## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing credit for accrued sick leave for certain
- 2 law enforcement officers and making a state mandate
- 3 inapplicable.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **70A.23A** Credit for accrued sick 2 leave law enforcement officers.
- 3 1. For purposes of this section:
- 4 a. "Eligible retirement system" means a retirement system
- 5 authorized under chapter 97B or 411.
- 6 b. "Eligible law enforcement officer" means a law enforcement
- 7 officer eligible to receive retirement benefits under an
- 8 eligible retirement system on or after July 1, 2023.
- 9 c. "Law enforcement officer" means a law enforcement
- 10 officer, as defined in section 80B.3, who is not authorized to
- ll receive credit for accrued sick leave as provided in section
- 12 70A.23.
- 2. An eligible law enforcement officer, excluding a law
- 14 enforcement officer covered under a collective bargaining
- 15 agreement which provides otherwise, who retires and has applied
- 16 for retirement benefits under an eligible retirement system,
- 17 or who dies while in active employment, shall be credited with
- 18 the number of accrued days of sick leave of the law enforcement
- 19 officer. The law enforcement officer, or the law enforcement
- 20 officer's estate, shall receive a cash payment of the monetary
- 21 value of the officer's accrued sick leave balance, not to
- 22 exceed two thousand dollars. The value of the officer's
- 23 accrued sick leave balance shall be calculated by multiplying
- 24 the number of hours of accrued sick leave by the officer's
- 25 regular hourly rate of pay at the time of retirement.
- 26 3. a. An eligible law enforcement officer, excluding an
- 27 officer covered under a collective bargaining agreement which
- 28 provides otherwise, who retires and receives a payment as
- 29 provided in subsection 2, shall be entitled to elect to have
- 30 the officer's available remaining value of sick leave used to
- 31 pay the employer's share for the officer's continuation of
- 32 group health insurance coverage pursuant to the requirements
- 33 of this subsection.
- 34 b. An eligible law enforcement officer's available remaining
- 35 value of sick leave shall be available to pay for that portion

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- 1 of the officer's group health insurance premium that would
- 2 otherwise be paid for by the employer if the officer were still
- 3 employed by the employer. The benefits provided for in this
- 4 subsection have no cash value and are not transferable to any
- 5 other person, including the retiree's spouse. Payment of group
- 6 health insurance premiums pursuant to this subsection continues
- 7 until the earliest of when the eligible law enforcement
- 8 officer's available remaining value of sick leave is exhausted,
- 9 the officer otherwise becomes eligible for federal Medicare
- 10 program benefits, or the officer dies. In addition, a law
- 11 enforcement officer electing benefits pursuant to this
- 12 subsection who is reinstated or reemployed in a permanent full-
- 13 time or permanent part-time position by the law enforcement
- 14 officer's previous government employer forfeits any remaining
- 15 benefits for payment of group health insurance benefits, and
- 16 such law enforcement officer is not eligible for restoration
- 17 of the unused sick leave accrued during the law enforcement
- 18 officer's prior employment with the employer.
- 19 Sec. 2. IMPLEMENTATION OF ACT. Section 25B.2, subsection
- 20 3, shall not apply to this Act.
- 21 EXPLANATION
- 22 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 24 This bill provides credit for accrued sick leave for certain
- 25 retired law enforcement officers.
- New Code section 70A.23A, providing credit for accrued sick
- 27 leave, defines an "eligible law enforcement officer" as a law
- 28 enforcement officer who is eligible to receive retirement
- 29 benefits under a retirement system under Code chapter 97B
- 30 or 411 on or after July 1, 2023. The bill defines "law
- 31 enforcement officer" to mean as provided in Code section 80B.3,
- 32 excluding those authorized to receive credit for accrued sick
- 33 leave under Code section 70A.23.
- 34 The new Code section provides that an eligible law
- 35 enforcement officer, excluding officers covered under a

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- 1 collective bargaining agreement which provides otherwise,
- 2 who retire or are eligible to retire and die while in active
- 3 employment can receive a cash payment of up to \$2,000 for
- 4 their unused sick leave. The bill further provides that the
- 5 remaining value of sick leave shall be available to pay for
- 6 that portion of the officer's group health insurance premium
- 7 that would otherwise be paid for by the employer if the officer
- 8 were still employed by the employer.
- 9 The payment of premiums from accrued sick leave continues
- 10 until the balance of the law enforcement officer's banked
- 11 value of eligible accrued sick leave is exhausted, the retiree
- 12 otherwise becomes eligible for Medicare, or the officer dies.
- 13 In addition, the bill provides that if the law enforcement
- 14 officer returns to permanent full-time or part-time employment
- 15 with the officer's previous government employer, any unused
- 16 sick leave balances are forfeited and the officer is not
- 17 eligible for restoration of the unused sick leave accrued
- 18 during the prior employment.
- 19 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code
- 20 section 25B.3. The bill makes inapplicable Code section 25B.2,
- 21 subsection 3, which would relieve a political subdivision from
- 22 complying with a state mandate if funding for the cost of
- 23 the state mandate is not provided or specified. Therefore,
- 24 political subdivisions are required to comply with any state
- 25 mandate included in the bill.

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
