A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the creation of a medical error task force.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. MEDICAL ERROR TASK FORCE.
- The department of health and human services shall
- 3 convene a task force to review medical error rates of licensed
- 4 physicians in this state and shall make recommendations to the
- 5 general assembly and the director of health and human services
- 6 including recommendations that address options for reducing
- 7 medical error rates, improvements in education and training
- 8 to minimize medical errors, and whether applicable penalties
- 9 for medical errors and physician licensure review measures are
- 10 sufficient.
- 11 2. a. The task force shall include all of the following
- 12 voting members:
- 13 (1) The director of health and human services, or the
- 14 director's designee.
- 15 (2) The director of inspections and appeals, or the
- 16 director's designee.
- 17 (3) The executive director of the board of medicine.
- 18 (4) The ombudsman.
- 19 (5) A representative of the Iowa medical society.
- 20 (6) A representative of the board of regents affiliated with
- 21 the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics.
- 22 (7) The commissioner of insurance, or the commissioner's
- 23 designee.
- 24 (8) The attorney general, or the attorney general's
- 25 designee.
- 26 b. The task force shall also include four members of the
- 27 general assembly serving as ex officio, nonvoting members, one
- 28 representative to be appointed by the speaker of the house of
- 29 representatives, one representative to be appointed by the
- 30 minority leader of the house of representatives, one senator to
- 31 be appointed by the president of the senate after consultation
- 32 with the majority leader of the senate, and one senator to be
- 33 appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
- 34 c. The director of health and human services, or the
- 35 director's designee, may add members to the task force as

- 1 necessary to complete the work of the task force.
- 2 3. The department of health and human services shall provide
- 3 administrative support to the task force. The director of
- 4 health and human services, or the director's designee, shall
- 5 serve as chairperson of the task force, and shall schedule
- 6 meetings of the task force as necessary to complete the work
- 7 of the task force.
- 8 4. The task force shall dissolve upon submission of the
- 9 report to the general assembly and the director of health and
- 10 human services, but no later than January 8, 2024.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 14 This bill directs the department of health and human
- 15 services (HHS) to convene a task force to review medical
- 16 error rates of licensed physicians in this state and to make
- 17 recommendations to the general assembly and the director of HHS
- 18 including recommendations that address options for reducing
- 19 medical error rates, improvements in education and training
- 20 to minimize medical errors, and whether applicable penalties
- 21 for medical errors and physician licensure review measures are
- 22 sufficient.
- The bill specifies the membership of the task force,
- 24 authorizes the director of HHS to add members as necessary to
- 25 complete the work of the task force, and directs HHS to provide
- 26 administrative support to the task force. The director of HHS
- 27 or the director's designee shall serve as chairperson of the
- 28 task force and schedule meetings as necessary to complete the
- 29 work of the task force.
- 30 The task force shall dissolve upon submission of the report
- 31 to the general assembly and the director of HHS no later than
- 32 January 8, 2024.
