## A BILL FOR

An Act prohibiting the expenditure of certain public moneys
for dues or membership fees to high school organizations
that do not meet certain requirements concerning school
classifications for extracurricular interscholastic
activities.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 280.13D Limitation on expenditure
of certain public moneys for high school organizations — school
classifications.

4 1. For the purposes of this section:

5 a. "Extracurricular interscholastic activity" means a contest 6 or competition for academics, arts, music, speech, or sports 7 between different schools and outside the regular scope of a 8 school's curriculum.

9 b. "Organization" means a corporation, association, 10 or organization which has as one of its primary purposes 11 the sponsoring or administration of an extracurricular 12 interscholastic activity, but does not include an agency of 13 this state, a public or private school or school board, or an 14 athletic conference or other association whose interscholastic 15 contests or competitions do not include more than twenty-four 16 schools.

2. On or after January 1, 2024, a school district or a harter school shall not expend any moneys, and an accredited or unaccredited nonpublic school shall not expend any moneys originating from the state, to pay dues or membership fees to an organization unless the organization, for each school year beginning on or after July 1, 2023, classifies, for the purposes of an extracurricular interscholastic activity, each school participating in an extracurricular interscholastic school participating in an extracurricular interscholastic to subsection 3, and the school's recent performance in a respective extracurricular interscholastic activity.

3. Each extracurricular interscholastic activity team shall provide an organization with a roster of the students participating on such team at a time prior to the beginning of the season for the extracurricular interscholastic activity. The team's adjusted enrollment number shall be calculated by adding up the total points for each student on the roster. Points shall be determined in the following manner: *a.* For public schools, not including charter schools:

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(1) If a student and at least one of that student's parent
2 or guardian live in the school district in which the student
3 participates in the extracurricular interscholastic activity,
4 the student is zero points.

5 (2) If a student or at least one of that student's parent 6 or guardian does not live in the school district in which the 7 student participates in the extracurricular interscholastic 8 activity but the student has been registered as a student in 9 that district since seventh grade, the student is one point.

10 (3) A student that does not meet the requirements of 11 subparagraph (1) or (2) is two points.

12 b. For nonpublic schools and charter schools:

13 (1) If a student has continuously attended an educational 14 system associated with the school in which the student 15 participates in the extracurricular interscholastic activity 16 beginning from a time the student entered seventh grade, the 17 student is zero points.

18 (2) If a student has continuously attended an educational 19 system associated with the school in which the student 20 participates in the extracurricular interscholastic activity 21 beginning from a time the student entered tenth grade, the 22 student is one point.

23 (3) A student that does not meet the requirements of24 subparagraph (1) or (2) is two points.

25 c. This subsection shall be applied on a per extracurricular 26 interscholastic activity basis.

An organization shall evaluate classifications pursuant
to this section a minimum of once every two school years.
EXPLANATION

32 This bill relates to the expenditure of public moneys for 33 dues or membership fees to high school organizations that do 34 not meet certain requirements concerning school classifications 35 for extracurricular interscholastic activities.

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1 The bill defines "extracurricular interscholastic activity" 2 as a contest or competition for academics, arts, music, speech, 3 or sports between different schools and outside the regular 4 scope of a school's curriculum.

The bill defines "organization" as a corporation, 5 6 association, or organization which has as one of its primary 7 purposes the sponsoring or administration of an extracurricular 8 interscholastic activity, but does not include an agency of 9 this state, a public or private school or school board, or an 10 athletic conference or other association whose interscholastic ll contests or competitions do not include more than 24 schools. 12 The bill prohibits a school district or charter school 13 from expending any moneys to pay dues or membership fees to 14 a high school organization after January 1, 2024, unless 15 the organization, for the purposes of an extracurricular 16 interscholastic activity, classifies each school participating 17 in an extracurricular interscholastic activity for each 18 school year beginning on or after July 1, 2023, based on the 19 adjusted enrollment and the school's recent performance in 20 the respective extracurricular interscholastic activity. 21 Adjusted enrollment is based on the total point value of 22 the roster of students participating in the extracurricular 23 interscholastic activity team. Point values for public school, 24 not including charter school, students are based on a student 25 and the student's parent or guardian's residence and how long 26 the students have been registered at a school. Point values 27 for nonpublic school and charter school students are based 28 on how long a student has been registered in a school system 29 associated with the nonpublic school in which the student 30 participates in extracurricular interscholastic activities. 31 Schools must provide rosters to an organization at a time 32 prior to the beginning of competitions for a school year. 33 Classifications based on performance must be applied on a 34 per extracurricular interscholastic activity basis and must 35 be evaluated by the organization a minimum of once every two

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school years. The bill contains a similar requirement for the
expenditure of any moneys originating from the state by an
accredited or unaccredited nonpublic school.

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
