A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the term sex and related terms for purposes
- 2 of statutory construction, including an indication of
- a person's sex on certain vital records and on certain
- 4 applications and identification cards.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **4.1A Statutory construction** — sex 2 and related terms.

- 3 1. In the construction of statutes, the following rules
- 4 shall be observed with regard to a person's biological sex:
- 5 a. "Sex" means a person's biological sex, either male or
- 6 female, at birth, unless otherwise provided by law.
- 7 b. A "female" is a person whose biological reproductive
- 8 system is developed to produce ova and a "male" is a person
- 9 whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize
- 10 the ova of a female.
- 11 c. The term "woman" or "girl" refers to a female and the
- 12 term "man" or "boy" refers to a male.
- 13 d. The term "mother" means a parent who is female and the
- 14 term "father" means a parent who is male.
- 15 e. The term "equal" does not mean "same" or "identical".
- 16 f. Separate accommodations are not inherently unequal.
- 17 g. A person born with a medically verifiable diagnosis of
- 18 disorder or difference of sex development shall be provided the
- 19 legal protections and accommodations afforded under the federal
- 20 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and applicable state
- 21 law.
- 22 2. Any state law, policy, or program that prohibits
- 23 discrimination on the basis of sex shall be construed to forbid
- 24 unfair treatment of females or males in relation to similarly
- 25 situated members of the opposite sex.
- 26 3. Notwithstanding any provision of state law to the
- 27 contrary, distinctions based on sex, including but not limited
- 28 to in prisons or other detention facilities, domestic violence
- 29 shelters, rape crisis centers, locker rooms, restrooms, and in
- 30 other contexts where health, safety, or privacy are implicated
- 31 resulting in separate accommodations, are substantially related
- 32 to the important government objectives of protecting the
- 33 health, safety, and privacy of the persons in these contexts.
- 34 4. Any state department or subunit of a department, or any
- 35 political subdivision of the state including a city, county,

- 1 township, or school district that collects vital statistics for
- 2 the purpose of complying with state antidiscrimination laws,
- 3 or for the purpose of gathering accurate state public health,
- 4 crime, economic, or other data, shall identify the sex of each
- 5 person included in the collected data as either male or female.
- 6 5. For the purposes of this section, "state law" includes
- 7 any state statute or rule.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 144.13, Code 2024, is amended by adding the
- 9 following new subsection:
- 10 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. A certificate of birth filed under this
- 11 section shall include a designation of the sex of the person as
- 12 defined in section 4.1A.
- 13 Sec. 3. Section 144.23, Code 2024, is amended to read as
- 14 follows:
- 15 144.23 State registrar to issue establish new certificate of
- 16 birth.
- 17 l. The state registrar shall establish a new certificate of
- 18 birth for a person born in this state, when the state registrar
- 19 receives the following:
- 20 1. An adoption report as provided in section 144.19, or
- 21 a certified copy of the decree of adoption together with the
- 22 information necessary to identify the original certificate of
- 23 birth and to establish a new certificate of birth.
- 24 2. b. A request that a new certificate be established and
- 25 evidence proving that the person for whom the new certificate
- 26 is requested has been legitimated, or that a court of competent
- 27 jurisdiction has determined the paternity of the person.
- 28 3. c. A notarized affidavit by a licensed physician and
- 29 surgeon or osteopathic physician and surgeon stating that by
- 30 reason of surgery or other treatment by the licensee, the
- 31 sex designation of the person has been changed. The state
- 32 registrar may make a further investigation or require further
- 33 information necessary to determine whether a sex change has
- 34 occurred.
- 35 2. a. Pursuant to section 4.1A, a new certificate of birth

