare and Medicaid services of 11 the United States department of health and human services for 12 approval of the new option to provide 12 months of continuous 13 postpartum coverage under the Medicaid program to pregnant 14 women enrolled in the Medicaid program.

15 The division of the bill takes effect upon enactment. 16 DIVISION II — MEDICAID EXTENDED POSTPARTUM COVERAGE — 17 APPROPRIATION. This division of the bill appropriates moneys 18 from the general fund of the state to HHS for FY 2023-2024 and 19 FY 2024-2025 for the state costs of postpartum coverage under 20 the Medicaid program.

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
