A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to school lunch and breakfast programs provided
- 2 by school districts, accredited nonpublic schools, charter
- 3 schools, and innovation zone schools, making appropriations,
- 4 and including effective date provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 256E.7, subsection 2, Code 2024, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. Ot. Be subject to and comply with the
- 4 requirements of section 283A.6 relating to free school lunch
- 5 and breakfast programs in the same manner as a school district.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 256F.4, subsection 2, Code 2024, is amended
- 7 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 8 NEW PARAGRAPH. p. Be subject to and comply with the
- 9 requirements of section 283A.6 relating to free school lunch
- 10 and breakfast programs in the same manner as a school district.
- 11 Sec. 3. Section 283A.2, subsection 2, Code 2024, is amended
- 12 to read as follows:
- 2. A school district shall operate or provide for the
- 14 operation of lunch programs at all attendance centers in
- 15 the district. A Unless required under section 283A.6, a
- 16 school district may operate or provide for the operation of
- 17 school breakfast programs at all attendance centers in the
- 18 district, or provide access to a school breakfast program at
- 19 an alternative site to students who wish to participate in a
- 20 school breakfast program. The programs shall provide students
- 21 with nutritionally adequate meals and shall be operated in
- 22 compliance with the rules of the state board of education and
- 23 pertinent federal law and regulation. The school lunch program
- 24 shall be provided for all students in each district who attend
- 25 public school four or more hours each school day and wish to
- 26 participate in a school lunch program. School districts may
- 27 provide school breakfast and lunch programs for other students.
- 28 Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 283A.6 Free school lunch and breakfast
- 29 programs.
- 30 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending
- 31 June 30, 2025, each school district described in chapter
- 32 274, accredited nonpublic school, charter school organized
- 33 under chapter 256E, and charter school or innovation zone
- 34 school organized under chapter 256F shall operate a program
- 35 under which breakfasts and lunches are served to students

- 1 in attendance at no charge to the student or the student's
- 2 family if the student's family has a family income that is less
- 3 than or equal to three hundred percent of the federal poverty
- 4 level as defined by the most recently revised poverty income
- 5 guidelines published by the United States department of health
- 6 and human services. Meals served pursuant to this subsection
- 7 shall be nutritionally adequate meals. This subsection is
- 8 repealed July 1, 2025.
- 9 2. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
- 10 June 30, 2026, each school district described in chapter
- 11 274, accredited nonpublic school, charter school organized
- 12 under chapter 256E, and charter school or innovation zone
- 13 school organized under chapter 256F shall operate a program
- 14 under which breakfasts and lunches are served to students
- 15 in attendance at no charge to the student or the student's
- 16 family if the student's family has a family income that is less
- 17 than or equal to four hundred percent of the federal poverty
- 18 level as defined by the most recently revised poverty income
- 19 guidelines published by the United States department of health
- 20 and human services. Meals served pursuant to this subsection
- 21 shall be nutritionally adequate meals. This subsection is
- 22 repealed July 1, 2026.
- 23 3. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and for
- 24 each fiscal year thereafter, each school district described
- 25 in chapter 274, accredited nonpublic school, charter school
- 26 organized under chapter 256E, and charter school or innovation
- 27 zone school organized under chapter 256F shall operate a
- 28 program under which breakfasts and lunches are served to
- 29 students in attendance at no charge to the student or the
- 30 student's family. Meals served pursuant to this subsection
- 31 shall be nutritionally adequate meals.
- 32 4. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and for
- 33 each fiscal year thereafter, there is appropriated from the
- 34 general fund of the state to the department of education an
- 35 amount necessary to make the payments to school districts

- 1 described in chapter 274, accredited nonpublic schools, charter
- 2 schools organized under chapter 256E, and charter schools and
- 3 innovation zone schools organized under chapter 256F necessary
- 4 to cover the costs of providing school lunches and school
- 5 breakfasts pursuant to this section that are not covered by any
- 6 Act of Congress and appropriated to the state of Iowa for use
- 7 in connection with school breakfast or lunch programs.
- 8 5. The state board of education shall adopt rules pursuant
- 9 to chapter 17A to administer this section.
- 10 Sec. 5. Section 283A.10, Code 2024, is amended to read as 11 follows:
- 12 283A.10 School breakfast or lunch in nonpublic schools.
- 13 The Unless required under section 283A.6, the authorities
- 14 in charge of nonpublic schools may operate or provide for the
- 15 operation of school breakfast or lunch programs in schools
- 16 under their jurisdiction and may use funds appropriated to
- 17 them by the general assembly, gifts, funds received from sale
- 18 of school breakfasts or lunches under such programs, and any
- 19 other funds available to the nonpublic school. However,
- 20 unless required under section 283A.6, school breakfast or
- 21 lunch programs shall not be required in nonpublic schools.
- 22 The department of education shall direct the disbursement of
- 23 state funds to nonpublic schools for school breakfast or lunch
- 24 programs in the same manner as state funds are disbursed to
- 25 public schools. If a nonpublic school receives state funds for
- 26 the operation of a school breakfast or lunch program, meals
- 27 served under the program shall be nutritionally adequate meals,
- 28 as defined in section 283A.1.
- 29 Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate
- 30 importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 33 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 34 This bill relates to school lunch and breakfast programs
- 35 provided by school districts, accredited nonpublic schools,

1 charter schools, and innovation zone schools (schools). For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 2 3 30, 2025, the bill requires each school to operate a program 4 under which breakfasts and lunches are served to students in 5 attendance at no charge to the student or the student's family 6 if the student's family has a family income that is less than 7 or equal to 300 percent of the federal poverty level. For the 8 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026, 9 the bill requires each school to operate such a program if 10 the student's family has a family income that is less than or 11 equal to 400 percent of the federal poverty level. For the 12 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and for each fiscal year 13 thereafter, the bill requires each school to operate such a 14 program regardless of the income of the student's family. 15 The bill appropriates from the general fund of the state to 16 the department of education an amount necessary to make the 17 payments to schools necessary to cover the costs of providing 18 free school lunches and school breakfasts that are not covered 19 by any Act of Congress and appropriated to the state of Iowa 20 for use in connection with school breakfast or lunch programs. 21 The bill requires the state board of education to adopt rules 22 to administer these provisions. The bill makes conforming 23 changes. 24 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
