A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to applicant priority and grant award amounts
- 2 under the teach Iowa scholar program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 2015

- 1 Section 1. Section 256.218, subsections 2 and 4, Code 2024, 2 are amended to read as follows:
- An Iowa resident or nonresident applicant shall be
- 4 eligible for a teach Iowa scholar grant if the applicant
- 5 meets all of the criteria specified under, or established in
- 6 accordance with, subsection 3. Priority shall be given first
- 7 to applicants who are minority persons and residents of Iowa
- 8 and then to applicants who are residents of Iowa. A person is
- 9 ineligible for this program if the person receives a forgivable
- 10 loan under section 256.219 or loan forgiveness under section
- 11 256.220. For purposes of this section, "minority person" means
- 12 the same as defined in section 15.102, subsection 12, paragraph
- 13 *"b"*.
- 4. A selected applicant who meets all of the eligibility
- 15 requirements of this section shall be eligible for a teach
- 16 Iowa scholar grant for each year of full-time employment
- 17 completed in this state as a teacher for a school district,
- 18 charter school, area education agency, or accredited nonpublic
- 19 school. A teach Iowa scholar grant shall not exceed four
- 20 six thousand dollars per year per recipient. Grants awarded
- 21 under this section shall not exceed a total of twenty thirty
- 22 thousand dollars per recipient over a five-year period. If a
- 23 selected applicant has received a federally quaranteed Stafford
- 24 loan under the federal family education loan program or the
- 25 federal direct loan program, a federal direct plus loan, or a
- 26 federal Perkins loan, the selected applicant may elect to have
- 27 the commission make payment under the program directly to the
- 28 selected applicant's student loan holder.
- 29 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 32 This bill modifies the teach Iowa scholar program to give
- 33 first priority to applicants who are minority persons and
- 34 residents of Iowa, with subsequent priority to residents of
- 35 Iowa, and raises the annual grant limitation from \$4,000 to

- 1 \$6,000 and the total grant limitation over a five-year period
- 2 from \$20,000 to \$30,000.
- 3 Currently, priority is given to applicants who are residents
- 4 of Iowa.