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- 1 established under subsection 1, paragraph a or b, shall
- 2 include a designation of the sex of the person, as male or
- 3 female, at birth.
- 4 b. Pursuant to section 4.1A, a new certificate of birth
- 5 established under subsection 1, paragraph c, following a
- 6 change in sex designation, shall include a designation of the
- 7 sex of the person, as male or female, both at the time of birth
- 8 and at the time the new certificate of birth is established.
- 9 Sec. 4. Section 144.24, subsections 1 and 2, Code 2024, are
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 1. If a new certificate of birth is established, the actual
- 12 place and date of birth shall be shown on the certificate and
- 13 the certificate shall include a designation of the person's
- 14 sex pursuant to section 144.23. The certificate shall be
- 15 substituted for the original certificate of birth.
- 16 2. Following substitution of the original certificate of
- 17 birth with a new certificate of birth, the original certificate
- 18 and the evidence of adoption, paternity, or legitimation, or
- 19 sex change shall not be subject to inspection except under
- 20 order of a court of competent jurisdiction, including but
- 21 not limited to an order issued pursuant to section 600.16A,
- 22 as provided in section 144.23A or 144.24A, or as provided by
- 23 administrative rule for statistical or administrative purposes 24 only.
- 25 Sec. 5. Section 321.182, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 26 2024, is amended to read as follows:
- 27 a. Make application on a form provided by the department
- 28 which shall include the applicant's full name, signature,
- 29 current mailing address, current residential address, date
- 30 of birth, social security number, and physical description
- 31 including sex, height, and eye color. The application may
- 32 contain other information the department may require by rule.
- 33 Pursuant to procedures established by the department and for
- 34 an applicant who is a foreign national temporarily present in
- 35 this state, the department may waive the requirement that the

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- 1 application include the applicant's social security number.
- 2 For the purposes of this paragraph, "sex" means the same as
- 3 defined in section 4.1A. If the applicant evidences through
- 4 a notarized affidavit by a licensed physician and surgeon or
- 5 osteopathic physician and surgeon that by reason of surgery or
- 6 other treatment the applicant's sex designation has changed,
- 7 the application shall reflect the sex designation of the person
- 8 both at the time of birth and at the time the application is
- 9 made.
- 10 Sec. 6. Section 321.189, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 11 2024, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 a. Appearing on the driver's license shall be a
- 13 distinguishing number assigned to the licensee; the licensee's
- 14 full name, date of birth, sex, and residence address; a color
- 15 photograph; a physical description of the licensee; the name of
- 16 the state; the dates of issuance and expiration; and the usual
- 17 signature of the licensee. The license shall identify the
- 18 class of vehicle the licensee may operate and the applicable
- 19 endorsements and restrictions which the department shall
- 20 require by rule. For the purposes of this paragraph, "sex"
- 21 means the same as defined in section 4.1A. If the applicant
- 22 evidences through a notarized affidavit by a licensed physician
- 23 and surgeon or osteopathic physician that by reason of surgery
- 24 or other treatment the applicant's sex designation has changed,
- 25 the license shall reflect the sex designation of the person
- 26 both at the time of birth and at the time the application is
- 27 made under section 321.182.
- Sec. 7. Section 321.190, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 29 2024, is amended to read as follows:
- 30 a. (1) The department shall, upon application and payment
- 31 of the required fee, issue to an applicant a nonoperator's
- 32 identification card. To be valid the card shall bear a
- 33 distinguishing number other than a social security number
- 34 assigned to the cardholder, the full name, date of birth,
- 35 sex, residence address, a physical description and a color

- 1 photograph of the cardholder, the usual signature of the
- 2 cardholder, and such other information as the department
- 3 may require by rule. An applicant for a nonoperator's
- 4 identification card shall apply for the card in the manner
- 5 provided in section 321.182, subsections 1 through 3. For
- 6 the purposes of this paragraph, "sex" means the same as
- 7 defined in section 4.1A. If the applicant evidences through
- 8 a notarized affidavit by a licensed physician and surgeon or
- 9 osteopathic physician and surgeon that by reason of surgery or
- 10 other treatment the applicant's sex designation has changed,
- 11 the nonoperator's identification card shall reflect the sex
- 12 designation of the person both at the time of birth and at the
- 13 time the application is made.
- 14 (2) The card shall be issued to the applicant at the time of
- 15 application pursuant to procedures established by rule.
- 16 (3) An applicant for a nonoperator's identification card
- 17 who is required by 50 U.S.C. app. §451 et seq. to register with
- 18 the United States selective service system shall be registered
- 19 by the department with the selective service system as provided
- 20 in section 321.183.
- 21 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 24 This bill relates to the term sex and related terms for
- 25 purposes of statutory construction.
- The bill creates a new Code section 4.1A (statutory
- 27 construction sex and related terms). The bill provides
- 28 that certain rules of statutory construction shall be observed
- 29 with regard to a person's sex. These rules with regard to a
- 30 person's sex include:
- 31 1. "Sex" means a person's biological sex, either male or
- 32 female, at birth, unless otherwise provided by law.
- 33 2. A "female" is a person whose biological reproductive
- 34 system is developed to produce ova and a "male" is a person
- 35 whose biological reproductive system is developed to fertilize

