A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the Medicaid extended postpartum coverage
- 2 option, and including effective date provisions.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 249A.3, subsection 1, paragraph h, Code 2 2024, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 h. Is a woman who, while pregnant, meets eligibility
- 4 requirements for assistance under the federal Social Security
- 5 Act, section 1902(1), and continues to meet the requirements
- 6 except for income. The woman is eligible to receive assistance
- 7 until sixty days twelve months after the date pregnancy ends.
- 8 Sec. 2. MEDICAID PREGNANT WOMEN CONTINUOUS POSTPARTUM
- 9 COVERAGE STATE PLAN AMENDMENT. The department of health and
- 10 human services shall submit a Medicaid state plan amendment to
- 11 the centers for Medicare and Medicaid services of the United
- 12 States department of health and human services (CMS) for
- 13 approval of the option to provide twelve months of continuous
- 14 postpartum coverage under the Medicaid program to pregnant
- 15 women enrolled in the Medicaid program in accordance with
- 16 sections 9812 and 9822 of the federal American Rescue Plan
- 17 Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, as amended by section 5113
- 18 of the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The
- 19 department shall notify the Code editor upon receipt of federal
- 20 approval of the Medicaid state plan amendment.
- 21 Sec. 3. IMPLEMENTATION. The section of this Act amending
- 22 section 249A.3, subsection 1, paragraph "h", shall be
- 23 implemented upon receipt by the department of health and human
- 24 services of federal approval of the state plan amendment
- 25 submitted by the department as specified in this Act.
- 26 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. The following, being deemed of
- 27 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment:
- 28 The section of this Act directing the department of health
- 29 and human services to submit a state plan amendment to CMS as
- 30 specified in this Act.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 34 This bill provides for the extension of postpartum coverage
- 35 from 60 days to 12 months for pregnant women enrolled in the

- 1 Medicaid program.
- 2 Code section 249A.3(1)(h) provides Medicaid eligibility for
- 3 a woman who while pregnant meets federally required eligibility
- 4 requirements and continues to meet those requirements, except
- 5 for income, to receive assistance until 60 days after pregnancy
- 6 ends. Provisions of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
- 7 2021 (H.R. 1319) provide the option to states to submit a
- 8 state plan amendment, effective for a five-year period, to
- 9 provide postpartum Medicaid coverage for 12 months after the
- 10 end of a pregnancy. A provision under the federal Consolidated
- 11 Appropriations Act of 2023 removed the five-year limitation
- 12 period for the state plan amendment. The bill amends Code
- 13 section 249A.3(1)(h) to extend postpartum coverage from 60 days
- 14 to 12 months after pregnancy ends.
- 15 The bill requires the department of health and human
- 16 services (HHS) to submit a Medicaid state plan amendment to
- 17 the centers for Medicare and Medicaid services of the United
- 18 States department of health and human services for approval
- 19 in accordance with the provisions in federal law to provide
- 20 continuous eligibility to a pregnant women until 12 months
- 21 after pregnancy ends under the Medicaid program.
- 22 The section of the bill directing HHS to submit a state
- 23 plan amendment to the federal government for approval takes
- 24 effect upon enactment. The section of the bill amending
- 25 Code provisions relating to postpartum Medicaid eligibility
- 26 for pregnant women takes effect July 1, 2024, and shall be
- 27 implemented upon receipt of federal approval by HHS.