1 the ova of a female.

- 2 3. The term "woman" or "girl" refers to a female and the 3 term "man" or "boy" refers to a male.
- 4 4. The term "mother" means a parent who is female and the 5 term "father" means a parent who is male.
- 6 5. The term "equal" does not mean "same" or "identical".
- Separate accommodations are not inherently unequal.
- 8 7. A person born with a medically verifiable diagnosis of
- 9 disorder or difference of sex development shall be provided the
- 10 legal protections and accommodations afforded under the federal
- 11 Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and applicable state
- 12 law.
- 13 Additionally, under the bill, any state law, policy, or
- 14 program that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex shall
- 15 be construed to forbid unfair treatment of females or males in
- 16 relation to similarly situated members of the opposite sex.
- 17 Notwithstanding any provision of state law to the contrary,
- 18 distinctions based on sex in various contexts where health,
- 19 safety, or privacy are implicated resulting in separate
- 20 accommodations, are substantially related to the important
- 21 government objectives of protecting the health, safety, and
- 22 privacy of the persons in these contexts. In addition, any
- 23 state department or subunit of a department, or any political
- 24 subdivision of the state including a city, county, township,
- 25 or school district that collects vital statistics for the
- 26 purpose of complying with state antidiscrimination laws or for
- 27 the purpose of gathering accurate state public health, crime,
- 28 economic, or other data, shall identify the sex of each person
- 29 included in the collected data as either male or female.
- The bill defines "state law" for the purposes of new Code
- 31 section 4.1A.
- 32 The bill also amends provisions under Code chapter 144
- 33 (vital statistics). The bill requires that an original
- 34 certificate of birth shall include a designation of the sex of
- 35 the person as defined in new Code section 4.1A. With regard

1 to a new certificate of birth, if a new certificate of birth

- 2 is established after the state registrar receives an adoption
- 3 report or a certified copy of an adoption decree or following
- 4 a determination of paternity, the new certificate of birth
- 5 shall include a designation of sex of the person at birth;
- 6 and if a new certificate of birth is established after the
- 7 state registrar receives a notarized affidavit by a licensed
- 8 physician and surgeon or osteopathic physician and surgeon
- 9 stating that by reason of surgery or other treatment by the
- 10 licensee, the sex designation of the person has been changed,
- 11 the new certificate of birth shall include a designation of the
- 12 sex of the person both at the time of birth and at the time of
- 13 establishment of the new certificate of birth.
- 14 The bill amends provisions in Code chapter 321 (motor
- 15 vehicles and law of the road) to define "sex" the same as in
- 16 new Code section 4.1A for the purposes of including the sex of
- 17 the person in an application for a license or a nonoperator's
- 18 identification card, and on a person's driver's license or
- 19 nonoperator's identification card.
- 20 If an applicant for a driver's license or a nonoperator's
- 21 identification card evidences through a notarized affidavit
- 22 by a licensed physician and surgeon or osteopathic physician
- 23 and surgeon that by reason of surgery or other treatment the
- 24 applicant's sex designation has changed, the applications and
- 25 the driver's license and nonoperator's identification card
- 26 shall reflect the sex designation of the person both at the
- 27 time of birth and at the time the application is made.
